AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR PUBLIC ASSISTANCE TO WIDOWS, DEPENDENT CHILDREN, AND ORPHANS AND FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO, 2015

ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows-1.-(1) There shall be established for the Federation a body to be Establishment of the National known as the National Council for Public Assistance to Widows, Dependent Council for Widows, Children, Orphans and Victims of Terrorism (in this Bill referred to as "the Dependent Children, Orphans and Victims of National Council") which shall under that name be a body corporate with 4 Terrorism perpetual succession and common seal and may sue or be sued in its corporate name. 6 (2) The National Council shall have its headquarters in the Federal Capital Territory, Abuja and Community Registration Offices in each of the 8 Local Government Areas, which are hereby established. 9 2.-(1) There shall be for the National Council, a Governing Board 10 Establishment and Composition of Trustees (in this Bill referred to as "the Board of Trustees") which shall 11 of the Board of Trustee of the consist of-National Council 12 (a) a Chairperson, who shall be-13 (i) the Chief Executive Officer of the National Council; 14 (ii) a person of proven integrity, ability and character, with 15 acceptable qualification; 16 (iii) appointed by the President, subject to confirmation by the 17 Senate; 18 (b) two persons from each of the six geopolitical zones of the 19 Federation and one from the Federal Capital Territory, who shall be-20

22	of the Board of Trustees of the National Council shall reflect the Federal
23	character of Nigeria.

25	other than an ex-officio member-
26	(a) shall hold office for a period of five years from the date of his
27	appointment and shall be eligible for reappointment;
28	(b) may resign his appointment by writing under his hand, a letter

PART II - THE FUNCTIONS AND POWERS OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL Functions and 6. -(1) The Functions of the National Council shall be topowers (a) provide financial assistance and aid in the form of assistance benefit payment and reasonable comfort to any widow who-4 (i) is underemployed or unemployed or unemployable; (ii) earns wages that is less than 30 per cent of the approved minimum 6 wage in the State where she is resident; or (iii) has a dependent child under her care, and which dependent child 8 is her offspring, living with her, but lacking adequate upkeep or support; 9 (b) provide financial assistance and reasonable comfort for any 10 orphan under the age of 18 years who lacks adequate upkeep or support, care, attention and love; (c) require and encourage any widow registered under any assistance 13 or aid programme carried on by the National Council to work, and to provide fair employment for any able-bodied unemployed widow who possesses certain educational qualifications or vocational skill, within a reasonable period after the death of her husband; 18 (d) provide free legal aid for any widow, with or without a dependent child or children, and any orphan (hereinafter in this Bill referred to as "Recipient(s)" as the case may be) who requires such legal aid for the purpose of securing any entitlements or rights to any property or legacies or 21 testamentary dispositions which is being, or is reasonably believed to be, about to be, or has been, denied or withdrawn or refused or taken away from any such Recipient; 24 25 (e) endeavour to provide reasonable accommodation, housing or rent subsidy, as the case may be, for any Recipient who is a widow, and who is 26 underemployed or unemployed or unemployable, and who has been or is about to be ejected from an apartment or a house where she is resident before and 28

after the death of her husband;

(f) intercede or participate in any negotiation with any public or

29

private concern, on behalf of any Recipient who is a widow, with or without
a child under her care, to obtain or secure a reasonably extended period of
occupation (which period of occupation shall not be less than six months
thereafter), in any staff quarter or apartment provided by the said public or
private concern as accommodation for her husband before his deceased;

- (g) provide reasonable amount of subsidy for the medical expenses incurred by any Recipient, within a reasonable limit, and as the National Council may, from time to time, determine;
- (h) require and encourage any illiterate Recipient who is a widow to participate in the adult literacy programmes and vocational or skills acquisition training courses which shall be carried out by each Community Registration Office of the National Council.
- (i) carry out a regular and coordinated enlightenment campaign programme such as workshops, seminars and conferences to educate the general public on the psychological torture and deprivations which a Recipient who is either a widow or parentless child, undergo, and stress the need for the society to render assistance, aid and comfort to the aforementioned Recipients, and to behave humanely and compassionately toward them at all times;
- (j) assist or guarantee the procurement of the short-term interest free loan from any financial concern on the behalf of any low-income Recipient who is an unemployed, widow, for the purpose of enabling the Recipient to set up any small-scale business in any part of the Federation;
- (k) establish orphanages, Institutions, Foster Homes or Child Care Centres, as the case may be, in each Senatorial District of the Federation for Recipients who are orphans under the age of 18 years, and provide the said Recipients with basic educational and vocational training, health care facilities, reasonable feeding allowance, adequate upkeep and support, freely, without any exaction of fees or payment, whatsoever;
 - (1) generally improve the living conditions of any Recipient who is

