11	this Bill.
12	(5) A person shall not be entitled to be appointed or engaged to head
13	any physiotherapy unit or department of any organization unless he is-
14	(a) duly registered as a member of the College; or
15	(b) qualified by examination.
16	(6) The Council may approve qualification for the purpose of this Bill
17	if the-
18	(a) course of training of any approved Institution which is intended
19	for persons who are seeking to become or are already physiotherapist and
20	which the Council considers relevant to confer on applicant sufficient
21	knowledge and skill for admission into the College; and
22	(b) qualification which, as a result of an examination taken in
23	conjunction with a course of training approved by the Council under this Bill is
24	granted to candidates reaching a specific standard at the examination
25	indicating in the opinion of the members of the Council that the candidates
26	have sufficient knowledge and skill to practice as a professional
27	physiotherapist.

10	A person shall be accorded with the status of a member by the Council and to be
11	enrolled as-

14	down by the Council for these purposes;
15	(b) Physiotherapists whose published work or whose attainments in
16	physiotherapy shall in the opinion of the Council justify admission to
17	Fellowship either without examination (by election) or subject only to limited
18	examination pursuant to the Bye-laws.
19	(2) Foundation Fellows of the College-
20	These are persons who were elected Fellows in accordance with sub-clause
21	(1)(b) above on or before the first Examination.
22	(3) Honorary Fellows of the College-
23	(a) Physiotherapists who have made notable contributions to
24	physiotherapy and are renown in their areas of physiotherapy practice. There
25	shall not be more than a specified number of Honorary Fellows at any one time
26	as determined by Council.
27	(b) Individuals who are not Physiotherapists but have made notable
28	contributions to physiotherapy. There shall not be more than a specified
29	number of Honorary Fellows at any one time as determined by Council.
0	(4) Distinguished Fellows of the College-

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Fellows of the College who have distinguished themselves in their various
specialties and have contributed immensely to the development of the
College and the Country.
(5) Life Fellows of the College-

- These are Fellows in accordance with sub-clause (2) above who have been in good standing for at least 5 years as Fellows and in addition meet the financial prescription for Life Fellowship.
 - (6) Associate Fellows of the College-
 - (a) Associate Fellows by Examination consists of Trainees who have passed the primary examinations of any of the Faculties and have been in an accredited training post for not less than 6 months
 - (b) Associate Fellows by Exemption These are physiotherapists with qualifications assessed to be equivalent to Part I Examination of the College Fellowship following recommendation of the Faculty concerned and approval by the Council.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to establish National Postgraduate College of Physiotherapy to be charged with the responsibility of promoting professional physiotherapy education, providing specialist in physiotherapy with critical thinking and creative problem solving skills, and prepare knowledgeable, skilled, culturally competent, compassionate and reflective physiotherapy practitioners in the study and practice of physiotherapy in Nigeria.
