Commencement ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Amendment of Nigeria-The Nigerian Communications Commission Act Cap. N97 2 Nigerian Communications Laws of the Federation of Nigeria 2004, (in this Bill referred to as "the 3 Commission Act Cap. N97 4 LFN, 2004 Principal Act") is amended as set out in this Bill. 2. Section 17 of the Principal Act is amended by substituting for Amendment of 5 Section 17 6 the existing section 17, a new section 17-"17. (1) The Funds of the Commission shall consist of-(a) such funds as budgetary allocations, trust funds, subventions, 8 grants-in-aid and loans as may, from time to time, be made by the Federal 9 10 Government: (b) such sums or property which may, from time to time by way of 11 loans or grants and gifts accrue to the Commission form any other 12 13 Government, non-governmental bodies or individuals, and 14 (c) other monies received by the Commission which may in any way, become payable to or vested in the Commission by way of revenues, 15 16 fees, levies, taxes, penalties, gifts, grants-in-aid, testamentary disposition and all other assets that may from time to time accrue to the Commission." 17 18 (2) All monies received by or on behalf of the Commission shall be 19
