EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

(This Memorandum does not form part of the this Act, but is intended to explain its purport)

The Bill seeks to establish the Nigeria Centre for Disease Control and Prevention to promote, coordinate and facilitate the prevention, detection and control of communicable diseases in Nigeria and other events of public health importance.
