	BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal

Schedule (3) The supplementary provision set out in the schedule to this act 9 shall have effect with respect the proceedings of the board and the other matters 10 contain therein. 2. The Chairman and other member of the board, other than ex-officio Tenure of office etc. 13 members: (a) Shall hold office for a period of four (4) years on such terms and 14 conditions as contained in their letters of appointment; and 15 (b) May be re-appointed for one further period of four (4) years and no 16 more. 27	Agencies to ensure that the wide range of activities are centrally planned,	
28	coordinated and complement one another so that the objectives of policy	
29	continuity and sustainability are achieved;	
30	(b) To ensure the economic and empowered independence of all	

Nigerians through being employable, self-employment and better sustainable family livelihood and to provide support in form of grant to skills acquisition and Training, and to fund agencies or programmes of government geared towards Skills Acquisition and Development, Poverty Alleviation, and employment generation; (c) To coordinate, monitor and oversee poverty eradication by various 6 organizations operating in Nigeria; (d) Define the enabling policy options required in order to implement a national poverty eradication programme; 9 (e) Develop strategies and sectoral policies and assist the key sector 10 ministries responsible for basic economic and social services to define and 11 implement their own poverty reduction targets; (f) Conduct strategic discussions with plan partners and 13 implementing national agencies; 14 (g) Conduct and finance a national public relations and media 15 campaign against poverty; 16 (h) Finance and direct poverty reduction actions in the rural and urban areas and the selection of priority geographical and sector targets for poverty 18 reduction; (i) Encourage citizens, communities, voluntary organizations and the 20 business community to mobilize resources against poverty; 21 22 (j) Mobilize financial resources and manage the financing of direct poverty reduction action in the rural and urban areas in consultation with states; 23 (k) Undertake demonstration poverty reduction operations in various 24 states and set standards on poverty reduction dissemination within government 25 ministries and other national agencies; 26 (1) Initiate poverty forum at national, state and local government 27 levels to monitor plan implementation and promote coordination; 28 (m) To perform such other functions as may be necessary to 29

effectively and efficiently carry out the provisions of this Act.

SCHEDULE Section 1 (6) SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE GOVERNING BOARD. Proceedings of the Board. 6 1.-(1) Subject to this act and section 27 of the interpretation Act, the Commission may make standing orders regulating its proceeding or those of any its Committees. 9 10 (2) The quorum of the commission shall be five members and the quorum of any Committee of the Commission shall be determined by the Commission. 12 13 2.-(1) The commission shall meet not less than four times in each year and subject thereto, the Commission shall meet whenever it is summoned by 14 the Chairman; and if the chairman is required to do so by notice given to him by 15 not less than three other members, he shall summon a meeting of the Commission be held within fourteen days from the date on which the notice is 18 given. (2) At any meeting of the Commission, the Chairman shall preside but 19 if he is absent, the members present at the meeting shall appoint one of their 20 members to preside at that meeting. 21 (3) Where the Commission desires to obtain the advice of any person 22 on a particular matter, the Commission may co-opt such a person for a period as 23 it thinks fit; but a person who is attendance by virtue of this sub-paragraph shall 24 not count towards a quorum. 25 26 3.-(1) The Commission may appoint one or more Committees to carry out, on behalf of the Commission, such of its functions as the Commission may 28 determine. (3) A decision of a Committee of the Commission shall be of no effect until it is confirmed by the Commission. Miscellaneous 4.-(1) The fixing of the seal of the Commission shall be 6 authenticated by the signature of the Chairman, the Director General, or of any other person authorized generally or specifically to act for that purpose 8 by the Commission. 9 (2) Any contract or instruction which, if made or executed by a 10 person not being a body corporate, would not require to be under seal may be 11 made or executed on behalf of the Commission by the Chairman, Director 12 General, or any person generally or specially authorized to act for that 13 purpose by the Commission. 14 (3) Any document purporting to be a document duly executed 15 under the seal of the Commission, shall be received in evidence and shall, 16 17 unless and until the contrary is proved, be presumed to be so executed. 5. The validity of any proceeding of the Commission or of a 18 Committee thereof shall not be adversely affected by any vacancy in the 19 membership of the Commission or Committee, or by ay defect in the 20 appointment of a member of the Commission, or of a Committee, or by 21 reason that a person not entitled to do so took art in the proceedings of the

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The bill seeks to establish the National Poverty Alleviation and Eradication Commission for the purposes of focusing on the provision of strategies for the eradication of absolute poverty in Nigeria and to coordinate the povertyreduction related activities of all the relevant Ministries, Parastatals and Agencies to ensure that the wide range of activities are centrally planned, coordinated and complement one another so that the objectives of policy continuity and sustainability are achieved.

The bill also seeks to replace NAPEP with the commission.
