4	(a) hold examination and grant diploma, professional certificates
5	and other distinctions to persons who have pursued a course of study
6	approved and accredited by the National Board for Technical Education;
7	(b) demand and receive from any student or any other person
8	attending the School for the purpose of instruction such fees as the council
9	may, with the prior approval of the Minister, from time to time determine;
10	(c) hold public lectures and undertakes printing, publishing and
11	selling;
12	(d) provide amenities for the welfare of the staff of the School;
13	(e) invest the surplus funds of the School on programmes that by
14	law as may be approved by the Council; enter into such contracts as may be
15	necessary or expedient for carrying into effect the objectives of the School;
16	(f) recruit staff of the right caliber and determine the career
17	structure of such staff;
18	(g)establish and maintain such schools and other units within the
19	school or extra-mural departments as the Council may, from time to time
20	decide;
21	(h) institute and award fellowships, medals, prizes and other titles;
22	(i) mount exhibitions and display designs to foster appreciation of
23	techniques and technology; erect, provide, equip and maintain such
24	educational, recreational and residential facilities as the School may require;
25	(j) create lectureships and other academic posts and offices to make
26	appointments thereto;
27	(k) encourage and make provision for research in the School and;
28	do such things incidental to the foregoing powers as may advance the
29	objects of the school.

Visitation 1 7.-(1) The Minister of Education shall be the visitor of the School. 2 (2) The Visitor shall, not less than once in every two years, conduct a 3 visitation of the School or appoint a visitation panel consisting of not less than 4 five experts to conduct the visitation: 5 (a) for the purpose of evaluating the academic and administrative 6 performance of the School; or 7 (b) for such other purpose the Visitor may deem fit. The Academic 8 8.-(1) There shall be established for the School a board to be known as Board and its Functions 9 the Academic Board which shall consist of the following members: 10 (a) The Provost of the School who shall be the Chairman; 11 (b) the Deputy Provost, Deans of Departments, Professors/Reader/ 12 Chief-Readers and the Registrar who shall be the Secretary; 13 (c) the School Librarian; and 14 (d)not more than two members of the academic staff other than heads 15 of departments to be elected by the Congregation. 16 (2) The Academic Board shall be responsible for: 17 (a) the direction and management of academic matters to the School 18 including the regulation of admission of students, the award of certificates, 19 scholarships, prizes, and other academic distinctions; 20 (b) making periodic reports on such academic matters to the Council 21 as the Council may from time to time direct; (c) discharging any other functions which the Council may from time 22 23 to time delegate to it. 24 9. 24	or under this Bill, be the Secretary of the Council, the Academic Board and any
25	committee of the Council and in his absence, the Councilor of any such

(a) such sums as may from time to time be granted to the Council by the Minister of Education or as may be renamed at any point in time;

- (b) all moneys raised for the purposes of the Council by way of gifts, grants-in-aids or testamentary disposition; and all subscriptions, fees and charges for services rendered by the Council and all other sums that may accrue to the Council from any source.
- (3) The Council shall submit to the Minister not later than three months before the end of each financial year or at such other time as he may direct, an estimate of its revenue and expenditure for the next succeeding financial year.
- 19. The Council may accept gifts of land, money, or other property upon such terms and conditions if any, as may be specified by the person

making the gift provided such conditions do not conflict with or undermined 1 2 the objectives of the School as provided in this Bill. 20. The Council shall keep proper accounts of its receipts, payments, 3 Commencement assets and liabilities and shall in respect of each year cause the accounts to be 4 audited. 5 21. The Council shall soon as may be after the expiration of each 6 Annual Report financial year prepare and submit to the Minister a report of its activities during 7 the immediately preceding financial year and shall include in the report copy of 8 the audited accounts of the School for that year and of the auditors report on the 9 10 accounts. 22.-(1) for the purposes of providing offices and premises necessary 11 Office and Premises 12 for the performance of its functions, the Council may: (a) purchase any interest in or take on lease any land; and 13 (b) build, equip and maintain offices and premises. 14 (2) The Council may with the approval of the Minister sell any interest 15 in or lease any land, offices or premises held by it and no longer required for the 16 performance of its function. 17 23.-(1) The Council may make rules providing for the Provost to Discipline of 18 Staff and Student conduct enquiries into alleged breaches of discipline, dereliction of duties and 19 gross misconduct a (including lack of diligence) by students or staff, and such 20 21 rules may make different provisions for different circumstances. (2) The rules shall provide for the procedure and rules of evidence to 22 23 be followed at enquiries under this section. 24 (3) Subject to the provisions of subsection (1) of this section, where it is proved during the enquiry that any staff or student of the School has been 25 guilty of misconduct, the Provost may, without prejudice to any other 26 27 disciplinary powers conferred on him by this Bill or any regulations made 28 hereunder direct: (a) that the staff or student shall not, during such period as may be 29 30 specified in the direction, participate in such activities of the School, or make

