AN ACT TO ESTABLISH FEDERAL UNIVERSITY OF AGRICULTURE ARAROMI-OWU, OSUN STATE TO MAKE COMPREHENSIVE PROVISIONS FOR ITS DUE MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows:

1 1.-(1) There is established the Federal University of Agriculture
2 (Herein after referred to as "the University").

Establishment
and Objects of
Federal University
of Agriculture
Araromi-Owu,
Osun State

3 (2) The University shall be a body corporate with perpetual
4 succession and common seal and shall take power to acquire and dispose of
5 interest in movable and immovable properties.

6 (3) The University may sue and be sued in its corporate name.

7 2.-(1) The objects of the University shall be to-

Objects of the
University

8 (a) encourage the advancement of learning and to hold out to all
9 persons without distinction of race, creed, sex or political conviction the
10 opportunity of acquiring a higher education in Agriculture;

11 (b) to develop and offer academic and professional programmes
12 leading to with emphasis on planning, adaptive, technical, maintenance,
13 developmental and productive skills in the engineering, scientific, and allied
14 professional disciplines relating to Sports resources with the aim of
15 producing socially mature men and women with capability not only to
16 understand, use and adapt existing technologies in the Agriculture, but also
17 to improve on them and develop new ones;

18 (c) to act as agents and catalysts, through post-graduate training,
19 research and innovation for the effective and economic utilization,
20 exploitation and conservation of the country's Agriculture resources;

1 (d) to offer to the general population particularly in the area
2 Agriculture as a form of public service, the results of training and research and
3 to foster the practical applications of these results;

4 (e) to establish appropriate relationships with other national
5 institutions involved in training, research and development of technologies in
6 the Sports sector;

7 (f) to identify the problems and needs of the Agriculture sector in
8 Nigeria and to find solutions to them within the context of overall national
9 development;

10 (g) to provide and promote sound basic scientific training as a
11 foundation for the development of Agriculture in Nigeria, taking into account
12 indigenous cultures and the need to enhance national unity;

13 (h) to encourage and promote scholarship and conduct research in
14 restricted fields of learning and human endeavor;

15 (i) to relate its activities to the technological, social, cultural and
16 economic needs of the people of Nigeria; and

17 (j) to undertake any other activities appropriate for an Agriculture
18 university of the highest standard.

Constitution of
the University
and its constituent
bodies, etc.

19 3.-(1) The University shall consist of-

20 (a) a Chancellor;

21 (b) a Pro-Chancellor and a Council;

22 (c) a Vice Chancellor and a Senate;

23 (d) a Deputy Vice-Chancellor;

24 (e) a body to be called Congregation;

25 (f) a body to be called Convocation;

26 (g) the campuses and colleges of the University;

27 (h) the faculties, schools, institutes and other teaching and research
28 units of the University;

29 (i) the persons holding the offices constituted by the First Schedule to
30 this Bill other than those mentioned in paragraphs (a) to (c) of this subsection;

1 (j) all graduates and undergraduates; and all other persons who are
2 members of the University in accordance with provisions made by Statute in
3 that behalf.

4 (2) The First Schedule to this Bill shall have effect with respect to
5 the Principal Officers of the University mentioned therein.

6 (3) Provision shall be made by Statute with respect to the
7 constitution of the following bodies, namely-

8 (a) the Council;

9 (b) the Senate;

10 (c) the Congregation; and

11 (d) the Convocation.

12 4.-(1) For the carrying out of its objects as specified in Section 2 of
13 this Bill, the University shall have power to-

Powers of the
University

14 (a) establish such campuses, colleges, faculties, institutes, schools,
15 extra- mural departments and other teaching and research units within the
16 University as may from time to time seem necessary or desirable, subject to
17 the approval of the National Universities Commission;

18 (b) institute professorships, readerships and associate
19 professorships, lectureships and other posts and offices and to make
20 appointments thereto;

21 (c) institute and award fellowships, scholarships, exhibitions,
22 bursaries, medals, prizes and other titles, distinctions, awards and forms of
23 assistance;

24 (d) provide for the residence, discipline and welfare of members of
25 the University;

26 (e) hold examinations and award degrees; diplomas, certificates
27 and other distinctions to persons who have pursued a course of study
28 approved by the University and have satisfied such other requirements as the
29 University may lay down;

30 (f) award honorary degrees, fellowships or academic titles;

1 (g) demand and receive from any student or any other person
2 attending the University for the purpose of instruction such fees as the
3 University may from time to time determine, subject to the overall directives of
4 the appropriate authority;

5 (h) subject to section 22 of this Bill, to acquire, hold, grant, charge or
6 otherwise deal with or dispose of movable and immovable property wherever
7 situate;

8 (i) accept gifts, legacies and donations, but without obligation to
9 accept the same for a particular purpose unless it approves the terms and
10 conditions attaching thereto;

11 (j) enter into contracts, establish trusts, act as trustee, solely or jointly
12 with any other person, and employ and act through agents;

13 (k) erect, provide, equip and maintain libraries, laboratories, lecture
14 halls, halls of residence, refectories, sports grounds, playing fields and other
15 buildings or things necessary, suitable or convenient for any of the objects of
16 the University;

17 (l) hold public lectures and undertake printing, publishing and book
18 selling;

19 (m) subject to any limitations or conditions imposed by Statute, to
20 invest any moneys appertaining to the University by law of endorsement,
21 whether for general or special purposes, and such other moneys as may not be
22 immediately required for current expenditure, in any investments or securities
23 or in the purchase or improvement of land, with power from time to time to vary
24 any such investments and to deposit any moneys for the time being un-invested
25 with any bank on deposit or current account;

26 (n) borrow, whether on interest or not, and if need be, upon the
27 security of any or all of the property movable or immovable of the University,
28 such moneys as the Council may from time to time in its discretion find
29 necessary or expedient to borrow or to guarantee any loan, advances or credit
30 facilities;

1 (o) make gifts for any charitable purpose;

2 (p) do anything which it is authorized or required by this Bill or by
3 any other Statute to do; and

4 (q) do all such acts or things, whether or not incidental to the
5 foregoing powers, as may advance the objects of the University.

