AN ACT TO AMEND THE ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH OFFICERS (REGISTRATION, ETC.) ACT 2002, AND FOR OTHER RELATED MATTERS 2015

Sponsored by Hon. Gideon Gwani BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: 1. The Environmental Health Officers (Registration, etc.) Act, 2002 (in this Act Referred to as the "Principal Act") is hereby amended as set out in this Act-3 2. Section 1 of the Principal Act is amended as follows: 4 Amendment of sction 1 (1) There is established a body to be known as the Environmental Health Council of Nigeria (in this Act referred to as "the Council")-6 (a) accordingly any reference in the Act to the Environmental Health Officers Registration Council of Nigeria shall be construed as the 8 Environmental Health Council of Nigeria; 9 (b) the re-designation of the enactment specified in section (1) of 10 this section shall not affect anything done or purported to be done under the 11 designated enactment. 12 (2) The Council-13 (a) shall be a Council for Environmental Health, based on rules and 14 regulations made by the Minister; 15 (b) shall be a body-corporate with perpetual succession and a 16 17 common seal; (c) may sue or be sued in its name; and 18 (d) may acquire, hold or dispose of any property, movable or 19 Immovable for the purpose of carrying out its functions under this Act. 20

1	time as the Council considers desirable for the effective practice o

3	(d) charging practicing fees as may be determined by the Council;
4	(e) regulating and controlling the practice of Environmental Health
5	profession in all its aspects and ramifications, including corporate practice
6	areas as Waste collection and disposal; public health pest control; cleaning
7	services; air quality monitoring; sanitary inspection of premises; health impac
8	assessment etc.
9	(f) conducting examinations in the profession and awarding
0	certificates or diplomas to successful candidates as appropriate and for such
1	purpose and the Council shall prescribe fees to be paid in respect thereof;
2	(g) set Environmental health standard and work with other
3	stakeholders to ensure the enforcement and compliance with standards
4	legislation and guidelines on Environmental health infrastructure provision
5	and implementation;
6	(h) establish and supervise the National Institute of Environmenta
7	Health for the purposes of advanced professional education for members of the
8	profession;
9	(i) carry out research and publish general scientific and other data
