AN ACT TO PROVIDE A LEGAL FRAMEWORK FOR THE MAINSTREAMING OF CLIMATE CHANGE RESPONSES AND ACTIONS INTO GOVERNMENT POLICY FORMULATION AND IMPLEMENTATION, AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NATIONAL CLIMATE CHANGE COUNCIL AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

- 5.-(1) The Council shall take action to inaugurate the Technical Advisory Committee, which shall comprise technical experts in the fields relating to Climate Change with requisite educational qualification and not less than ten years post-qualification experience. The Technical Advisory Committee shall comprise not more than 15 member experts.
