AN ACT TO REPEAL THE NATIONAL AGRICULTURAL SEEDS ACT CAP. N5
LFN 2004 AND ENACT THE NATIONAL AGRICULTURAL SEEDS COUNCIL
2016 AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

Sponsored by Hon. Munir Dan Agundi BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows-PART 1- ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NATIONAL AGRICULTURAL SEEDS COUNCIL AND GOVERNING BOARD 1.-(1) There is established a body to be known as the National Establishment of the Agricultural **Seeds Council** Agricultural Seeds Council (in this Bill referred to as the "Council"). 4 The Council shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common seal and may-6 (a) acquire, hold or dispose of real and personal property; (b) sue or be sued in its corporate name. 8 2.-(1) There is hereby established for the management of the Establishment of the Governing Governing Board (in this Bill referred to as "the Board"). Board 10 11 (2) The Board shall consist of a Chairman and the following 12 members-(a) two persons to be nominated by the Seeds Association of 13 14 Nigeria; 15 (b) the Director of the Federal Department of Agriculture; 16 (c) one representative of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry 17 not below the rank of a Director; 18 (d) one person with relevant qualifications and cognate experience in crop breeding technology to represent Agricultural Research Council of 19 20 Nigeria; 21 (e) one person with relevant qualifications and cognate experience

1	in Crop Breeding Technology to represent the Universities of Agriculture;
2	(f) one person representing the National Food Reserve Agency;
3	(g) one representative of the Agricultural Development Fund;
4	(h) one person representing Nigerian Chamber of Commerce
5	Industries, Mines and Agriculture;
6	(i) two persons from the Apex Farmers Association of Nigeria, one
7	each representing the Large Scale Farmers and the Small Scale Farmers
8	groups;
9	(j) the Director General of the National Agricultural Seeds Council.
10	(3) The Chairman and other members shall possess sufficient
11	qualifications and experience in the Seed industry and shall be appointed by the
12	President upon the recommendation of the Minister.
13	(4) The Chairman and members shall hold office for a term.
14	(5) A member of the Board shall be paid such allowances as the
15	Federal Government may from time to time direct.
16	(6) The Chairman or member may at any time be removed from office
17	by the President for inability to discharge the functions of his office whether
18	arising from infirmity of the mind or body or for any fraudulent act or
19	misconduct.
20	(7) (i) The Chairman or member may resign by a notice addressed
21	through the Minister to the President;
22	(ii)The notice of resignation shall become effective from the date of
23	acceptance of the resignation by the President.
24	(8) Upon the occurrence of any vacancy in the membership of the
25	Board, the Chairman shall immediately communicate this fact to the Minister
26	who shall ensure the vacancy is filled as contained in this section.
27	(9) The office of the Chairman or member shall become vacant if-
28	(a) he dies;
29	(b) he becomes insane or he is suffering from any permanent
30	disability;

1	(c) he is an undischarged bankrupt; or	
2	(d) he is convicted of the commission of a crime relating to fraud or	
3	gross misconduct.	
4	(10) Without prejudice to the provisions of the Bill, where a	
5	majority of the members of the Board are satisfied that the continued	
6	presence on the Board of the Chairman or a member is not in the national	
7	interest or the interest of the Council, the Board may recommend through	
8	the Minister to the President for the removal of such Chairman or member.	
9	(11) No decision of the Board shall be invalidated solely on the	
10	reason that there exists a vacancy the number of members.	
11	(12) In the absence of a duly constituted Board for the Council, the	
12	Director-General of the Council shall, with the approval of the Minister	
13	carry out such functions of the Board as may be required.	
14	(13) The supplementary provisions set out in the schedule of this	
15	Bill shall have effect with respect to the proceedings of the Board and the	
16	other matters specified therein.	
17	3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Bill, the	Dissolution
18	Minister shall exercise all the powers of the Board where-	
19	(a) the Board has not been constituted;	
20	(b) the Board has been dissolved; and	
21	(c) any action taken or decision reached in compliance with the	
22	provisions of this section shall be valid for all intent and purpose.	
23	PART II - FUNCTIONS OF THE COUNCIL