1	use of such facilities of the School, as may be so specify;
2	(b) that the activities of the staff or student shall during such period
3	as may be;
4	(c) specified on the directions, be restricted in such manner as may
5	be so specified; or that the staff or student may be suspended for such period
6	as may be specified in the direction; or
7	(d) that the staff or student be expelled from the School.
8	(4) Where there is temporarily no Provost or where the Provost
9	refuses to apply any disciplinary measures, the Council may, either directly
10	or through some other staff, apply such disciplinary measures, the Council
11	may, either directly or through some other staff, apply such disciplinary
12	actions as are specified in subsection:
13	(a) of this section to any staff or student of the School who is guilty
14	of misconduct.
15	(5) where a direction is given under subsection (3)(a) or (d) of this
16	section in respect of any student, the staff or student may, within twenty-one
17	days from the date of the letter communicating the decision to him, appeal
18	from the direction to the Council, and where such an appeal is brought, the
19	Council shall, after causing such inquiry to be made in the matter as the
20	Council considers just, either confirm or set aside the direction or modify it
21	in such manner as the Council may think fit.
22	(6) The fact that an appeal from a direction is brought in pursuance
23	of subsection of this section shall not affect the operation while the appeal is
24	pending.
25	(7) The Provost may delegate his powers under this section to a
26	disciplinary committee consisting of such members of the School as he may
27	nominate.
28	(8) Nothing in this section shall be construed as preventing the
29	restriction or termination of a staff's appointment or student's activities at the
30	School otherwise than on the ground of misconduct.

3	SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE COUNCIL, ETC.
4	Terms of service
5	1. There may be paid to the members of the council any committee,
6	other than ex-officio members, such remunerations and allowances as may
7	from time to time be determined by the Minister.
8	2. Where a vacancy occurs in respect of the membership specified
9	in section 3 (1) (d), it shall be filled by the appointment of a successor to hold
10	office for the remainder of the term of office of his predecessor in office and
11	such successor shall represent the same interest as his predecessor.
12	3. The Council may act notwithstanding any vacancy in its
13	membership or any defect in the appointment of a member or the absence of
14	a member.
15	Proceedings
16	4(1) The Council shall meet for the conduct of business at such
17	times, places and on such days the Chairman may appoint but shall meet not
18	less than once every four months.
19	(2) The Chairman may at any time at the request in writing of not
20	less than 6 members, convene a meeting of the Council.
21	(3) At any meeting of the Council the Chairman shall preside; but
22	in his absence, member present shall elect one of their members to preside at
23	the meeting.
24	(4) Where the Council desires to obtain the advice of any person on
25	any particular matter, the Council may co-opt persons who are not members
26	of the Council but persons co-opted shall not be entitled to vote at a meeting
27	of the Council.
28	(5) The quorum of the Council shall be one half of the total
29	members of the Council at least one of whom shall be a member appointed
30	by the Minister.

1	(6) Decisions of the Council shall be made on approval by a simple
2	majority of members.
3	Miscellaneous
4	5(1) The fixing of the seal of the School shall be authenticated by the
5	signature of the Chairman, Provost and of some other members of the Council
6	authorized generally or specially by the Council to act for that purpose.
7	(2) Any contract or instrument which, if made or executed by a person
8	other than a body corporate would not be required to be under seal may b~
9	made or executed on behalf of the School by any person generally or specially
10	authorized to act for that purpose by the Council.
11	(3) Any document purporting to be duly executed under the seal of the
12	School shall be received in evidence and shall, unless the contrary is proved, be
13	presumed to be so executed.
