- 1 (3) Any document purporting to be a document duly executed under 2 the seal of the Council, shall be received in evidence and shall, unless and until 3 the contrary is proved, be presumed to be so executed.
- 5. The validity of any proceeding of the Council or of a Committee thereof shall not be adversely affected by any vacancy in the membership of the
- 6 Councilor Committee, or by defect in the appointment of a member of the
- 7 Council, or of a Committee, or by reason that a person not entitled to do so took
- 8 part in the proceedings of the Council or Committee.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The bill seeks to provide legal backing and framework for the already existing Federal Scholarship Board of Nigeria for the purpose of planning, implementing, and overseeing a Federal Scholarship scheme.

The board had until now existed as a unit under the Federal Ministry of Education.