30	(b) design improved management system and procedure relating	

Powers of the

1	to the administration of seed activity;
2	(c) advise the Federal Government on the organization, management
3	and financing of seed programmes;
4	(d) analyse the market and prices of seeds;
5	(e) advise the national research system on the changing pattern of
6	seed demand and farmers needs;
7	(f) plan, monitor and evaluate the achievements of the national seed
8	system and recommend improvement thereto;
9	(g) encourage the establishment in Nigeria of seed companies for the
10	purpose of carrying out research, production, processing and marketing of
11	seeds;
12	(h) regulate the Seed Industry in Nigeria; and
13	(i) perform such other related functions as may be required of the
14	Council, from time to time subject to the approval of the Minister.
15	(2) From the commencement of the Bill, every company incorporated
16	in Nigeria for the purposes specified in paragraph (g) of section 4 of this Bill,
17	shall enjoy such incentives as are granted by the Federal Government to an
18	agricultural and seed enterprises.
19	(3) The Crop Variety Registration and Release Committee shall have
20	responsibility for making recommendations to the Council on matters relating
21	to-
22	(a) the registration and release of any given crop variety;
23	(b) the declaration of a crop variety as a notified kind and for the
24	purposes of the Bill, different kinds or varieties of seed may be notified for
25	different areas;
26	(c) a crop kind variety intended to be registered under this section may
27	be required to undergo a minimum of two years of text to determine its
28	adaptability to a particular geo-political area.
29	5. The Board shall have powers to-
30	(a) manage and superintend the affairs of the Council;

1	(b) fix the terms and conditions of service including remuneration	
2	of the employees of the Council;	
3	(c) Subject to the provisions of this Bill, make, alter and revoke	
4	rules and regulations	
5	for carrying on the functions of the Council.	
6	PART III -APPOINTMENT OF THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL, ETC	
7	6(1) There shall be appointed by the President, on the	Appointment of
8	recommendation of the Minister, a Director-General for the Council who	the Director-Gener
9	shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Council and is responsible for the	
10	execution of the polices and day-to-day running of the affairs of the Council.	
11	(2) The Director General shall possess professional qualifications	
12	and cognate experience in seed science and technology.	
13	(3)The Director General shall hold office-	
14	(a) for a term of five years and no more; and	
15	(b) on such other terms and conditions as may be specified in the	
16	letter of appointment.	
17	7(1) The Council may appoint such other members of staff as is	Appointment of other Staff
18	deemed necessary for the discharge of its functions under this Bill.	other Starr
19	(2) A person seconded under subsection (2) of this section may	
20	elect to transfer his service to the Council in which case any previous service	
21	shall be qualifying service as defined in the Pension Reform Act.	
22	(3) The Council may make staff regulations relating generally to	
23	the following-	
24	(a) the appointment, promotion, termination, dismissal and	
25	disciplinary control of the staff of the Council as contained in the scheme of	
26	service of the Federal Civil Service;	
27	(b) appeals by such staff against dismissal or other disciplinary	
28	measures, shall be in line with the regulation of the Federal Civil Service,	
29	any instrument relating to the conditions of service of the officers of the	
30	Civil Service of the Federation shall be applicable, with such modifications

	22	(2) A Seed Inspector shall perform the following duties-
	23	(a) take samples of any seed of any variety or hybrid from-
	24	(i) any person selling such seed; or
	25	(ii) any person who is the course of conveying, delivering or
	26	preparing to deliver such seed to a purchaser or a consignee; or
	27	(iii) a purchaser or a consignee after delivery of such seed to him.
	. 28	(b) send such sample to the Seed analyst for the area within which
	29	such sample was taken for analyses.
	30	(c) enter and search any premises in which he has reason to believe

1	that an offence under this Bill has been or is being committed and order in	
2	writing the person in possession of any seed in respect of which the offences	
3	has been committed, not to dispose of any stock of such seed for a specific	
4	period not exceeding thirty days;	
5	(d) examine any record, register, document or any other material	
6	object found in any premises pursuant to paragraph (c) of this subsection	
7	and seize the same if he has reason to believe that it may furnish evidence of	
8	the commission of an offence punishable under this Bill; and	
9	(e) exercise such other duties as may be necessary for carrying out	
10	the purpose of this Bill or any regulations made out there under.	
11	(3) A Seed Inspector may break-open a container or premises in	
12	which seed of any kind or variety is kept for sale provided that the power to	
13	break -open the door of such premises shall be exercised only after the	
14	owner or any other person occupying the premises, if he is present therein,	
15	refuses to open the door on being called upon to do so.	
16	(4) Where a Seed Inspector takes any action under paragraph (a) of	
17	subsection (2) of this section, he shall, at the time when such action is being	
18	taken and take their signatures on a memorandum to be prepared in the	
19	prescribed form and manner.	
20	10(1) Any person who-	Offences
21	(a) contravenes the provisions of section 9 of this Bill or any	
22	regulations made there under;	
23	(b) prevents a Seed Inspector from taking sample under this Bill; or	
24	(c) prevents a Seed Inspector from exercising any other power	•
25	conferred on him under this Bill;	
26	(d) contravenes any other provisions of this Bill, commits an	
27	offence.	
28	(2) The following shall constitute breaches of the provisions of this	
29	Bill and its enabling regulations-	
30	(a) production of seeds without Professional Card;	