6 (2) Subject to the provisions of this Bill and of the Statutes made
7 thereunder and without prejudice to Section 9 (2) of this Bill, the powers
8 conferred on the University by subsection (1) of this section shall be
9 exercisable on behalf of the University by the Council or by the Senate or in
10 any other manner which may be authorized by this Bill.

11 5.-(1) The Chancellor shall in relation to the University, take
12 precedence before all other members of the University, and when he is
13 present shall preside at all meetings of convocation held for conferring
14 degrees.

Functions of the
Chancellor and
Pro-Chancellor

15 (2) The Pro-Chancellor shall, in relation to the University, take
16 precedence before all other members of the University except the
17 Chancellor, and except for the Vice Chancellor when acting as Chairman of
18 Congregation or Convocation, and the Pro-Chancellor shall when he is
19 present, be the Chairman at all meetings of the Council.

20 6.-(1) There shall be a Council for the University consisting of:

Establishment
and Composition
of Council

21 (a) the Pro-Chancellor;

22 (b) the Vice-Chancellor;

23 (c) the Deputy Vice-Chancellor;

24 (d) one person from the Ministry responsible for Agriculture;

25 (e) four persons representing a variety of interest and broadly
26 representative of the whole Federation;

27 (f) four persons appointed by the Senate from among its members;

28 (g) two persons appointed by the congregation from among its
29 members;

1 (h) one persons appointed by Convocation from among its members.

2 (2) Persons to be appointed to the Council shall be persons of proven
3 integrity, knowledgeable and familiar with the affairs and tradition of the
4 University.

Functions of the
Council and its
Finance General
Purpose

5 7.-(1) Subject to the provisions of this Bill relating to the Visitor, the
6 Council shall be the Governing Body of the University and shall be charged
7 with the general control and superintendence of the policy, finances and
8 property of the University, including its public relations.

9 (2) There shall be a committee of the Council to be known as the
10 Finance and General Purposes Committee, which shall, subject to the
11 directions of the Council, exercise control over the property and expenditure of
12 the Council as the Council may from time to time delegate to it.

13 (3) Provision shall be made by Statute with respect to the constitution
14 of the Finance and General Purposes Committee.

15 (4) The Council shall ensure proper accounts of the University are
16 kept and that the accounts of the University are audited annually by auditors
17 appointed by the Council from the list and in accordance with guidelines
18 supplied by the Auditor-General of the Federation, and that an annual report is
19 published by the University together with certified copies of the said accounts
20 as audited.

21 (5) Subject to this Bill and the Statutes, the Council and the Finance
22 and General Purposes Committee may each make rules for the purpose of
23 exercising any of their respective functions or of regulating their own
24 procedure.

25 (6) Rules made under subsection (5) of this section by the Finance and
26 General Purposes Committee shall not come into force unless approved by the
27 Council, and where any rule so made by the Committee conflict with any
28 directions given by the Council (whether before or after the coming into force
29 of the rules in question), the direction of the Council shall prevail.

30 (7) There shall be paid to the members of the Council, the Finance and

1 General Purposes Committee and of any other committee set up by the
2 Council, allowances in respect of travelling and other reasonable expenses,
3 at such rates as may from time to time be fixed by extant government
4 circulars.

5 (8) The Council shall meet as and when necessary for the
6 performance of its functions under this Bill, and shall meet at least four times
7 every year.

8 (9) If required in writing by any five members of the Council, the
9 Chairman shall within twenty-eight days after the receipt of such request
10 call a meeting of the Council: Provided that if after 28 days of the receipt or
11 delivering to him of such request, the chairman fails or neglects to call a
12 meeting, the Registrar shall within 14 days thereof, cause a meeting of the
13 Council to be convened for that purpose. The request shall specify the
14 business to be considered at the meeting and no business not so specified
15 shall be transacted at that meeting.

16 8.-(1) Subject to section 5 of this Bill and subsections (3) and (4) of
17 this section and to the provisions of this Bill relating to the Visitor, it shall be
18 the general function of the Senate to organize and control teaching in the
19 University, admission to Postgraduate courses and other admission of
20 students, the discipline of students and to promote research in the
21 University.

Functions of the
Senate

22 (2) Without prejudice to the generality of the provisions of
23 subsection (1) of this section, it shall in particular be the function of the
24 Senate to make provision for the -

25 (a) establishment, organization and control of campuses, colleges,
26 faculties, departments, schools, institutes and other teaching and research
27 units of the University, and the allocation of responsibility for different
28 branches of learning;

29 (b) organization and control of courses of study in the University
30 and of the examinations held in conjunction with those courses, including

1 the appointment of examiners, both internal and external;

2 (c) award of degrees, and such other qualifications as may be
3 prescribed, in connection with examinations conducted by the University;

4 (d) making of recommendations to the Council with respect to the
5 award to any person of an honorary fellowship or honorary degree or the title of
6 professor emeritus;

7 (e) establishment, organization and control of halls of residence and
8 similar institutions in the University;

9 (f) supervision of the welfare of students in the University and the
10 regulation of their conduct;

11 (g) granting of fellowships, scholarships, prizes and similar awards in
12 so far as the awards are within the control of the University; and

13 (h) determination of what description of dress shall be academic dress
14 for the purposes of the University, and regulating the use of academic dress.

15 (3) The Senate shall not establish any new campus, college, faculty,
16 department, school, institute or other teaching and research units of the
17 University, or any hall of residence or similar institution at the University
18 without the approval of the Council.

