24	Disclosure of Interest by Members of the Board
25	22. A member of the Board who is in any way directly or indirectly

27	the nature of his interest at a meeting of the Board where the subject is first
28	discussed by the Board, and the disclosure shall be recorded in the minute
29	book of the Board, and the member shall not take part in any deliberation or
30	decision of the Board with respect to that transaction or project.

	23. A member of the Board need not attend in person a meeting of the

6	24. The personal interest of a member shall not conflict with any of his

15	27. The common seal of the Board shall not be affixed to any
16	instrument except by the authority of a resolution of the Board and the affixing
17	of the common seal shall be authenticated by the signatures of the Chairman
18	and the Secretary, or of some other members authorized generally or
19	specifically by the Board to act for the purpose. Any document purporting to be
20	a document duly executed under the common seal of the Board shall be
21	received in any court and shall, unless contrary is prove~, be deemed to be so

23	28. The validity of any proceedings of the Board shall not be affected
24	by vacancy in the membership of the Board or by any defect in the appointment
25	of a member of the Board, or by reason that a person not entitled to do so took

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to establish the Road Fund which shall be a repository for revenues accruing from road user charging systems and other sources for the purpose of financing the maintenance and upkeep of national roads and promote sustainable development of the road sector.
