AN ACT TO ESTABLISH FEDERAL UNIVERSITY OF AGRICULTURE ARAROMI-OWU, OSUN STATE TO MAKE COMPREHENSIVE PROVISIONS FOR ITS DUE MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

Sponsored by Hon. Ayo Omidiran Γ Commencement ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: 1 1.-(1) There is established the Federal University of Agriculture Establishment and Objects of 2 (Herein after referred to as "the University"). Federal University of Agriculture Araromi-Owu, 3 (2) The University shall be a body corporate with perpetual Osun State succession and common seal and shall take power to acquire and dispose of 4 5 interest in movable and immovable properties. 6 (3) The University may sue and be sued in its corporate name. 7 2.-(1) The objects of the University shall be to-Objects of the University 8 (a) encourage the advancement of learning and to hold out to all 9 persons without distinction of race, creed, sex or political conviction the 10 opportunity of acquiring a higher education in Agriculture; 11 (b) to develop and offer academic and professional programmes 12 leading to with emphasis on planning, adaptive, technical, maintenance, 13 developmental and productive skills in the engineering, scientific, and allied professional disciplines relating to Sports resources with the aim of 14 15 producing socially mature men and women with capability not only to 16 understand, use and adapt existing technologies in the Agriculture, but also 17 to improve on them and develop new ones; 18 (c) to act as agents and catalysts, through post-graduate training, 19 research and innovation for the effective and economic utilization,

exploitation and conservation of the country's Agriculture resources;

(d) to offer to the general population particularly in the area

15	buildings or things necessary, suitable or convenient for any of the objects of
16	the University,
17	(l) hold public lectures and undertake printing, publishing and book
18	selling;
19	(m) subject to any limitations or conditions imposed by Statute, to
20	invest any moneys appertaining to the University by law of endorsement,
21	whether for general or special purposes, and such other moneys as may not be
22	immediately required for current expenditure, in any investments or securities
23	or in the purchase or improvement of land, with power from time to time to vary
24	any such investments and to deposit any moneys for the time being un-invested
25	with any bank on deposit or current account;
26	(n) borrow, whether on interest or not, and if need be, upon the
27	security of any or all of the property movable or immovable of the University,
28	such moneys as the Council may from time to time in its discretion find
29	necessary or expedient to borrow or to guarantee any loan, advances or credit

facilities;

(g) two persons appointed by the congregation from among its

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members:

(h) one persons appointed by Convocation from among its members.

(2) Persons to be appointed to the Council shall be persons of proven 2 integrity, knowledgeable and familiar with the affairs and tradition of the 3 University. 4 7.-(1) Subject to the provisions of this Bill relating to the Visitor, the 5 Functions of the Council and its Council shall be the Governing Body of the University and shall be charged Finance General 6 Purpose with the general control and superintendence of the policy, finances and 7 property of the University, including its public relations. 8 (2) There shall be a committee of the Council to be known as the 9 Finance and General Purposes Committee, which shall, subject to the 10 directions of the Council, exercise control over the property and expenditure of 11 the Council as the Council may from time to time delegate to it. 12 (3) Provision shall be made by Statute with respect to the constitution 13 of the Finance and General Purposes Committee. 14 (4) The Council shall ensure proper accounts of the University are 15 kept and that the accounts of the University are audited annually by auditors 16 appointed by the Council from the list and in accordance with guidelines 17 supplied by the Auditor-General of the Federation, and that an annual report is 18 published by the University together with certified copies of the said accounts 19 20 as audited. (5) Subject to this Bill and the Statutes, the Council and the Finance 21 and General Purposes Committee may each make rules for the purpose of 22 exercising any of their respective functions or of regulating their own 23 procedure. 24 (6) Rules made under subsection (5) of this section by the Finance and 25 General Purposes Committee shall not come into force unless approved by the 26 Council, and where any rule so made by the Committee conflict with any 27 directions given by the Council (whether before or after the coming into force 28 of the rules in question), the direction of the Council shall prevail. 29 (7) There shall be paid to the members of the Council, the Finance and 30

Functions of the Senate

8.-(1) Subject to section 5 of this Bill and subsections (3) and (4) of this section and to the provisions of this Bill relating to the Visitor, it shall be the general function of the Senate to organize and control teaching in the University, admission to Postgraduate courses and other admission of students, the discipline of students and to promote research in the University.

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- (2) Without prejudice to the generality of the provisions of subsection (I) of this section, it shall in particular be the function of the Senate to make provision for the -
- (a) establishment, organization and control of campuses, colleges, faculties, departments, schools, institutes and other teaching and research units of the University, and the allocation of responsibility for different branches of learning;
- (b) organization and control of courses of study in the University and of the examinations held in conjunction with those courses, including

1	the appointment of examiners, both internal and external,
2	(c) award of degrees, and such other qualifications as may be
3	prescribed, in connection with examinations conducted by the University;
4	(d) making of recommendations to the Council with respect to the
5	award to any person of an honorary fellowship or honorary degree or the title of
6	professor emeritus;
7	(e) establishment, organization and control of halls of residence and
8	similar institutions in the University;
9	(f) supervision of the welfare of students in the University and the
10	regulation of their conduct;
11	(g) granting of fellowships, scholarships, prizes and similar awards in
12	so far as the awards are within the control of the University; and
13	(h) determination of what description of dress shall be academic dress
14	for the purposes of the University, and regulating the use of academic dress.
15	(3) The Senate shall not establish any new campus, college, faculty,
16	department, school, institute or other teaching and research units of the
17	University, or any hall of residence or similar institution at the University
18	without the approval of the Council.
19	(4) (a) Subject to this Bill and the Statutes, the Senate may make
20	regulations for the purpose of exercising any function conferred on it either by
21	the provisions of this section or for the purpose of providing for any matter for
22	which provision by regulation is authorized or required by this Actor by
23	Statute;
24	(b) The Senate shall, by regulation, provide that at least one of the
25	persons appointed as examiners at each final or professional examination held
26	in conjunction with any course of study in the University is not a teacher at the
27	University but is a teacher at the branch of learning to which the course relates
28	in some other university of high repute.
20	(5) Subject to a right of appeal to the Council from a decision of the

