4	agricultural produce so as to encourage uniformity in quality of produce, in

6	Measures Act and Standards Act;
7	(f) facilitate the establishment of a National Agricultural Market
8	Information System for each designated commodity operated by the Agency
9	for the benefit of the consumer and any person engaged in the production,
10	marketing and processing of that commodity;
11	(g) to perform fertilizer regulatory and quality assurance functions as
12	well as develop strategy to enable the private sector take full responsibility for
13	fertilizer procurement and distribution to farmers;
14	(h) build capacity of farmer groups and cooperatives to improve
15	access to agriculture support services and facilitate participation development
16	in each Local Government Area including the Federal Capital Territory;
17	(i) affordable private sector investment in agriculture produce
18	processing through establishment of cottage industries, export conditioning
19	centres and agro-industrial parks;

20	proposes to make any contract, or has an interest in any such contract, he shall
21	forthwith disclose to the Board the fact and the nature of such interest, and such
22	disclosure shall be recorded in the minutes of the Board, and thereafter such
23	member shall take no further part in any deliberations or decision of the Board
24	relating to such project or contract.
25	(2) Any member disclosing any interest in any project or company or
26	undertaking in which the Agency proposes to make any contract shall be
27	disregarded for the purposes of constituting a quorum of the Board for any such
28	deliberation or decision.
29	(3) For the purposes of subsection (1) of this section, a general notice
30	given at a meeting of the Board by a member to the effect that he is a member of

- the specified company or firm and is to be regarded as interested in any transaction or project of the Agency, concerning the company or firm, shall be regarded as a sufficient disclosure of his interest in relation to that transaction or project.
- 4. A member of the Board need not attend in person at a meeting of the Board in order to make any disclosure which he is required to make under this section, if he takes reasonable steps to secure that the disclosure is made by notice which is brought up and read at the meeting.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Bill seeks to establish the "National Food Reserve Agency" for the purposes of facilitating Food Production, Processing, Storage and Marketing of food grains and other food commodities for strategic purposes.
