10	Commission may make standing orders regulating its proceedings or those of

13	if he is absent, the members present at the meeting shall appoint one of them to
14	preside at the meeting.
15	(3) The quorum for the meeting of the Board of the Commission shall
16	be 5 members.
17	(4) Where the Commission desires to obtain the advice of any person
18	on a particular matter, the Commission may co-opt him as a member for such
19	period as it thinks fit; but a person who is a member by virtue of this paragraph
20	shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Commission and shall not
21	count towards a quorum.

23	2(1) The Commission may appoint one or more standing or ad-hoc
24	Committees to carry out on its behalf such of its functions as it may determine.
25	(2) A committee appointed under this paragraph shall consist of such
26	number of persons (not necessarily members of the Commission) as may be
27	determined by the Commission; and a person other than a member of the
28	Commission shall hold office on the Committee in accordance with the terms
29	of his appointment.
30	(3) A decision of a Committee of the Commission shall be of no effect

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- until it is confirmed by the Board.
- (4) The quorum of a meeting of the committee of the Commission shall be as determined by the Board.
 - (5) The Chairman shall have casting vote.
 - 3. Any member of the Commission and any person holding office on a committee of the Commission who has a personal interest in any contract or arrangement entered into or proposed to be considered by the Commission or a committee thereof shall forthwith disclose his interest to the Commission and shall not vote on any question relating to the contract or arrangement.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to establish Nigerians in Diaspora (Establishment) Commission, provide for the engagement of Nigerians in Diaspora in the policies, projects and participation in the development of Nigeria and for the purpose of utilising the human, capital and material resources of Nigerians in Diaspora towards the overall socio-economic, cultural and political development of Nigeria.
