## FOR

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH FEDERAL POLYTECHNIC IKOYI, OSUN STATE, TO PROVIDE FULL-TIME COURSES IN TECHNOLOGY, APPLIED SCIENCE MANAGEMENT AND OTHER FIELDS OF STUDIES AND TO MAKE PROVISIONS FOR ADMINISTRATION AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

(2) Nothing in this section shall preclude the government of a State 18 19 or any of its agencies from setting up a polytechnic similar to any

11	polytechnic, suspend such member and any such suspension shall forthwith
12	be reported to the Council.
13	(3) For good cause, any member of staff may be suspended from
14	office or his appointment may be terminated by the Council, and for the
15	purpose of this subsection, "good cause" means:
16	(a) any physical or mental incapacity which the Council, after
17	obtaining medical advice, considers to be such as to render the person
18	concerned unfit for the discharge of the functions of his office;
19	(b) any physical or mental incapacity which the Council, after
20	obtaining medical advice, considers to be such as to render the person
21	concerned unfit to continue to hold his office;
22	(c) conduct of a scandalous or other disgraceful nature which the
23	Council considers to be such as to render the person concerned unfit to
24	continue to hold his office; or
25	(d) conduct which the Council considers to be such as to constitute
26	failure or inability of the person concerned to discharge the functions of his
27	office or to comply with the terms and conditions of his service.

	21	the Council from making such regulations for the discipline of other categories
-	22	of staff and workers of the polytechnic as it may think fit.

	24	18(1) Subject to the provisions of this section, where it appears to
	25	the Rector that any student of the polytechnic has been guilty of misconduct,
	26	the Rector may, without prejudice to any other disciplinary powers conferred
	27	on him by this Bill or regulations made hereunder direct:
	28	(a) that the student shall not during such period as may be specified in
	29	the direction, participate in such activities of the polytechnic, or make use of
	30	such facilities of the polytechnic, as he may specify;

1	(b) that the activities of the student shall, during such period as may
2	be specified in the directions, be restricted in such manner as may be so
3	specified;
4	(c) that the student be suspended for such period as may be
5	specified in the directions; or
6	(d) that the student be expelled from the polytechnic.
7	(2) Where there is temporarily no Rector or where the Rector
8	refuses to apply any disciplinary measures, the Council, either directly or
9	through some other staff, may apply such disciplinary actions as are
10	specified in subsection (1) of this section to any student of the polytechnic
11	who is guilty of misconduct.
12	(3) Where a direction is given under subsection (1) (c) or (d) of this
13	section in respect of any student, the student may, within a period of 21 days
14	from the date of the letter communicating the decision to him, appeal from
15	the direction to the Council; and where such an appeal is brought, the
16	Council shall, after causing such inquiry to be made in the matter as the
17	Council considers just, either confirm or set aside the direction or modify it
18	in such manner as the Council may think fit.
19	(4) The fact that an appeal from a direction is brought in pursuance
20	of subsection (3) of this section shall not affect the operation of the direction
21	while the appeal is pending.
22	(5) The Rector may delegate his power under this section to a
23	disciplinary committee consisting of such members of the polytechnic as he
24	may nominate.
25	(6) Nothing in this section shall be construed as preventing the
26	restriction or termination of a student's activities at the polytechnic
27	otherwise than on the ground of misconduct.
28	(7) It is hereby declared that a direction under subsection (1) (a) of
29	this section may be combined with a direction under subsection (1) (b) of
30	this section.

