EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This bill seeks to amend the Terrorism Act 2011 for the purpose of applying stringent prison terms for Terrorist offences; removing ambiguities in the relevant clauses and getting the act to conform to the stack realities of fighting terrorism in this age and time.