i	(b) marketing of seeds without accreditation;
2	(c) misleading information on seed labeling, willful modification or
3	alteration of labeling and the use of any trickery to mislead third parties as to
4	the quality of the seeds;
5	(d) distribution, for animal or human consumption, of seeds treated
6	with substances dangerous to human or animal health and, thus, unfit for
7	consumption;
8	(e) failure to keep proper ledger as laid down in paragraph (d)
9	subsection (2) of section 9;
10	(f) import or export of conventional and genetically modified crop
11	seeds in violation or applicable declaration;
12	(g) obstruction of official inspection or control activities;
13	(h) non-compliance with the conditions of admission for control; and
14	(i) fraud or attempted fraud in the utilization or marketing of seeds.
15	(3) A person who commits an offence under subsection (1) of this
16	section shall on conviction be liable-
17	(a) as a first offender, to a term of imprisonment for six months or to a
18	fine not exceeding fifty thousand naira; and
19	(b) in the event of such person having been previously convicted
20	under this section he shall be liable to a fine of one hundred thousand naira, or
21	to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years or both.
22	(4) Where a person has been convicted under this Bill, the seed In
23	respect of which the contravention occurred may be forfeited to the Federal
24	Government.
25	(5) Where an offence under this Bill has been committed by a
26	company, any officer who at the time the offence was committed was in charge
27	of the conduct of the business of the company, as well as the company, is
28	deemed guilty and shall be liable:
29	Provided that nothing contained in this subsection shall render any such person
30	liable to any nunishment under this Bill if he proves that the offence was

I	committed without his knowledge or that he exercised all due diligence to	
2	prevent the commission of such offence.	
3	(6) Where an offence under this Bill has been committed by a	
4	company and such offence was committed with the consent or connivance	
5	of, or is attributable to any neglect on the part of any director, manager,	
6	secretary or officer of the company, such director, manager, secretary or	••
7	officer shall be deemed to have committed such offence and therefore liable.	
8	(7) Nothing in this Bill shall apply to any seed of any variety or	
9	hybrid grown by a person and delivered by him on his own premises direct	
10	to another person without any monetary consideration for being used by that	
11	person for the purpose of sowing or planting.	
12	PART V - ESTABLISHMENT OF DEPARTMENTS AND ZONES	
13	11(1)There are established for the Council, the following	Establishment of Department and

28	section shall be headed by an officer of the rank of Director.

Issuance of certification	15	14(1) Any person who sells, keeps for sale, offers for sale, barters or
	16	otherwise supplies any seed of any variety or hybrid shall apply to the Council
	17	for grant of certification for the purpose.
	18	(2) Every application under subsection (1) of this section shall be in
	19	such form and contain such particulars and fees as may be prescribed by the
	20	Council.
	21	(3) On the receipt of an application for the grant of certification, the
	22	Council may, after making such enquiry as it thinks fit and after satisfying itself
	23	that the seed to which the application relates is a progeny of a pedigree seed and
	24	conforms to the field and seed standard for that seed under this Bill, grant a
	25	certificate in such form and on such conditions as may be prescribed.
Revocation of ertificates	26	15(1) The Council may revoke any certification granted under this
Citificates	27	Bill if it is satisfied that the certification was obtained by misrepresentation or
	28	that the holder of the certification has contravened any of the provisions of this
	29	Bill or any regulations made thereunder.
	30	(2) The Council shall, before revoking any certification give due

