	20	1. Subject to this Act and Section 27 of the I terpretation Act the
	21	Commission may make standing orders regulating its proceedings or those of

	23	2. Every meeting of the Commission shall be presided over by the
	24	Chairman or if the Chairman is unable to attend a particular meeting, the
	25	members present at the meeting shall elect one of their numbers to preside at

	27	3. The quorum at a meeting of the Commission shall consist of the
	28	Chairman (or, in an appropriate case, the person presiding at the meeting

Committees

- 5.-(1) Subject to its standing orders, the Commission may appoint such number of standing and ad-hoc Committees as it thinks fit to consider and report on any matter with which the Commission is concerned.
- (2) Every Committee appointed under the provisions of subparagraph (1) of this paragraph, shall be presided over by a member of the Commission and shall be made up of such number of persons, not necessarily members of the Commission, as the Commission may determine in each cases.
- 6. The decision of a Committee shall be of no effect until it is confirmed by the Commission.

Miscellaneous

- 7. The fixing of the seal of the Commission shall be authenticated by the signature of the Chairman and of the Executive Secretary of the Commission or such other member authorized generally or specially by the Commission to act for that purpose
- 8. Any contract or instrument which, if made by a person not being a body corporate, would not be required to be under seal, may be made or executed on behalf of the Commission by the Chairman or by any other person generally or specifically authorized by the Commission to act for that purpose.
- 9. Any document purporting to be a contract, instrument or other document signed or sealed on behalf of the Commission shall be received in evidence and, unless the contrary is proved, be presumed, without further proof, to have been so signed or sealed.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to provide for among other things the establishment of the National Commission for Peace, Reconciliation and Mediation (NCPRM); to identify conflicts; and for the supervision, coordination and monitoring of all peaceful resolutions between governments, organisations, etc. in Nigeria and for Matters Incidental Thereto.
