(3) Where any Free Advice and Treatment of Breast Cancer certificate 1 is so filed, the beneficiary: 2 (a) shall not be liable in respect of any treatment to which the 3 certificate relates for medical treatment or for such charges payable for any 4 other services in relation to the treatment; 5 (b) shall be entitled to medical advice free of charge so long as it is 6 within the ailment to which the certificate relates; and 7 (c) shall not, except where express provision is made in this Bill, be 8 liable for costs to any other party in any treatment to which the certificate 9 10 relates. 8	(c) household furniture used by the applicant in her house;
9	(d) a dwelling-house owned and exclusively used by the applicant and
10	her family as their home assessed at an annual value of not more than N120,000
11	or a Housing flat owned and exclusively used by the applicant and her family as
12	their home;
13	(e) savings of the applicant of up to N300,000, if she is of the age of 60
14	years and above; and
15	(f) moneys standing to the credit of the applicant's account in the
16	pension Fund;
17	"disposable income" means the income of the applicant together with the
18	income (if any) of the spouse of the applicant, during the period of 12 months
19	immediately preceding the date of the application, after deducting therefrom:
20	(a) an amount equal to N50,000 per annum for each person totally or
21	partially dependent on the applicant or spouse;
22	(b) an amount equal to N80,000 per annum for the applicant;
23	(c) an amount not exceeding N120,000 per annum for rent; and
24	(d) an amount equal to the applicant's contribution to the Pension
25	Fund.
26	5. For the purposes of paragraphs 1 and 2, the Chief Medical Director
27	may, in any case where an applicant for Free advice/treatment of breast cancer
28	is living separate and apart from her spouse and where it appears to the Chief
29	Medical Director in his absolute discretion to be reasonable to do so to relieve
30	hardship, disregard the income of the spouse.
