AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE INSTITUTE OF ENVIRONMENTAL PRACTITIONERS OF NIGERIA AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

Sponsored by Hon. Obinna Chidoka Commencement BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: PART I - ESTABLISHMENT OF THE INSTITUTE OF ENVIRONMENTAL PRACTITIONERS OF NIGERIA 1 1. -(1) There is hereby established a body to be known as the Establishment of the Institute of Environmental 2 Institute of environmental Practitioners of Nigeria (in this bill referred to as Practitioners of Nigeria. 3 the Institute). 4 (2) The Institute: 5 (a) shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a 6 common seal; 7 (b) may sue and be sued in its corporate name; and 8 (c) may for the purpose of carrying out its functions, subject to the 9 limitations in this Bill and to any law for time being in force, acquire, hold or dispose of property, whether movable or immoveable. 10 11 2. -(1)There shall be established for the Institute a Governing Establishment of the Governing Council 12 Council (the council) charged with the responsibility for the administration and general management of the Institute. 13 (2) The Council shall consist of: 14 15 (a) President of the Institute, who shall be the chairman; 16 (b) Vice-President of the Institute who shall be the Vice-Chairman; 17 (c) National Treasurer of the Institute who shall be the treasurer; 18 (d) Minister of Environment or his representative who shall not be

23	related discipline, or a person who has performed duties at a senior level in	
24	environmental management continuously for at least six years;	
25	(iii) graduate of the Institute who has competently performed	
26	executive or advisory duties at a senior level in environmental management	
27	for at least four years since election to the grade of member and	r*
28	(iv) non-graduate who has spent at least ten years in an affiliate	
29	grade, and possesses standard knowledge and qualities essential for a	
30	successful practice of environmental management.

•	19	function under this Bill.
	20	(4) The Council may invest monies from the fund in any security
	21	created or issued by or on behalf of the Government of the Federation or any
	22	other security in Nigeria as may be approved by the council.
	23	(5) The Council may on behalf of the Institute, from time to time
	24	borrow money for the purpose of running the Institute, which shall be paid into
	25	the Fund.

15	(4) If any person, group or organization is found to be in breach or

Where standing orders made under paragraph Lofthis Schedule

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- 2. Where standing orders made under paragraph 1 of this Schedule provide for the Council to co-opt persons who are not members of the council, such persons may advise the Council on any matter referred to them by the Council, but shall not be entitled to vote at a meeting of the Council or count towards a quorum.
- 3. The Council may appoint one or more committees to carry out on its behalf such functions as the council may determine.
- 4. A committee appointed under this paragraph shall consist of such number of persons as may be determined by the Council and a person shall hold office in accordance with the terms of his appointment.
- 5. A decision of a Committee of the Council shall be of no effect until it is confirmed by the Council.

## Meetings of the Council.

- 6. The council shall meet whenever it is considered necessary (but not less than twice a year) by giving notice to all members concerned, at least seven (7) days before the meeting.
- 7. The Chairman shall preside at every meeting of the Council and in his absence, the Vice Chairman shall preside.
- 8. Five members of the Council, other than the Chairman shall form a quorum at the meeting.

1	9. Unless otherwise provided in this Bill, decisions shall be by a
2	simple majority of the votes of the members present, but in the event that equal
3	votes are cast, the person presiding shall cast the deciding vote.
4	Committees
5	10. Subject to standing orders, the Council may appoint one or more
6	committees to carry out on its behalf such duties as the Council may determine
7	∼ and make necessary reports.
8	11. A committee appointed under paragraph 10 of this schedule shall
9	consist of the number of persons to be determined by the Council and not more
10	than the one-third of those persons may be persons who are not members of the
11	Council; a person other than a member of the Council may hold office on the
12	Committee in accordance with the letter of appointment provided.
13	12. The quorum of any committee set up by the Council shall be
14	determined by the Council.
15	13. The decision of the committee shall be of no effect until
16	confirmed by the Council.

18	14. The fixing of the seal of the Institute shall be authenticated by
19	signature of the Chairman and some other members authorised generally or
20	specially by the council to act for that purpose.
21.	15. A document purporting to be an instrument issued by the Institute
22	and to be sealed with the seal of the Institute authenticated in the manner
23	provided by the foregoing paragraph, or to be signed by the Chairman, shall
24	receive in evidence and shall be deemed to be the instrument without further
25	proof, unless there is proof otherwise
26	16. Any contract or instrument which, if made or executed by a
27	person not being a body corporate, would not be required to be under seal, if
28	made by or executed on behalf of the Council by any person authorised
29	generally or specially by the Council to act for that purpose

l	17. The validity of a proceeding of the council shall not be affected
2	by:
3	(a) a vacancy in the membership of the Council;
4	(b) by a defect in the appointment of a member of the Council; or
5	(c) by reason that a person not entitled to do so took part in the
6	proceedings.
7	18. A member of the Council and a person holding office on a
8	committee of the Council, who has a personal interest in a contract or an
9	arrangement entered into or proposed to be considered by the Council or the
10	committee shall forthwith disclose his interest to the council or committee
11	and shall not vote on any question relating to that contract or arrangement.
	EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM
	This Bill seeks to establish the Institute of Environmental Practitioners of
	Nigeria, to be charged with the responsibility of regulating and managing
	environmental practices in Nigeria
