MARINE INSURANCE IN THE COUNTRY AND FOR RELATED MATTERS Sponsored by Hon. Mohammed Garba Gololo Commencement BE ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: PART 1 - ESTABLISHMENT AND COMPOSITION, ETC. 1.-(1) There is hereby established a Bureau to be known as the Establishment of National Marine National Marine Insurance Bureau (in the Act referred to as "the bureau"). EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The Bill seeks to establish the National Marine Insurance Bureau, to take charge of and collect insurance levies on all cargos of crude or gas leaving and entering the shores of the country and to check Billions of Dollars capital flight which Nigeria losses to foreign insurance companies who monopolize and specialize in marine insurance in the country.
