BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows:

There is hereby established a Fund to be known as the Establishment of the Fund Police Procurement Fund (in this Act referred to as "the Fund") into which shall be paid-(a) such sums being one percent deduction of monthly revenue allocations due to the Federal, State and Local governments; (b) any other sums, from time to time, freely donated by other 6 governments, international bodies, non-governmental organizations, private sector or accruing to the Government and; 8 (c) such sums as may be provided for the purpose of equipping the police by the Federal Government. 10 2.
