NATIONAL SECURITY ADVISER TO MAKE REGULATIONS FOR THE CONTROL OF EXPLOSIVES FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAINTAINING AND SECURING PUBLIC SAFETY AND FOR RELATED MATTERS Sponsored by Hon. Aminu Sani Jaji Commencement Enacted by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria: 1. The Explosives Act CAP E18, Laws of the Federation of Amendment of the Principal Act Nigeria, 2004 (in this Bill referred to as the "Principal Act") is amended as Cap. E18, LFN, 2004 set out in this Bill. 3 2. Section 1 of the Principal Act is amended: 4 Amendment of Section 1 (a) In sub-section (1) by substituting for the existing subsection (1), 5 new subsections 1/(1)" and 11(2)": "(1) The Office of the National Security Adviser may make 7 regulations with respect to explosives for the purpose of maintaining and 8 securing public safety to give effect to the provisions of this Bill; "(2) In exercise of powers conferred on the Office of the National 10 11 Security Adviser by sub clause (1) of this clause, the office shall be responsible for review and update of the controlled list of explosives"; 12 (b) in subsection (2) by substituting the existing paragraph (e) for a 13 new paragraph "(e)": 14 "(e) any customs officer or other person who aids, counsels, 15 procures or conspires with any other person to contravene the regulations 16 made under this clause shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction 17 to imprisonment for life." 18

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill amends the Explosives Act Cap, E18, Laws of the Federation of Nigeria 2004 to empower the Office of the National Security Adviser (ONSA) to make regulations for the control of explosives and provides stiffer penalty for its contravention to maintain and secure public safety in Nigeria.
