PROVISION OF MEDICAL CARE AND PROVISION OF SUBSIDIES FOR POOR FAMILIES AND TO PROTECT THE LESS PRIVILEGE IN THE SOCIETY

5	(2) The function and duties of the commission shall be:
5	(i) To ensure effective data collection of all citizens, for the
7	implementation of various scheme that will affect the lives of the citizens
8	positively in collaboration with relevant bodies and agencies;
9	(ii) To ensure that those who have been deprived of their means of
10	livelihood as a result of disability (temporal or permanent), oil and gas
11	pollution, retrenchment, urban encroachment war demolition forced mentally
12	derailed relocation and death are duly compensated or rehabilitated;
13	(iii) To ensure that every Nigerian is reached, so as to identify their
14	challenges, and proffer the best way to manage the problems they are facing;
15	(iv) To ensure that basic amenities/facilities such as Health Care,
16	sports, schools, skills Acquisition, Rehabilitation Centers, Micro financial
17	institutions etc are built with best standards Nationwide, to complement
18	government effort;
19	(v).To apply appropriate, budgetary provision with respect to section 2
20	(iii & iv) of this bill or as authorized by the president or as approved by the
21	National Assembly;
22	(vi) To ensure that all social security policies are harmonized and
23	implemented under a unified body, in order for accountability, equity fairness,
24	justice, to avoid duplication duties and also to have a clear source of funding;
25	(vii) To liaise with relevant bodies and fashion out appropriate
26	National social management plan with a view of making effective, the
27	operational social welfare/security scheme for use by all relevant bodies and
28	agencies operating in Nigeria in order to eliminate or minimize the rate of

poverty, sickness, ignorance, illiteracy, and death;

15	of livelihood as a result of oil and gas pollution, demolition, urban
16	encroachment, forced relocation, retrenchment and death of spouse or the
17	bread winner war as specified in section 13 of this bill duly confirmed and

25	Welfare is the provision of a minimal level of wellbeing and social support fo
26	all citizens, sometimes referred to as public aid in most developed countries
27	welfare is largely provided by the Government, in addition to charities
28	informal groups, religious groups and inter governmental organizations
29	Welfare services include: universal healthcare, basic education, public

	Within the current security challenges in Nigeria like Boko Haran menace,
	military in the Niger Delta(including oil theft), Kidnapping and various
	kinds of vices. There is the need for this commission to be established.
	Secondly, Nigeria has now become a place where we have so many non-
	governmental agencies operating without proper monitoring and
	supervision. We have discovered that various international donor agencies
	have claimed that they have spent huge sum of money on the welfare of
	Nigerians but with nothing to show for it. With the establishment of a
	commission like this, we shall have proper coordination of activities that has
0	to do with the welfare of Nigerians.
1	Finally, instead of setting up various committees that have to make
2	recommendation on the welfare of Nigerians after a certain period of time,
3	they are no longer effective. It is expedient for a commission like this to be
4	established to work in collaboration with these committees and implement,
5	supervise and monitor these recommendations and also remain as a
6	structure for future exigencies.