	a dependent child or orphan in order to enable them to be productive citizens of
	Nigeria;
	(m) establish a national information clearing house on widows and
	orphans, to collect, analyze and distribute information on the needs of widows
	and parentless children; and
	(n) do any other thing, which in the opinion of the National Council
	will assist in furthering the attainment of the functions directed to be carried out
	under this subsection of this section.
	(2) Subject to the provisions of this Bill, the National Council shall
0	have powers to-
1	(a) determine any person or persons who shall be eligible to
2	participate or obtain the public assistance or aid benefits directed to be offered
3	and rendered under this Bill, after due examination and verification of the
4	application and the claims made therein by a Recipient shall have been
5	certified within 30 days after the application and claims were filed;
6	(b) determine the extent of its commitment in any particular financial
7	year, and the nature of assistance or aid or payments or allowances that may be
8	made to any Recipient who is registered in any of the Community Registration
9	Office located in each Senatorial District of the Federation;
0	(c) carry out a regular random monitoring, survey and special study of
1	the social and economic activities, lifestyle and living conditions of any
2	Recipient registered under this Bill, in order to determine the extent of the
3	efficacy, efficiency and effectiveness of any assistance or aid programme
4	provided for any such Recipient;
5	(d) suspend, discontinue or terminate the provision of any assistance
6	or aid programme or benefit payment or allowance rendered or made, as the
7	case may be, to any Recipient registered under the National Council if-
8	(i) in the opinion of the Board of Trustees, it is reasonably believed or
9	ascertained that any such Recipient is not so entitled or qualified;
0	(ii) a Recipient, who is a dependent child or orphan, has attained the

l	age of 21 years;	
2	(iii) a Recipient, who is a widow, is reasonably believed to own	
3	properties valued in excess of five hundred thousand Naira, or earns salaries,	
4	allowances, wages or income which is above the minimum wage payable in	
5	the State where she resides;	
6	(iv) any of the information, data or claims presented to the National	
7	Council by a Recipient is found to be false in any material particular, or is	
8	designed or calculated to deceive or defraud or mislead the National	
9	Council;	
10	(v) a Recipient, who is a widow, becomes married to another man	
11	or is deceased;	
12	(vi) a Recipient is found to have been registered in more than one	
13	Community Registration Office of the National Council without proper	
14	notification of a change of place of residence or any acceptable reason;	
15	(vii) a court of law or tribunal so rules;	
16	(viii) a Recipient is convicted for any criminal offence by a court of	
17	law or tribunal in the Federation;	
18	(ix) a Recipient is found to have traveled out of the country for a	
19	period of over six months for any reason;	
20	(e) recommend to the appropriate authority the prosecution of any	
21	Recipient who obtains any assistance or aid rendered by the National	
22	Council through fraud or deceit or double-dealing or duplicity; and	
23	(j) publish from time to time, a comprehensive list of Recipients in	
24	each Community Registration Office in the Federal Government Official	
25	Gazette or in not less than three national dailies.	
26	PART III - SPECIAL PROVISIONS AS REGARDS ELIGIBILITY FOR	
27	OBTAINING ASSISTANCE BENEFITS, ETC. BY A RECIPIENT	
28	7(1) Subject to the provisions of this Bill, eligibility for the	Eligibility of recipients of
29	assistance benefit payments specified to be made herein shall be based on	assistance benefit
30	need, and in that regard the National Council shall certify, register and	

1	render assistance or aid benefits to any person who-
2	(a) who is a widow;
3	(b) is a dependent child below the age of 18 years, an offspring and
4	member of the household of a widow specified under paragraph (a) of this
5	subsection; and
6	(c) who is an orphan.
7	(2) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, the

10	(a) possesses substantial likelihood of improved changes in earning
11	an income; and
12	(b) is physically and mentally fit and aged between 21 and 60 years.
13	(3) The National Council shall have powers to disqualify or exclude
14	or expel or suspend, from the assistance benefit payments specified under this
15	Bill, any Recipient who-
16	(a) refuses to cooperate in providing any information necessary to
17	determine eligibility;
18	(b) is found to have knowingly transferred assets in order to qualify
19	for participation in the assistance benefit payments rendered under this Bill;
20	(c) is physically and mentally fit, aged between 21 and 60 years, but-
21	(i) refuses to register for employment at the time of registration with
22	the Community Registration Office of the National Council and every six
23	months thereafter;
24	(ii) refuses to conduct any required job search activities;
25	(iii) refuses to accept, without good cause, any offer of employment
26	which pays not less than 80 percent of the basic minimum wage payable in the
27	State where she resides;
28	(iv) voluntarily quits a job without good cause; or
29	(v) is found to be a drug addict or alcoholic undergoing treatment.
30	(4) Without prejudice to the provisions of subsection (1) of this

- 13.-(1) Subject to subsection (2) of this section, persons employed in the National Council shall in respect to their service in the National Council be entitled to pensions, gratuities and other retirement benefits as prescribed under the Pensions Act in respect of persons holding equivalent posts, and accordingly, and notwithstanding the provisions of the said Pensions Act, it is hereby declared that service in the National Council shall be approved service for the purposes of that Act.
- (2) Nothing in this section shall prevent the appointment of a person to any office or position in the National Council on terms and conditions which preclude the grant of a pension or gratuity in respect of service in that office or position.