1	notice to the person likely to be affected by such a revocation.	
2	(3) A person who is aggrieved by a decision of the Council under	
3	subsection (1) of this section may appeal to the Minister within 30 days from	
4	the date on which the decision was communicated to him:	
5	Provided that the Minister may entertain an appeal at the expiry of the period	
6	of thirty days if it is satisfied that the appellant was prevented by sufficient	
7	cause from filing the appeal in time.	
8	(4) On receipt of an appeal under subsection (3) of this section, the	
9	Minister shall after giving the appellant an opportunity of being heard,	
10	dispose of the appeal as expeditiously as possible.	
11	16(1) Every certification shall specify that the genetic identity of	Genetic identity
12	the released variety is preserved through the various stages of multiplication	
13	of the seed.	
14	(2) The following categories of seeds of released varieties and	
15	hybrids shall be subject to certification, namely-	
16	(a) foundation seed of Inbred-line, conventional or genetically	
17	modified crop seeds;	
18	(b) certified seed of hybrid, conventional or genetically modified	
19	crop seeds; and	
20	(c) for breeder seed, joint crop seed field inspection visits to	
21	breeder seed multiplication plots shall be conducted.

24	PART VII - POWER TO PROSECUTE	
25	24. Subject to the provisions of Section 174 of the Constitution the	Power to prosecute
26	Council may with the consent of the Attorney General of the Federation,	
27	conduct criminal proceedings in respect of offences under this Bill.	
28	PART VIII - FINANCIAL PROVISIONS	
29	25(1) There shall be established by the Council, a Fund from	Fund of the

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1	(2) There shall be paid and credited to the Fund established pursuan
2	to subsection (1) of this section-
3	(a) initial take-off grant by the Government;
4	(b) such moneys as may be provided to the Council by the yearly
5	budgetary allocation approved by the National Assembly;
6	(c) such monies as may from time to time be granted or received from-
7	(i) Organized private sector;
8	(ii) International donor organizations and non-governmental;
9	(d) such sum as may be approved by the President from Agricultura
10	Development Fund;
11	(e) such monies as may from time to time be granted to the Council by
12	the Federal Government or a State or Local Government Council;
13	(f) all interests receipt in respect of monies invested by the counci
14	including revenue earned from its various activities; and
15	(g) all other assets, from time to time, accruing to the Council.
16	(3) The Council shall make rules for the management of the Fund
17	under subsection (1) of this section and such rules shall in particular contain
18	provisions-
19	(a) specifying the manner in which the assets of the Fund are to be
20	held, and regulating the making of payments into and out of the Fund;
21	(b) requiring the keeping of proper accounts and records for the
22	purposes of the Fund in such form as may be specified in the rules;
23	(c) for ensuring that the accounts are audited periodically by Auditor
24	appointed from a list and in accordance with guidelines supplied by the
25	Auditor-General of the Federation.
26	(d) requiring copies of the accounts and of the Auditor's report thereon
27	to be furnished to the Minister.
28	26. The Council may from time borrow by way of overdraft or
29	otherwise such sums as it may require for the performance of its functions
30	under this Bill.

14	(f) the form and manner in which the fee on payment of which an	
15	appeal may be preferred under section 15 subsection (3) of this Bill and the	
16	procedure to be followed by the Minister in disposing of the appeal;	
17	(g) the qualifications and duties of Seed Analyst and Seed	
18	Inspectors;	
19	(h) the manner in which samples may be taken by the Seed	
20	Inspector, the procedure for sending such samples to the Seed Analyst or the	
21	central seed testing laboratory and the manner of analyzing such samples;	
22	(i) the form of report of the result of the laboratory analysis and the	
23	fees payable in respect of such report;	
24	(j) establishment of Intellectual Property Rights Policy and	•
25	Guidelines;	
26	(k) formulation of policy, regulation and guidelines on Genetically	
27	Modified Crop Seeds introduction, domestication, confirmation and use.	
28	(2) Any regulations made pursuant to subsection 1 of this section	
29	shall be published in the official gazette of the Federal Republic of Nigeria.

	9	"agricultural seeds" includes cereals, legumes, oil seed, grass, fiber, root, tuber,
	10	tree or any other kind of crop seed or seedling commonly recognized within
	11	Nigeria as agricultural seed, lawn seed, vegetable seed, forestry seed and
	12	seedlings, conventional or genetically modified seeds, horticultural seeds and
	13	seedlings, ornamental seeds, seed mixtures and all planting materials as the
	14	Minister may designate from time to time;
•	15	"seed laboratory" means a central seed laboratory designated as such under
	16	section 26 of this Bill;
	17	"certified seed" means any prescribed seed that is certified under the provisions
	18	of this Bill;
