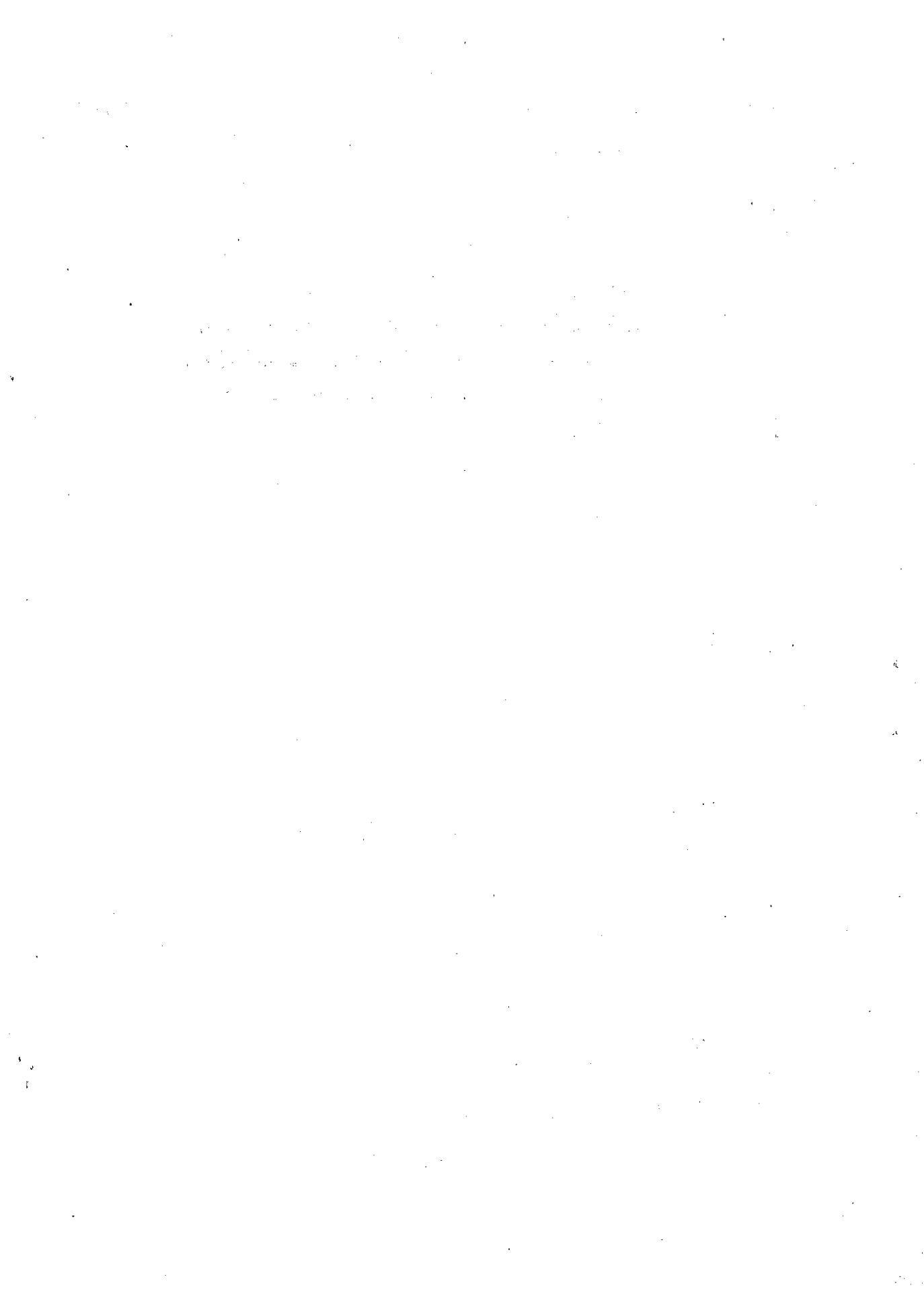

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to amend the Pre-shipment Inspection of Export Act Cap P25 of the Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, 2004, to increase penalties for defaulters and amend reference in Section 18(3) to paragraph (a) of subsection (1) to read

ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of

Nigeria as follows:

Amendment of Cap P25

1. The pre-shipment inspection of exports Act Cap P25, Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, 2004 (in this Bill referred to as the Principal Act) is amended as set out in this Bill.

Amendment of Section 18(2)(a)

2. Section 18 subsection (2) (a) of the Principal Act is amended by deleting the amount N20,000 and substituting it with N100,000.

Amendment of Section 18(2)(b)

3. Section 18 subsection (2) (b) of the Principal Act is amended by substituting the N100,000 with N1,000,000.

Amendment of Section 18(3)

4. Section 18 of the Principal Act is amended by substituting the existing subsection (3) for a new subsection "(3)";

"(3). Where an offence under this section is proved to have been committed with consent or connivance of or to be attributed to any neglect on the part of any director, manager, secretary or other similar officer, or any agent or servant of the body corporate for any person purporting to act in such capacity that person as well as the body corporate shall be deemed to be guilty and may be proceeded against and punished in the same manner as an individual under subsection (2) of this section."

Enactment

5. This Bill is cited as the Pre-shipment Inspection of Export (Amendment) Bill, 2017.