PART V - FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

Establishment of Fund for the National Council

- 14.-(1) The National Council shall establish and maintain a Fund from which shall be defrayed all expenditures incurred by the National Council.
- (2) Subject to the provisions of this Bill, there shall be paid and credited to the Fund established pursuant to subsection (1) of this section-
- (a) the annual subvention or allocation received from the Federal Government for the implementation of the responsibilities of the National Council;
- (b) such moneys as may, from time to time, be lent to or deposited with or granted to the National Council by the Federal Government or any government of a State or Local Government Council of Nigeria or any other appendage of government; 26
- (c) all moneys raised for the purpose of this Bill by way of gifts, donations, grants in aid, testamentary dispositions, contributions from individuals, corporate or philanthropic organizations, local and international 29 non-governmental organizations, etc. concerned with the purpose of this Bill 30

1	or otherwise howsoever;
2	(d) all subscriptions, fees and charges payable to the National
3	Council; and (e) interest on investments made by the National Council and
4	payments from all other assets at may, from time to time, accrue to the
5	National Council.
6	(3) The National Council shall, from time to time, apply the
7	proceeds of the Fund established pursuant to subsection (1) of this section -
8	(a) to the funding of the various activities, benefit payments, and
9	obligations directed to be carried out under this Bill by each Community
10	Registration Office of the National Council in each Senatorial District of the
11	Federation;
12	(b) to the payment of salaries, fees or other remuneration
13	allowances and pensions, gratuities and other retirement benefits payable to
14	the members of the Board of Trustees and employees of the National
15	Council;
16	(c) to the costs of acquisition and upkeep of the properties and
17	premises belonging to the National Council; and
18	(d) for the payment of any other special benefits, fees and
19	allowances for and in connection with all or any of the functions of the
20	National Council as specified and directed under this Bill. Cap. 60 LFN.
21	(4) For the purposes of the Companies Income Tax Act any
22	donation made by any company in Nigeria to the National Council shall be a
23	deductible donation within the meaning of that Act.
24	(5) For the avoidance of any doubt, the Board of Trustees shall have
25	the responsibility of controlling and disbursing amounts from the Fund
26	established in accordance with this section.
27	(6) Without prejudice to the provisions of this Bill or any other law
28	in force in the Federation, the funds due to each Community Registration
29	Office, to which this Bill relates, shall be paid directly to their account at the

commencement of each financial year.

- 15. The National Council may accept gifts of money, land, testamentary disposition or other property, and upon such terms and conditions, if any, as may be specified by the person or organization or corporate body making the gift:
- Provided that such gifts of money or other property are not inconsistent with the objectives and functions of the National Council, specified under this Bill.

Borrowing and investment power

- 16.-(1) The National Council may, with the consent or in accordance with the general authority given by the National Assembly or the President, borrow by way of loan or overdraft from any source, any money required by the National Council to meet its obligations and its functions under this Bill, so however that such consent or authority shall be required where the sum or aggregate of the sums involved at any time does not exceed such amount as is, for the time being, specified in relation to the National Council by the Government of the Federation.
- (2) The National Council may, subject to the provisions of this Bill, and the conditions of trust in respect of funds held or any property owned, invest any, but not all, of its funds with the same consent or general authority, in such ventures and security as may be permitted by law.

3	Proceedings of the Board of Trustees

5	1. Subject to this Bill, and section 27 of the Interpretation Act (which
6	provides for decision of a statutory body to be taken by a majority of its
7	members and for the person presiding to have a second casting vote) the Board
8	of Trustees of the National Council may make standing orders regulating their
9	meetings or the meetings of any committee thereof.
10	2(1) The Board of Trustees shall meet not less than five times in a
11	year and subject thereto, the Board of Trustees shall meet whenever it is
12	summoned by the Chairman, and if the Chairman is required to do so by notice

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to establish a National Council to provide categorical public assistance and aid to widows, dependent children and orphans in the Federation, for the purposes of improving their living and health conditions to within reasonable minimum acceptable standard of decency.

The Bill further seeks to emphasize the fact that the economic and social benefits directed to be provided and rendered under this Bill are rights rather than privileges to the citizenry.