No person shall be required to satisfy requirements as to any of discrimination on account of 10 the following matters, that is to say race (including ethnic grouping), sex, place race, religion, etc. 11 of birth or of the family origin or religious or political persuasion or as a 12 condition of becoming or continuing to be a student at the polytechnic or as a 13 holder of any certificate of the polytechnic, or of any appointment or 14 employment at the polytechnic, or a member of anybody established by virtue of this Bill; and no person shall be subjected to any disadvantage or accorded 15 16 any advantage in relation to the polytechnic by reference to any of those 17 matters: 18 Provided that, nothing in this section shall be construed as preventing 19 the polytechnic from imposing any disability or restriction on any of the 20 aforementioned persons where such a person wilfully refuses or fails on 21 grounds of religious belief to undertake any duty generally and uniformly 22 imposed on all such persons or any group of them which duty, having regard to 23 its nature and the special circumstances pertaining thereto is, in the opinion of 24 the polytechnic, reasonably justifiable in the national interest. 25 Quorum and 27. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 6 (2) of the Second procedure of bodies established 26 Schedule to this Bill and any standing orders, bye-law or to be made in future under this Bill 27 under this Bill, the quorum and procedure of any body of persons established 28 by this Bill shall be such as may be determined by that body. 29 % Interpretation 28. In this Bill, unless the context otherwise requires: 30 "The Academic Board" means the board establish under section 10 of this Bill;

16	SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE COUNCIL
17	Terms of office of members
18	1(1) A member of the Council other than an ex-officio member
19	shall hold office for a period of three years beginning with the date on which
20	he was appointed and shall be eligible for re-appointment for a further term
21	of three years and thereafter he shall no longer be eligible for re-
22	appointment.
23	(2) Members of the Council holding office as specified in
24	paragraph 1 (1) of this Schedule, shall be paid remuneration or allowance in
25	 accordance with rates specified from time to time by the National Council of
26	Ministers.
27	(3) A member of the Council holding office as specified in
28	paragraph 1 (1) of this Schedule may by notice in writing to the Minister
29	resign his office.
30	2(1) Where a vacancy occurs in the membership of the Council,

1	that vacancy shall be filled by the appointment of a successor to hold office fo

29	(iv) four students of the polytechnic, and the Committee on Students'
30	Affairs shall be charged with the duty of:

l	(i) considering any matter which relates to the welfare of students;
2	(ii) any other matter referred to it by either the Councilor students
3	of the polytechnic;
4	(iii) any matter which the students wish to refer to the Council shall
5	be referred to the Committee on Students Affairs in the first instance.
6	(3) No decision of a committee shall have effect unless it is
7	confirmed by the Council.
8	Proceedings of the Council
9	4(1) The Council shall meet for the conduct of business at such
10	times as the chairman of the Council may appoint but shall meet not less than
11	twice in a year.
12	(2) The chairman of the Council may at any time and shall at the
13	request in writing of not less than five members of the Council summon a
14	meeting of the Council.
15	(3) Particulars of the business to be transacted shall be circulated to
16	members with the notice of the meeting at least two weeks before the date of
17	the meeting.
18	5. Where the Council desires to obtain the advice of any person on
19	any particular matter, it may co-opt such person as a member for a meeting
20	whether or not expressly convened for the purpose of considering the
21	particular matter but no co-opted member shall be entitled to vote or shall
22	count towards quorum.
23	6(1) Every question put before the Council at a meeting shall be
24	decided by a simple majority of the members present and voting.
25	(2) Seven members shall form a quorum at any meeting of the

7	9. Any contract or instrument which if entered into by a person not

9	manner be entered into or executed on behalf of the Council by any person
10	generally or specifically authorised by it for that purpose.
11	10(1) The common seal of the Council shall not be used or affixed to
12	any document except in pursuance of a resolution duly passed at a properly
13	constituted meeting of the Council and recorded in the minutes of such
14	meeting.
15	(2) The fixing of the seal of the Council shall be authenticated by the
16	signature of the Chairman of the Council and some other member authorised
17	generally or specifically by the Council to act for that purpose.
18	(3) Any document purporting to be a document duly executed under
19	the seal of the Council shall be received in evidence and shall, unless the
20	contrary is proved, be deemed to be so executed.
21	11. Any member of the Councilor a committee thereof who has a
22	personal interest in any contract or arrangement entered into or proposed to be
23	considered by the Councilor a committee thereof, shall forthwith disclose his
24	interest to the Council and shall not vote on any question relating to such
25	contract or arrangement.
