FOR

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE NATIONAL INDEPENDENT EXAMINATION APPEAL COMMISSION, RESPONSIBLE FOR REMARKING OF EXAMINATION SCRIPTS OF STUDENTS WHO ARE VICTIMS OF UNFAIR TREATMENT AND OTHER UNWHOLESOME ACTS IN THE MARKING OF EXAMINATION SCRIPTS ATALL LEVELS OF STUDY; AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

Commencement ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: 1 1.-(1) There is established a Commission to be known as the Establishment of the Commission National Independent Examination Appeal Commission charged with the 2 3 responsibility of remarking examination scripts of students who are victims 4 of unfair treatment and other unwholesome acts in the marking of 5 examination scripts at all levels of study in Nigeria (in this Bill referred to as 6 "the Commission"). 7 (2) The Commission: 8 (a) Shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession, Capable of 9 suing and being sued in its corporate name; 10 (b) Shall have a seal which shall be kept in such manner as the 11 Governing Council may direct; and 12 (c) May acquire, hold, develop and dispose of moveable or 13 immovable property. 14 (3) The provisions of the first schedule shall have effect with 15 respect to it supplementary provisions. 16 2.-(1) There shall be for the Commission a Governing Council (in The Governing Council 17 this Act referred to as "the Council") that shall be appointed by the President 18 subject to confirmation by the National Assembly.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to solve the problem of failing brilliant students in examinations because of non-compliance of sexual demands, demand for gratifications, non-payment for hand notes and religious sentiments by teachers and lecturers at all levels of study and to prescribe befitting punishment for the culprits.