19 (4) (a) Subject to this Bill and the Statutes, the Senate may make
20 regulations for the purpose of exercising any function conferred on it either by
21 the provisions of this section or for the purpose of providing for any matter for
22 which provision by regulation is authorized or required by this Actor by
23 Statute;

24 (b) The Senate shall, by regulation, provide that at least one of the
25 persons appointed as examiners at each final or professional examination held
26 in conjunction with any course of study in the University is not a teacher at the
27 University but is a teacher at the branch of learning to which the course relates
28 in some other university of high repute.

29 (5) Subject to a right of appeal to the Council from a decision of the
30 Senate under this subsection, the Senate may deprive any person of any degree,

1 diploma or other award of the University which has been conferred on him if
2 after due enquiry he is shown to have been guilty of any dishonorable or
3 scandalous conduct in gaining admission into the University or obtaining
4 that award.

5 9.-(1) The Vice-Chancellor shall, in relation to the University, take
6 precedence before all other members of the University except the
7 Chancellor and, subject to section 5 of this Bill, the Pro-Chancellor and any
8 other person for the time being acting as Chairman of the Council.

Functions of the
Vice-Chancellor

9 (2) Subject to the provisions of this Bill, the Vice-Chancellor shall
10 have general function, in addition to any other functions conferred on him
11 by this Bill or otherwise, of directing the activities of the University, and
12 shall to the exclusion of any other person or authority be the chief executive
13 and academic officer of the University and ex-officio Chairman of the
14 Senate.

15 10.-(1) All property held by or on behalf of the Provisional Council
16 shall, by virtue of this subsection and without further assurance, vest in the
17 University and be held by it for the purpose of the University.

Transfer of
property to the
University

18 (2) The provisions of the Second Schedule to this Bill shall have
19 effect with respect to the transfer of property by this section and to matters
20 arising there from and with respect to other matters mentioned in that
21 Schedule.

Second Schedule

22 11.-(1) Subject to this Act, the University may make Statutes for
23 any of the following purposes-

Power of the
University to
make Statues

24 (a) making provision with respect to the composition and
25 constitution of any authority of the University;

26 (b) specifying and regulating the powers and duties of any
27 authority of the University, and regulating any other matter connected with
28 the University or any of its authorities;

29 (c) regulating the admission of students where it is done by the
30 University, and their discipline and welfare;

1 (d) determining whether any particular matter is to be treated as an
2 academic or non-academic matter for the purposes of this Bill and of any
3 Statute, regulation or other instrument made there-under; and

4 (e) making provision for other matters for which provision by Statute
5 is authorized or required by this Bill.

6 (2) Subject to section 25 (6) of this Bill, the Interpretation Bill shall
7 apply in relation to any Statute made under this section as it applies to a
8 subsidiary instrument within the meaning of section 27 (1) of that Bill.

9 (3) The Statute contained in the Third Schedule to this Bill shall be
10 deemed to have come into force on the commencement of this Bill and shall be
11 deemed to have been made under this section by the University.

12 (4) The power to make Statute conferred by this section shall not be
13 prejudiced or limited in any way by reason of the inclusion or omission of any
14 matter in or from the Statute contained in the Third Schedule to this Act or any
15 subsequent Statute.

Mode of exercising
the power to
make Statutes

16 **12.**-(1) The power of the University to make Statutes shall be
17 exercised in accordance with the provisions of this section.

18 (2) A proposed Statute shall not have the force of law until it has been
19 approved at a meeting of the-

20 (a) Senate, by the votes of not less than two thirds of the members
21 present and voting; and

22 (b) Council by the votes of not less than two thirds of the members
23 present and voting.

24 (3) A proposed Statute may originate either in the Senate or Council,
25 and may be approved as required by subsection (2) of this section by both
26 bodies in no particular order.

27 (4) A Statute which-

28 (a) makes provision for or alters the composition or constitution of the
29 Council, the Senate or any other authority of the University; or

30 (b) provides for the establishment of a new campus or college or for

1 the amendment or revocation of any Statute whereby a campus or college is
2 established; shall not come into operation unless it has been approved by the
3 Visitor.

4 (5) For the purpose of section 2 (2) of the Interpretation Bill, a
5 Statute shall be treated as being made on the date on which it is approved by
6 the Council and the Senate in accordance with subsection (3) of this section
7 or in the case of a Statute falling within subsection (4) of this section, on the
8 date on which it is approved by the President.

9 13. A Statute may be proved in any court by the production of a
10 copy thereof bearing or having affixed to it a certificate signed by the Vice-
11 Chancellor or the Registrar to the effect that the copy is a true copy of a
12 Statute of that University.

Proof of Statute

13 14.-(1) In the event of any doubt or dispute arising at any time as to
14 the meaning of any provision of a Statute, the matter may be referred to the
15 Visitor, who shall take such advice and make such decision thereon as he
16 deems fit.

Power to decide
the meaning of
Statute

17 (2) The decision of the Visitor on any matter referred to him under
18 this section shall be binding upon the authorities, staff and students of that
19 University and where any question as to the meaning of any provision of a
20 statute has been decided by the Visitor under this section, no question as to
21 the meaning of that provision shall be entertained by any other authority in
22 Nigeria: Provided that nothing in this subsection shall affect the power of a
23 court of competent jurisdiction to determine whether any provision of a
24 statute is wholly or partly void as being ultra vires or as being inconsistent
25 with the Constitution.

26 (3) The foregoing provisions of this section shall apply in relation
27 to any doubt or dispute as to whether any matter is, for the purposes of this
28 Act, academic or a non-academic matter as they apply in relation to any such
29 doubt or dispute as is mentioned in subsection (1) of this section, and
30 accordingly the reference in subsection (2) of this section to any question as

1 to the meaning of any provision of a statute shall include references to any
2 question as to whether any matter is for the said purposes an academic or non-
3 academic matter.

