AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE NATIONAL COTTON, TEXTILE AND GARMENT (CTG) DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL TO PROVIDE FOR THE PROMOTION AND FACILITATION OF COTTON PRODUCTION, MARKETING AND STANDARDISATION; INVESTMENT IN COTTON VALUE CHAIN, TEXTILES AND GARMENTS AS A PANACEA TO ACHIEVING SELF-SUFFICIENCY IN COTTON, TEXTILES AND GARMENT INDUSTRY IN NIGERIA AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

	24	promotion of Cotton Value Chain; and Garment sub-sector;
	25	(d) Administration of the funds of the Council;

	27	Garment sub sector;
	28	(f) Advise on the administration of the Council's managed funds by
	29	recommending prospective beneficiaries for consideration of the Financia
	20	Development Institutions where the Council's managed funds are domiciled;

1	(g) To facilitate the availability of credit and other farm inputs for	
2	cotton farmers in liaison with financial institutions and corporate bodies	
3	whose functions relate to Cotton, Textile and Garment Development;	
4	(h) To encourage communities to form cooperative societies aimed	
5	at massive production of cottons to satisfy input requirement of textile	
6	industry;	
7	(i) To pursue any other matter which is aimed at enhancing the	
8	objectives of the Council; and	
9	(j) Perform such other functions as may be assigned by the Minister	
10	from time to time.	
11	4. The Board shall have power to:	Power of the
12	(a) Serve as an advisory Body to the Council for the discharge of its	Board
13	functions;	
14	(b) Approve policies formulated by the management of the Council	
15	in accordance with the provisions of the Act;	
16	(c) Approve the salaries, other remunerations, of the staff of the	
17	Council;	
18	(d) Receive and approve annual reports on the performance of the	
19	Council;	
20	(e) Do such other things that are as necessary for the efficient	
21	performance of the functions of the Council.	
22	5(1) The Chairman and Members of the Governing Board of the	Tenures of Office of the Chairman
23	Council shall hold office for a term of four years, subject to renewal for only	and Members of the Board
24	one further term of four years and no more.	
25	(2) without prejudice to subsection (1) of this Section, the Minister	
26	may appoint from among the members to act as the Chairman during the	
27	absence or temporary incapacitation by illness or otherwise of the Chairman	

and the person so appointed shall while the appointment subsists have the

same powers as exercised by the Chairman.

6.-(1) The Council shall have the following departments: Departments of the Council (a) Operations: 2 (i) Cotton production and value chain; 3 (ii) Textiles; 4 (iii) Garments & Tailoring. 5 (b) Corporate affairs and Human Resource; 6 (c) Finance and Accounts; 7 (d) Planning, Monitoring and Evaluation. 8 (2) The Council, without prejudice to sub-section (1) of this section 9 can create any other departments, units, offices etc that it may deem as 10 Necessary from time to time foe the attainment of the council's mandate. 11 (3) Each department shall be headed by a director, who shall be 12 responsible to the executive secretary. 13 PART II - EXECUTIVE SECRETARY AND OTHER OFFICERS 14 OF THE COUNCIL 15 7.-(1) (a) There shall be an Executive Secretary of the council who -16 Executive Secretary and shall be appointed by the president in accordance with the provisions of the Other Officers 17 of the Council 18 Act; (b) The Executive Secretary shall be the Chief Executive and 19 Administrative Head of the Council. 20: (2) The Executive Secretary shall have prerequisite qualification and 21 holder of B.Sc. in Agricultural Economics or its equivalent and possess 22 cognate post qualification experience of not less than 15 years. 23 (3) The Executive Secretary shall be responsible for: 24 (a) Day to day running of the Council; and shall be responsible to the 25 Minister; 26 (b) participates in the formulation, and implement policies, 27 programmes and projects of the government for the development of Cotton, - 28 Textile and Garments in the country; 29 (c) coordinate the work of the staff of the Council in order to ensure 30

2	SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE BOARD, ETC
3	1(1) Subject to this Act and section 27 of the Interpretation Act, the
4	Board may make Standing Orders regulating its proceedings or those of its
5	Committees.
6	(2) The quorum of the Board shall be the Chairman or the person
7	presiding over the meeting, the Executive Secretary and one third of other
8	members of the Board.
9	2(1) The Board shall meet on quarterly basis or whenever it deemed
10	necessary to be summoned by the Chairman and if the chairman is required to
11	do so by notice given to him by not less than four other Members, he shall
12	summon a meeting of the Board to be held within fourteen (14) days from the
13	date on which the notice is given.
14	(2)At any meeting of the Board, the Chairman shall preside but in his
15	absence, the Members present at the meeting shall appoint one of their
16	members to preside at the meeting.
17	Committee
18	3(1) The Board may appoint one or more Committees (Standing or
19	Ad Hoc) to carry out, on behalf of the Council such functions as it may
20	determine.
21	(2) A Committee appointed under this paragraph shall consist of such
22	number of persons as may be determined by the Board and a person shall hold
23	office on the Committee in accordance with the terms of his appointment.
24	(3) A decision of a Committee of the Board shall be of no effect until it
25	is confirmed by the Board.
26	(4) The Board shall specify the terms of reference in respect of the
27	duties to be performed by Committee appointed in accordance to the
28	provisions of sections (1) & (2) of this section
29	Miscellaneous
30	4(1) the fixing of the seal of the Council shall be authenticated by the

1	signatures of the Chairman or any other member of the Board, generally or
2	specifically authorized by the Board to act for that purpose and the
3	Executive Secretary.
4	(2) A document purporting to be a document dully executed under
5	the seal of Council shall be received in evidence and shall, unless and until
6	the contrary is proved be presumed to be so executed.
7	5. The validity of any proceedings of the Board or of a Committee
8	shall not be adversely affected by-
9	(a) A vacancy in the membership of the Board or Committee;
10	(b) A defect in the appointment of a member of the Board or
11	Committee; or
12	(c) Reason that a person not entitled to do so took part in the
13	proceedings of the Board or Committee.
