## A BILL

## **FOR**

AN ACT TO PROTECT THE RIGHTS OF URBAN STREET VENDORS AND TO REGULATE STREET VENDING ACTIVITIES IN THE FEDERAL CAPITAL TERRITORY (FCT) AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

Sponsored by Hon. Lovette Ederin Idisi

BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria: PART I - CONSTITUTION OF THE FEDERAL CAPITAL TERRITORY CITY 1 2 VENDING COMMITTEE, ETC. 1.-(1) The Minister shall constitute a City Vending Committee 3 which shall be known as the Federal Capital Territory City Vending 4 Committee (in this Bill referred to as "the Committee") to enforce the 5 provisions under this Bill: Provided that the Minister may, if considered necessary, provide for constitution of more than one Committee, for each ward, in each area 8 council. (2) The Committee shall consist of the following members, that is: 10 (a) Secretary, FCT Area Council, who shall be the Chairperson; 11 12 and (b) One person to represent each of the following: 13 14 (i) the FCT department or agency charged with the responsibility for town planning; 15 (ii) the FCT department or agency charged with the responsibility 16 for environmental protection; 17 (iii) traffic Police; 18 19 (v) market and traders associations. (vii) resident welfare associations, 20

1 (viii) banks. (c) 5 persons to represent association of street vendors. 2 Provided that three of such members representing the association of street 3 4 vendors shall be from amongst women vendors: 5 Provided further that representation shall be given to the less privileged and/or minorities and persons with disabilities. 6 (3) The Chairperson and the members constituted under sub-clause 7 (2) shall receive such allowances as may be prescribed by the Minister. 8 2.