The Visitor

4 15.-(1) The President shall be the Visitor of the University.

5 (2) The Visitor shall as often as the circumstances may require, not
6 being less than once every five years, conduct a visitation of the University or
7 direct that such a visitation be conducted by such persons as the Visitor may
8 deem fit and in respect of any of the affairs of the University.

9 (3) It shall be the duty of the bodies and persons comprising the
10 University to-

11 (a) make available to the Visitor, and to any other persons conducting
12 a visitation in pursuance of this section, such facilities and assistance as he or
13 they may reasonably require for the purpose of the visitation; and

14 (b) give effect to any instructions consistent with the provisions of
15 this Bill which may be given by the Visitor in consequence of the visitation.

Removal of
certain Members
of the Council

16 16.-(1) If it appears to the Council that a member (other than the Pro-
17 Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor) should be removed from office on grounds
18 of misconduct or inability to perform the functions of his office, the Council
19 shall make a recommendation to that effect through the Minister to the Sports
20 University of Nigeria Abuja Executive Council and if the Sports university of
21 Nigeria Abuja Executive Council, after making such enquiry (if any) as may be
22 considered necessary, approves the recommendation it may direct the removal
23 of the member from office.

24 (2) It shall be the duty of the Minister to use his best endeavors to
25 cause a copy of the instrument embodying a direction under subsection (1) of
26 this section to be served as soon as reasonably practicable on the person to
27 whom it relates.

Removal and
Discipline of
Academic,
Administrative
and Professional
Staff

28 17.-(1) If it appears to the Council that there are reasons for believing
29 that any person employed as a member of the academic, administrative or
30 professional staff of the University, other than the Vice-Chancellor, should be

1 removed from office or on grounds of misconduct or inability to perform the
2 functions of his office Council shall-

3 (a) give notice of those reasons to the person in question;

4 (b) afford such person an opportunity of making representation in
5 person on the matter to the Council; and

6 (c) take a decision to terminate or not to terminate the appointment.

7 (2) If the affected staff or any three members of the Council so
8 request within a period of one month from the date of receipt of the notice of
9 the Council's decision, the Council shall make arrangements for -

10 (a) a joint committee of the Council and the Senate to review the
11 matter and to report on it to the Council;

12 (b) the person in question to be afforded an opportunity to appear
13 before and be heard by an investigating committee with respect to the
14 matter; and if the Council after considering the report of the investigating
15 committee, is satisfied that the person in question should be removed, the
16 Council may so remove him by an instrument in writing signed on the
17 directions of the Council.

18 (3) The Vice-Chancellor may, in a case of gross misconduct by a
19 member of staff which in the opinion of the Vice-Chancellor is prejudicial to
20 the interest of the University, suspend such member and any such
21 suspension shall immediately be reported to the Council.

22 (4) Any member of staff may be suspended from duty or his
23 appointment may be terminated by Council for a good cause and for the
24 purposes of this subsection "good cause" means-

25 (a) conviction for any offence which the Council considers to be
26 such as to render the person concerned unfit for the discharge of the
27 functions of his office;

28 (b) any physical or mental incapacity which the Council, after
29 obtaining medical advice, considers to be such as to render the person
30 concerned unfit to continue to hold office;

1 (c) conduct of a scandalous or disgraceful nature which the Council
2 considers to be such as to render the person concerned unfit to continue to hold
3 office; or

4 (d) conduct which the Council considers to be such as to constitute
5 failure or inability of the person concerned to discharge the functions of his
6 office or to comply with the terms and conditions of his service.

7 (5) Any person suspended pursuant to subsection (3) of this section
8 shall be on half pay and the Council shall before the expiration of a period of
9 three months from the date of such suspension consider the case against that
10 person and come to a decision as to whether to-

11 (a) continue such person's suspension and if so on what terms
12 (including the proportion of his emoluments to be paid to him);

13 (b) reinstate such person in which case the Council shall restore his
14 full emoluments with effect from the date of suspension;

15 (c) terminate the appointment of the person concerned in which case
16 such a person will not be entitled to the proportion of his emoluments withheld
17 during the period of suspension; or

18 (d) take such lesser disciplinary action against such person (including
19 the restoration of such proportion of his emoluments that might have been
20 withheld) as the Council may determine.

21 (6) Where the Council, pursuant to this section, decides to continue a
22 person's suspension or decides to take further disciplinary action against the
23 person, the Council shall, before the expiration of three months from such
24 decision come to a final determination in respect of the case concerning such a
25 person.

26 (7) It shall be the duty of the person by whom an instrument of
27 removal is signed in pursuance of subsection (1) above to use his best endeavors
28 to cause a copy of the instrument to be served as soon as reasonably practicable
29 on the person to whom it relates.

30 (8) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this section shall prevent

1 the Council from making regulations for the discipline of staff and workers
2 of the University as may be appropriate.

3 18.-(1) If, on the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor, it
4 appears to the Senate that a person appointed as an examiner for any
5 examination of the University ought to be removed from his office or
6 appointment, then, the Senate may, after affording the examiner an
7 opportunity of making representations in person on the matter, direct the
8 Vice-Chancellor to remove the examiner by an instrument in writing signed
9 by the Registrar.

Removal of
Examiners

10 (2) Subject to the provisions of any regulation made pursuant to
11 section 8 (4) of this Act, the Vice-Chancellor may, on the recommendation
12 of Senate, appoint an appropriate person as examiner in the place of the
13 examiner removed.

14 (3) It shall be the duty of the Registrar on signing an instrument of
15 removal pursuant to this section, to use his best endeavour to cause a copy of
16 the instrument to be served as soon as reasonably practicable on the person
17 to whom it relates.

