	23	Proceedings of the commission
	24	1. Subject to the Bill and section 27 of the interpretation Act, the
	25	commission shall have power to regulate its proceedings and may make
	<b>26</b>	standing rules with respect to the holding of its meetings, and those of its
	27	committees notices to be given, the keeping of minutes of its proceedings the
	28	custody and production for inspection of such minutes and such other matters
	29	as the commission may, from time determine.
	30	2. There shall be at least four ordinary meetings of the commission in

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- every calendar year and subject thereto, the commission shall meet whenever it is convened by the chairman, and if the chairman is requested to do so by notices given to him by not less than four other members, he shall convene a meeting of the commission to be held within 14 days from the date on which the notice was given.
- 3. Every meeting of the commission shall be presided over by the chairman and if the chairman is unable to attend a particular meeting, the members present at the meeting shall elect one of them to preside at the meeting.
- 4. The quorum of any meeting of the commission shall consist of the chairman (or in an appropriate case, the person presiding at the meeting pursuant to paragraph 2 of this schedule) and four other members, except that any quorum must include at least three members outside the service.
- 5. A question put before the commission at a meeting shall be decided by consensus and where this is not possible, by a majority of the votes of the members present and voting.
- 6. The chairman shall, in the case of an equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his deliberative vote.
- 7. Where the commission seeks the advice of any person on a particular matter, the board may invite that person to attend for the such period as it deems fit, but a person who is so invited by virtue of this paragraph shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the commission and shall not count towards the quorum.

## EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The Bill seeks to establish the Complementary and Alternative Medicine (Establishment and Development) commission with the responsibility to promote, encourage and co-ordinate the practice of traditional medicine in Nigeria.
