	26	SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISION RELATING TO THE BOARD, ETC.
	27	1(1) At any meeting of the Board, the Chairman shall preside and in
	28	his/her absence, such member of the Board as the other members may elect
	29	from among themselves for that purpose.
	30	(2) The Director-General shall be the Secretary; and shall provide

1	secretariat services for all meetings of the Governing Board.
2	(3) Subject to this Bill and section 27 of the Interpretation Act, the
3	Board may make standing orders regulating its proceeding or those of any of
4	its Committees.
5	2. The Quorum of the Board shall be the Chairman and 3 other
6	members of the Board.
7	3. The Board may appoint one or more Committees to carry out, on
8	behalf of the Board, such of its functions as the Board may determine, but no
9	decision of any such Committee shall have effect unless ratified by the
10	Board.
11	4. The Board may co-opt persons who are not members of the
12	Board to any meeting of the Board or any Committee and such persons may
13	take part in the deliberations of the Board or any Committee but shall not be
14	entitled to vote.
15	5. The fixing of the seal of office shall be authenticated by the
16	Signature of the Chairman or any other member of the Board generally or,
17	specifically authorized by the Board to act for that purpose and the Director-
18	General-
19	(a) a document purporting to be a document duly executed under
20	the seal of the Office shall be received in evidence and shall, unless and until
21	the contrary is proved, be presumed so executed.
22	6. The validity of any proceedings of the Board or a Committee
23	shall not be adversely affected by-
24	(a) the validity in the membership of the Board or Committee;
25	(b) a defect in the appointment of a member of the Board or
26	Committee; or
27	(c) reason that a person not entitled to do so, took part in the
28	proceeding of the Board or Committee.