18 19.-(1) Subject to the provisions of this section, where it appears to
19 the Vice-Chancellor that any student is guilty of misconduct, the Vice-
20 Chancellor may, without prejudice to any other disciplinary powers
21 conferred on him by Statute or regulations, direct that the-

Discipline of
Students

22 (a) student shall not, during such period as may be specified in the
23 direction, participate in such activities of the University or make use of such
24 facilities of the University as may be so specified;

25 (b) activities of the student shall, during such period as may be
26 specified in the direction, be restricted in such manner as may be so
27 specified;

28 (c) student be rusticated for such period as may be specified in the
29 direction; or

30 (2) Where a direction is given under subsection (1) paragraphs (c)

1 or (d) of this section in respect of any student, the student may, within the
2 prescribed period and in the prescribed manner, appeal against the direction to
3 the Senate.

4 (3) Where an appeal is brought pursuant to subsection (2) of this
5 section, the Senate shall, after causing such inquiry to be made in the matter as
6 the Senate considers just, either confirm or set aside the direction or modify it
7 in such manner as the Senate thinks fit.

8 (4) The fact that an appeal from a direction is brought pursuant to
9 subsection (2) of this section shall not affect the operation of the direction while
10 the appeal is pending.

11 (5) The Vice-Chancellor may delegate his powers under this section
12 to a disciplinary board consisting of such members of the University as he may
13 nominate.

14 (6) Nothing in this section shall be construed as preventing the
15 restriction or termination of a student's activities at the University for conduct
16 which in the opinion of Senate is prejudicial to the interest of the University or
17 to its corporate objective or image.

18 (7) A direction under subsection (1) (a) of this section may be
19 combined with a direction under subsection (1)(b) of this section.

Exclusion or
discrimination
on account of
race, religion, etc.

20 **20.-(1)** No person shall be required to satisfy requirements as to any of
21 the following matters, that is to say, race (including ethnic grouping) sex, place
22 of birth, family origin, religious or political persuasion, as a condition for
23 becoming or continuing to be a-

24 (a) student in the University;

25 (b) Holder of any degree, appointment or employment in the
26 University; or

27 (c) member of anybody established by virtue of this Bill.

28 (2) No person shall be subjected to any disadvantage or accorded any
29 advantage in relation to the University by reference to any of the matters
30 referred to in subsection (1) of this section.

1 (3) Nothing in subsection (1) of this section shall be construed as
2 preventing the University from imposing any disability or restriction on any
3 of the persons specified in subsection (1) of this section where such persons
4 willfully refuse or fail on grounds of religious belief to undertake any duty
5 generally and uniformly imposed on all such persons or any group of them
6 which duty, having regard to its nature and the special circumstances, is in
7 the opinion of the University reasonably justifiable in the national interest.

8 21.-(1) For the purpose of the Land Use Act (which provides for the
9 compulsory acquisition of land for public purposes) any purpose of the
10 University shall be the same as that of the Federation.

Transfer of Land

11 (2) Where an estate or interest in land is acquired by the
12 Government pursuant to this section, the Government may, by a certificate
13 under the hand and seal of the Sports University of Nigeria Abuja or any
14 other person authorized in that behalf transfer it to the University.

Interpretation

- 1 **26.-(1)** In this Bill-
- 2 "appropriate authority" means any person, body or authority authorized by law

- 16 "officer" does not include the Visitor;
- 17 "prescribed" means prescribed by Statute or Regulation made under this Bill;
- 18 "professor" means a person designated as a professor of the University in
- 19 accordance with provisions made in that behalf by Statute or by Regulations;
- 20 "property" includes rights, liabilities and obligations;
- 21 "regulations" means regulations made by the Senate or Council;
- 22 "Senate" means the Senate of the University established by the Bill;
- 23 "Statute" means a Statute made by the University under section 11 of this Bill
- 24 and in accordance with the provisions of section 12 of this Bill;
- 25 "the Statutes" means all such Statutes as are in force from time to time;
- 26 "teacher" means a person holding a full time appointment as a member of the
- 27 teaching or research staff of the University;
- 28 "President" means the President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria;
- 29 "Constitution" means the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria;
- 30 "undergraduate" means a person in *statu pupillari* in the University, other than-

1 (a) a graduate; and

2 (b) a person of such description as may be prescribed for the
3 purposes of this definition.

4 "the University" the Federal University of Agriculture Araromi-Owu, Osun
5 State incorporated and constituted by this Bill; and

6 "the Bill" means the Federal University of Agriculture Araromi-Owu, Osun
7 State, Bill.

8 (2) Where in any provision of this Bill, it is laid down that
9 proposals are to be submitted or a recommendation is to be made by one
10 authority to another through one or more intermediate authorities, it shall be
11 the duty of every such intermediate authority to forward any proposals or
12 recommendations received by it pursuant to that provision to the appropriate
13 authority; but any such intermediate authority may, if it thinks fit, forward
14 therewith its own comments thereon.

4 PRINCIPAL OFFICERS OF THE UNIVERSITY

5 *The Chancellor*

6 1.-(1) The Chancellor shall be appointed by and hold office at the
7 pleasure of the President.

8 *The Pro-Chancellor*

9 2.-(1) The Pro-Chancellor shall be appointed or removed from office
10 by the President.

11 (2) Subject to the provisions of this Bill, the Pro-Chancellor shall hold
12 office for a period of four years from the date of his appointment.

13 *The Vice-Chancellor*

14 3.-(1) The procedure for the appointment and removal of the Vice-
15 Chancellor shall be in accordance with the provision of the University
16 (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1993 as amended.

