AN ACT TO PROVIDE CERTAIN RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES FOR OLDER PERSONS IN ORDER TO ENSURE HEALTH AND ECONOMIC RELIEFS AND PROTECTION FOR THEIR SOCIAL AND CIVIL RIGHTS AND FOR RELATED MATTERS