Senate under this subsection, the Senate may deprive any person of any degree,

23	appointment may be terminated by Council for a good cause and for the
24	purposes of this subsection "good cause" means-
25	(a) conviction for any offence which the Council considers to be
26	such as to render the person concerned unfit for the discharge of the
27	functions of his office;
28	(b) any physical or mental incapacity which the Council, after
29	obtaining medical advice, considers to be such as to render the person
30	concerned unfit to continue to hold office;

1	(c) conduct of a scandalous or disgraceful nature which the Council
2	considers to be such as to render the person concerned unfit to continue to hold
3	office; or
4	(d) conduct which the Council considers to be such as to constitute
5	failure or inability of the person concerned to discharge the functions of his
6	office or to comply with the terms and conditions of his service.
7	(5) Any person suspended pursuant to subsection (3) of this section
8	shall be on half pay and the Council shall before the expiration of a period of
9	three months from the date of such suspension consider the case against that
10	person and come to a decision as to whether to-
11	(a) continue such person's suspension and if so on what terms
12	(including the proportion of his emoluments to be paid to him);
13	(b) reinstate such person in which case the Council shall restore his
14	full emoluments with effect from the date of suspension;
15	(c) terminate the appointment of the person concerned in which case
16	such a person will not be entitled to the proportion of his emoluments withheld
17	during the period of suspension; or
18	(d) take such lesser disciplinary action against such person (including
19	the restoration of such proportion of his emoluments that might have been
20	withheld) as the Council may determine.
21	(6) Where the Council, pursuant to this section, decides to continue a
22	person's suspension or decides to take further disciplinary action against the
23	person, the Council shall, before the expiration of three months from such
24	decision come to a final determination in respect of the case concerning such a
25	person.
26	(7) It shall be the duty of the person by whom an instrument of
27	removal is signed in pursuance of subsection (1) above to use his best endeavors
28	to cause a copy of the instrument to be served as soon as reasonably practicable
29	on the person to whom it relates.
30	(8) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this section shall prevent

1	the Council from making regulations for the discipline of staff and workers

18	19(1) Subject to the provisions of this section, where it appears to	Discipline of Students
19	the Vice-Chancellor that any student is guilty of misconduct, the Vice-	Otticins

21	conferred on him by Statute or regulations, direct that the-

10	the appeal is pending.
11	(5) The Vice-Chancellor may delegate his powers under this section
12	to a disciplinary board consisting of such members of the University as he may
13	nominate.
14	(6) Nothing in this section shall be construed as preventing the
15	restriction or termination of a student's activities at the University for conduct
16	which in the opinion of Senate is prejudicial to the interest of the University or
17	to its corporate objective or image.
18	(7) A direction under subsection (1) (a) of this section may be
19	combined with a direction under subsection (1) (b) of this section.
20	20(1) No person shall be required to satisfy requirements as to any of
21	the following matters, that is to say, race (including ethnic grouping) sex, place
22	of birth, family origin, religious or political persuasion, as a condition for
23	becoming or continuing to be a-
24	(a) student in the University;
25	(b) Holder of any degree, appointment or employment in the
26	University; or
27	(c) member of anybody established by virtue of this Bill.
28	(2) No person shall be subjected to any disadvantage or accorded any
29	advantage in relation to the University by reference to any of the matters
30	referred to in subsection (1) of this section.

Exclusion or discrimination on account of race, religion, etc.

1	(3) Nothing in subsection (I) of this section shall be construed as	
2	preventing the University from imposing any disability or restriction on any	
3	of the persons specified in subsection (I) of this section where such persons	
4	willfully refuse or fail on grounds of religious belief to undertake any duty	
5	generally and uniformly imposed on all such persons or any group of them	
5	which duty, having regard to its nature and the special circumstances, is in	
7	the opinion of the University reasonably justifiable in the national interest.	
8	21(1) For the purpose of the Land Use Act (which provides for the	Transfer of Land to the University
9	compulsory acquisition of land for public purposes) any purpose of the	to the Oliversity

9	pursuant to this Bill shall not be affected by-
10	(5) Any member of any such body who has a personal interest in
11	any matter proposed to be considered by that body shall disclose his interest
12	to the body and shall not vote on any question relating to that matter.
13	(6) Nothing in section 12 of the Interpretation Bill (which provides
14	for the application, in relation to subordinate legislation, of certain
15	incidental provisions) shall apply to Statutes or Regulations made pursuant
16	to this Bill.
17	(7) The power conferred by this Bill on anybody to make Statute or
18	Regulations shall include power to revoke or vary any-
19	(a) Statute (including the Statute contained in the Third Schedule to
20	this Bill; or
21	(b) regulation by a subsequent Statute or Regulation as the case
22	may be; Provided that the Statutes and Regulations may have different
23	provisions in relation to different circumstances.
24	(8) No stamp or other duty shall be payable in respect of any
25	transfer of Property to the University by virtue of sections 10, 21 and the
26	Second Schedule to this Bill.
27	(9) Any notice or other instrument authorized to be served by virtue
28	of this Bill may, without prejudice to any other mode of service, be served by
29	post.