17 *Deputy Vice-Chancellor*

18 4.-(1) There shall be for the University, two Deputy Vice-Chancellors
19 or such number of Deputy Vice Chancellors as the Council may, from time to
20 time, deem necessary for the proper administration of the University.

21 (2) The procedure for the appointment and removal of the Deputy
22 Vice Chancellor shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Universities
23 (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1993 as amended.

24 (3) A Deputy Vice-Chancellor shall-

25 (a) assist the Vice-Chancellor in the performance of his functions;

26 (b) act in place of the Vice-Chancellor when the post of the Vice-
27 Chancellor is vacant or if the Vice-Chancellor is, for any reason, absent or
28 unable to perform his functions as Vice-Chancellor; and

29 (c) perform such other functions as the Vice-Chancellor or the
30 Council may, from time to time, assign to him.

1 *Office of the Registrar, Bursar and University Librarian*

2 5.-(1) There shall be for the University, a Registrar, who shall be
3 the Chief Administrative Officer of the University and shall be responsible
4 to the Vice-Chancellor for the day-to-day administration of the University
5 except as regards matters for which the Bursar is responsible in accordance
6 with paragraph 6(2) below.

7 (2) The person holding the office of Registrar shall by virtue of that
8 office be Secretary to the Council, the Senate, Congregation and
9 Convocation.

10 (3) The Registrar shall hold office for such period and on such
11 terms and conditions as to emoluments as may be specified in his letter of
12 appointment.

13 6.-(1) There shall be for the University, the following Principal
14 Officers in addition to the Registrar, that is-

15 (a) the Bursar; and

16 (b) the University Librarian.

17 (2) The Bursar shall be the Chief Financial Officer of the
18 University and shall be responsible to the Vice-Chancellor for the day-to-
19 day administration and control of the financial affairs of the University.

20 (3) The University Librarian shall be responsible to the Vice-
21 Chancellor for the administration of the University Library and the co-
22 ordination of all library services in the University and its campuses,
23 colleges, faculties, schools, departments and institutes and other teaching or
24 research units.

25 (4) The Bursar and the University Librarian-

26 (a) shall each hold office for such period and on such terms and
27 conditions as to emoluments as may be specified in his letter of
28 appointment.

29 *Other Officers of the University*

30 7. There shall be for the University, a Director of Works, who shall

1 be responsible to the Vice Chancellor for the administration of the Works
2 Department. He shall be responsible for all works, services and maintenance of
3 University facilities.

4 8. There shall be for the University, a Director of Health Services,
5 who shall be responsible to the Vice Chancellor for the administration of the
6 Health Centre. He shall be the Chief Medical Officer of the University and
7 shall coordinate all matters relating to the health of all staff and students.

8 *Resignation and re-appointment*

9 9.-(1) Any officer mentioned in the foregoing provisions of this
10 schedule may resign his office in-

11 (a) the case of the Chancellor or Pro-Chancellor, by notice to the
12 Visitor;

13 (b) the case of the Vice-Chancellor by notice to the Council which
14 shall immediately notify the Minister; and

15 (2) A person who has ceased to hold an office so mentioned otherwise
16 than by removal for misconduct shall be eligible for re-appointment to that
17 office.

20 **TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS AS TO PROPERTY, FUNCTIONS, ETC.**

21 **TRANSFER OF PROPERTY TO THE UNIVERSITY**

22 1. Without prejudice to the generality of Section 10 (1) of this Bill-

23 (a) the reference in the subsection to property held by the provisional
24 Council and the University shall include a reference to the right to receive and
25 give a good discharge for any grants or contributions which may have been
26 voted or promised to the provisional Council and the University; and

27 (b) all outstanding debts and liabilities of the provisional Council
28 shall become debts and liabilities of the University established by this Bill.

29 2.-(1) All agreements, contracts, deeds and other instruments to
30 which the provisional Council was a party shall, so far as possible and subject

1 to any necessary modifications, have effect as if the University established
2 by this Bill had been a party to it in place of the provisional Council.

3 (2) Documents not falling within sub-paragraph (1) above,
4 including enactments, which refer whether specially or generally to the
5 provisional Council shall be construed in accordance with that
6 subparagraph so far as applicable.

7 (3) Any legal proceedings or application to any authority pending
8 by or against the provisional Council may be continued by or against the
9 University established by this Bill.

10 *Registration of Transfers*

11 3.-(1) If the law in force at the place where any property transferred
12 by this Bill is situated provides for the registration of transfers of property of
13 the kind in question (whether by reference to an instrument of transfer or
14 otherwise), the law shall, so far as it provides for alterations of a register (but
15 not for avoidance of transfers, the payment of fees of any other matter)
16 apply, with the necessary modifications to the transfer of the property in
17 question.

18 (2) It shall be the duty of the body to which any property is
19 transferred by this Bill to furnish the necessary particulars of the transfer to
20 the proper officer of the registration authority, and of that officer to register
21 the transfer accordingly.

22 4.-(1) The first meeting of the Council shall be convened by the
23 Pro-Chancellor on such date and in such manner as he may determine.

24 (2) The persons who were members of the provisional Council
25 shall be deemed to constitute the Council until the date when the Council set
26 up under the Third Schedule to this Bill must have been duly constituted.

27 (3) The first meetings of the Senate as constituted by this Bill shall
28 be convened by the Vice-Chancellor on such date and in such manner as he
29 may determine.

30 (4) The persons who were members of the Senate immediately

1 before the coming into force of this Bill shall be deemed to constitute the
2 Senate of the University until the date when the Senate as set up under the Third
3 Schedule of this Bill must have been duly constituted.

4 (5) Subject to any regulations which may be made by the Senate after
5 the date on which this Bill is made, the faculties, faculty boards and students of
6 the University immediately before the coming into force of this Bill shall on
7 that day become faculties, faculty boards and students of the University as
8 established by this Bill.

