AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NIGERIA INFORMAL SECTOR AFFAIRS COMMISSION TO COORDINATE, MONITOR AND MANAGE THE INFORMAL SECTOR OF NIGERIA; ADDRESS THE NEEDS OF INFORMAL SECTOR ACTORS IN NIGERIA AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

Commencement BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: 1 1.-(1) There is established a body to be known as the Nigeria Establishment of the Nigeria 2 Informal Sector Affairs Commission (in this Act referred to as "the Informal Sector Affairs Commission 3 Commission").
