## A BILL

## FOR

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR STATUTORY REGULATION OF PEACE KEEPING OPERATIONS BY MEMBERS OF THE NIGERIAN ARMED FORCES, THE NIGERIAN POLICE, THE NIGERIA SECURITY AND CIVIL DEFENCE CORPS AND OTHER SECURITY ORGANIZATIONS AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

Peace Keeping as Missions

BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows:

PART I - SCOPE OF APPLICATION

1.-(1) Any Member of the Nigerian Armed Forces or the Nigerian Police may participate in military crisis management and peace support (hereinafter peacekeeping activities) based on a decision by the United Nations (UN) or the African Union (AU) of the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) or the two third majority decision of both Houses of the National Assembly that aims at preserving international or regional peace and security or protecting the execution of humanitarian aid and the civilian population.

(2) This Bill shall apply, as applicable, to the participation of Any Member of the Nigerian Armed Forces or Nigerian Police or the Nigeria Security and Civil Defence Corps (also referred to as Civil Defence) in the execution of humanitarian aid or protection of same on request by a special organization or agency of the UN or AU or ECOWAS. This Act shall not apply to participation in coercive military measures governed by articles 42 and 51 of the Charter of the UN.

(3) Subject to approval of the two third majority of both Houses of the National Assembly, the President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria shall decide on Nigeria's participation in peacekeeping activities and on the

termination of participation. 1 (4) Before introducing a proposal to the National Assembly to deploy 2 a peacekeeping force, the President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria shall 3 consult the Foreign Affairs Committee of both Houses of the National 4 Assembly and where major changes are planned in the tasks of the 5 peacekeeping force. 6 (5) If the rules of engagement of the peacekeeping force are planned 7 to be wider than in traditional peacekeeping, the President must consult and 8 secure the consent of the Foreign Affairs Committees and the Defence 9 Committees of both Houses of the National Assembly. 10 (6) The Ministry of Defence may decide upon minor increases or 11 decreases in the peacekeeping activity but any troop increase above one -12 quarter of the original troop deployment levels shall require the simple 13 majority consent of both Houses of the National Assembly. 14 2.-(1) A Nigerian Peace Keeping Mission may consist of 15 Organization, Chain of Command, peacekeeping forces, separate units, military observers and individuals. Internal Order 16 and Authority (2) Operationally, the Peace Keeping Mission shall fall within the 17 authority of the arm of the Nigerian Armed Forces or a Department of the 18 Nigerian Police or a Department of the Civil Defence responsible for the 19 peacekeeping operation, and under the purview of the Ministry of Defence. 20 (3) In the practical execution of peacekeeping activities, the Peace 21 Keeping Mission shall form part of the Armed Forces or the Nigerian Police of 22 the Civil Defence (as the case may be) and shall be subordinate to the command 23 of the arm of the Nigerian Armed Forces or a Department of the Nigerian Police 24 or a Department of the Civil Defence responsible for the peacekeeping operation, and under the general purview of the Ministry of Defence. (4) In the case of a Peace Keeping Operation involving the Nigerian Armed Forces, the Ministry of Defence shall confirm the strength and the type of unit and the administrational position and authority of the elements of the

Peace Keeping Mission.

If the injured party has himself/herself contributed to the damage, 25 Compensation and contribution to cause of or if any circumstance unrelated to the incident causing the damage also 26 injury contributed to the damage, the said compensation may be reduced or the right 27 to compensation revoked. Also, any other compensation that the injured party 28 -29 may be entitled to under another act or under a voluntary insurance policy may be deducted from the said compensation.