9 (6) Persons who were deans or associate deans of faculties or
10 members of faculty boards shall continue to be deans or associate deans or
11 become members of the corresponding faculty boards, until new appointment
12 are made in pursuance of the Statutes under this Bill.

13 5. Any person who was a member of the staff of the University as
14 established or was otherwise employed by the provisional Council shall be
15 employed at the University on such designation, status and functions which
16 correspond as nearly as possible to those which pertained to him as a member
17 of that staff or as such an employee.

18 6. Questions as to the scope of the responsibilities of the aforesaid
19 officers shall be determined by the Vice-Chancellor.

1 any meeting but shall not be entitled to vote.

2 (8) The Council constituted by this Bill shall have a four year tenure
3 from the date of its inauguration, provided that where a Council is found to be
4 incompetent and corrupt, it shall be dissolved by the visitor and a new Council
5 shall be immediately constituted for the effective functioning of the University.

6 (9) The powers of the Council shall be exercised in accordance with
7 the laws and Statutes of the University, and to that extent, establishment
8 circulars that are inconsistent with the laws and Statutes of the University shall
9 not apply to the University.

10 *The Finance and General Purpose Committee*

11 2.-(1) The Finance and General Purpose Committee of the Council
12 shall consist of-

13 (a) the Pro-Chancellor, who shall be the Chairman of the committee at
14 any meeting at which he is present;

15 (b) the Vice-Chancellor and a Deputy Vice-Chancellor;

16 (c) six other members of the Council appointed by the Council two of
17 whom shall be selected from among the four members of the Council
18 appointed by the Senate and one of whom shall be selected from among
19 members of the Council appointed by the congregation; and

20 (d) the Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Agriculture or, in his
21 absence, such member of his Ministry as he may designate to represent him.

22 (2) The quorum of the Committee shall be six.

23 (3) Subject to any directions given by the Council, the committee may
24 regulate its own procedure.

25 *The Senate*

26 3.-(1) There shall be a Senate for the University consisting of:

27 (a) the Vice-Chancellor;

28 (b) the Deputy Vice-Chancellor;

29 (c) all Professors of the University;

1 (d) all Deans, Provosts and Directors of Academic units of the
2 University;

3 (e) all Heads of Academic Departments, Units and Research
4 Institutes of the University;

5 (f) the University Librarian; and

6 (g) academic members of the congregation who are not Professors
7 as specified in the Laws of the University.

8 (2) The Vice-Chancellor shall be the chairman at all meetings of the
9 Senate when he is present and in his absence, one of the Deputy Vice-
10 Chancellors appointed by him shall be the chairman at the meeting.

11 (3) The quorum of the Senate shall be one-quarter (or the nearest
12 whole number less than one quarter), and subject to paragraph (2) above the
13 Senate may regulate its own procedure.

14 (4) If so requested in writing by any ten members of the Senate, the
15 Vice-Chancellor, or in his absence a person duly appointed by him, shall
16 convene a meeting of the Senate to be held not later than the tenth day
17 following that on which the request was received.

18 *Congregation*

19 4.-(1) Congregation shall consist of-

20 (a) the Vice-Chancellor and the Deputy Vice-Chancellor;

21 (b) the full time members of the academic staff;

22 (c) the Registrar;

23 (d) the Bursar; and

24 (e) every member of the administrative and technical staff who
25 holds a degree of any University recognized for the purpose of this Statute
26 by the Vice-Chancellor, not being an honorary degree.

27 (2) Subject to section 5 of this Bill, the Vice-Chancellor shall be the
28 Chairman at all meetings of congregation when he is present, and in his
29 absence one of the Deputy Vice Chancellors appointed by him shall be the
30 chairman at the meeting.

1 (3) The quorum of congregation shall be one-third (or the nearest
2 whole number to one-third) of the total number of members of congregation or
3 fifty, whichever is less.

4 (4) A certificate signed by the Vice-Chancellor specifying-

5 (a) the total number of members of Congregation for the purposes of
6 any particular meeting or meetings of Congregation; or

7 (b) the names of the persons who are members of Congregation
8 during a particular period; shall be conclusive evidence of that number or as the
9 case may be of the names of those persons.

10 (5) Subject to the provisions of this schedule, congregation may
11 regulate its own procedure.

12 (6) Congregation shall be entitled to express by resolution or
13 otherwise its opinion on all matters affecting the interest and welfare of the
14 University and shall have such other functions in addition to the function of
15 electing a member of the Council, as may be provided by Statute or
16 Regulations.

17 *Convocation*

18 5.-(1) Convocation shall consist of-

19 (a) the Officers of the University mentioned in Schedule 1 to this Bill;

20 (b) all teachers within the meaning of this Bill; and

21 (c) all other persons whose names are registered in accordance with
22 paragraph (2) below.

23 (2) A person shall be entitled to have his name registered as a member
24 of convocation if he-

25 (a) is either a graduate of the University or a person satisfying such
26 requirements as may be prescribed for the purposes of this paragraph; and

27 (b) applies for the registration of his name in the prescribed manner
28 and pays the prescribed fee.

29 (3) Regulations shall provide for the establishment and maintenance
30 of a register for the purpose of this paragraph and, subject to paragraph (3)

1 below, may provide for the payment from time to time of further fees by
2 persons whose names are on the register and for the removal from the
3 register of the name of any person who fails to pay those fees.

4 (4) The person responsible for maintaining the register shall,
5 without the payment of any fees, ensure that the names of all persons who
6 are for the time being members of convocation by virtue of paragraph (1) (a)
7 or (b) of this paragraph are entered and retained on the register.

8 (5) A person who reasonably claims that he is entitled to have his
9 name on the register shall be entitled on demand to inspect the register, or a
10 copy of the register at the principal offices of the University at all reasonable
11 times.

