1	1. The Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria (As	Amendment of the Principal Act
2	Amended) hereafter referred to as "the principal Act" is hereby further	
3	amended as set out in this Bill.	
4	2. Section 11 sub-sections (4) of the principal Act is amended by	
5	adding new sub-sections 4 (a) and 4 (b) to read:	
6	4(a) At any time when any House of Assembly of a State is unable	
7	to perform its functions by reason of any situation prevailing in the State	
8	House of Assembly or any other reason, the National Assembly shall	
9	through a resolution of each House take over the functions of the State	
10	House of Assembly;	
11	4(b) The National Assembly may make such laws for the peace,	
12	order peace and good governance of that State with respect to matters on	
13	which a House of Assembly may make laws as may appear to the National

## EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The Bill seek to amend section 11 (4) of the Constitution to give powers to the National Assembly to take over the functions of a State House of Assembly at any time is unable to perform its functions by reason of the situation prevailing in that State House of Assembly or any other reason. It thus tend to eliminate any vacuum in the conduct of Legislative Business in the Legislative Arm of Government of a State.