12 (6) The register shall, unless the contrary is proved, be sufficient
13 evidence that any person named therein is, and that any person not named
14 therein is not, a member of convocation; but for the purpose of ascertaining
15 whether a particular person was such a member on a particular date, any
16 entries in and deletions from the register made on or after that date shall be
17 disregarded.

18 (7) The quorum of convocation shall be fifty or one-third (or the
19 whole number nearest to one-third) of the total number of members of
20 convocation whichever is less.

21 (8) Subject to section 5 of this Bill, the Chancellor shall be
22 chairman at all meetings of convocation when he is present, and in his
23 absence the Vice Chancellor shall be the chairman at the meeting.

24 (9) Convocation shall have such functions, in addition to the
25 function of appointing a member of the Council, as may be provided by
26 statute.

27 *Organisation of Faculties and Branches Thereof*

28 6. Each Faculty shall be divided into such number of branches as
29 may be prescribed.

30 7.-(1) There shall Be established in respect of each Faculty, a

1 Faculty Board, which, subject to the provisions of this Bill, and subject to the
2 directions of the Vice-Chancellor, shall-

3 (a) regulate the teaching and study of, and the conduct of
4 examinations connected with the subjects assigned to the faculty;

5 (b) deal with other matters assigned to it by Statute, by the Vice-
6 Chancellor or by the Senate; and

7 (c) advise the Vice-Chancellor or Senate on any matter referred to it
8 by the Vice-Chancellor or Senate.

9 (2) Each Faculty Board shall consists of-

10 (a) the Vice-Chancellor;

11 (b) the persons severally in charge of the branches of the faculty;

12 (c) such number of the teachers assigned to the faculty and having the
13 prescribed qualifications as the Board may determine; and

14 (d) such persons whether or not members of the University as the
15 Board may determine with the general or special approval of Senate.

16 (3) The quorum of the Board shall be eight members or one-quarter of
17 the members of the Board for the time being whichever is greater.

18 (4) Subject to the provisions of this statute and to any provision made
19 by regulations in that behalf, the Board may regulate it own procedure.

20 *The Dean of the Faculty*

21 8.-(1) The Dean of a faculty shall be a professor elected by the Faculty
22 Board and such Dean shall hold office for a term of two years. He will be
23 eligible for re-election for another term of two years after which he may not be
24 elected again until two years have elapsed.

25 (2) If there is no professor in a faculty, the Vice-Chancellor shall
26 appoint an Acting Dean who shall not be below the rank of Senior Lecturer for
27 the faculty, who will act for a period of one year in the first instance, renewable
28 for another one year only.

29 (3) In the absence of the Vice-Chancellor, the Dean shall be the
30 chairman at all meetings of the Faculty Board when he is present and he shall be

1 a member of all committees and other boards appointed by the faculty.

2 (4) The Dean of a faculty shall exercise general superintendence
3 over the academic and administrative affairs of the faculty and it shall be the
4 function of the Dean to present to the convocation for the conferment of
5 Degrees, persons who have qualified for the Degrees of the University at
6 examinations held in the branches of learning for which responsibility is
7 allocated to that faculty.

8 (5) There shall be a committee to be known as the Committee of
9 Deans which shall consist of all the Deans of the several faculties and that
10 committee shall advise the Vice-Chancellor on all academic matters and on
11 particular matters referred to the Committee by the Senate.

12 (6) The Dean of a faculty may be removed from office for a good
13 cause by the Faculty Board after a vote would have been taken at a meeting
14 of the Board, and in the event of a vacancy occurring following the removal
15 of the Dean, an Acting Dean may be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor
16 provided that at the next faculty board meeting an election shall be held for a
17 new Dean.

18 (7) In this article, "good cause" has the same meaning as in section
19 17(4) of this Bill.

20 *Selection of certain Principal and other key Officers*

21 9.-(1) When a vacancy occurs in the Office of the Registrar, Bursar,
22 the University Librarian, Director of Works or Director of Health Services, a
23 Selection Board shall be constituted by the Council and shall consist of-

- 24 (i) the Pro-Chancellor;
25 (ii) the Vice-chancellor;
26 (iii) two members appointed by the Council, not being members of
27 Senate; and
28 (iv) two members appointed by the Senate not being members of
29 Council.

30 (2) The Selection Board, after making such inquiries as it thinks fit,

1 shall recommend a candidate to the Council for appointment to the vacant
2 office, and after considering the recommendation of the Board the Council may
3 make an appointment to that office.

4 (3) A person appointed to the office of Director of Works or Director
5 of Health Services shall hold office for such period and on such terms and
6 conditions as may be specified in his letter of appointment.

7 *Creation of Academic Post*

8 10. Recommendation for the creation of posts other than those
9 mentioned in paragraph 9 of this Schedule shall be made by the Senate to the
10 Council through the Finance and General Purposes Committee.

11 *Appointment of Academic Staff*

12 11. Subject to this Act and the Statutes derived from it, the filling of
13 vacancies in academic posts (including newly created ones) shall be as
14 prescribed from time to time by Statutes.

15 *Appointment of Administrative and Technical Staff*

16 12.-(1) The administrative and technical staff of the University, other
17 than those mentioned in paragraph 9 of this schedule shall be appointed by the
18 Council or on its behalf by the Vice-Chancellor or the Registrar in accordance
19 with any delegation of powers made by the Council in that behalf.

20 (2) In the case of administrative or technical staff that has close and
21 important contacts with the academic staff, there shall be Senate participation
22 in the process of selection.

EXPLANATION NOTE

This Bill seeks to establish the Federal University of Agriculture, Araromi-Owu, Osun State as institute to offer full-time courses leading to the awards of Bachelor of Science Degrees in Agriculture, Diplomas etc.
