## FOR

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FREE INTEGRATED MATERNAL, NEWBORN A CARE PROGRAMME FOR WOMEN AND CHILDREN IN ALL GOVERNMENT CONTROLLED MEDICAL FACILITIES AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

*Sponsored by Hon. Garba Ibrahim Muhammed*

[ ] Commencement

1 ENACTED BY the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of  
2 Nigeria:

3 1.-(i) There shall be provided by the Government Free Integrated  
4 Maternal and Child Health Care Programme (hereinafter referred to as the  
5 Program) in all the government sponsored health care facilities;

Provisions and funding of free maternal and child health care programme

6 (ii) Government of the Federation shall in each annual budget  
7 appropriate funds generally for the Programme while States and Local  
8 Governments shall appropriate and provide counterpart funding as may be  
9 agreed for the execution of the programme in their respective jurisdiction.

10 2.-(i) For the purpose of successful implementation of the  
11 programme, government shall provide at least one General Hospital in each  
12 Local Government, one Primary Health Clinic in each ward and a Health  
13 Post in each village;

Provision of health facilities, drugs, equipments and services

14 (ii) The health facilities established under subsection (1) above  
15 shall be provided with all drugs, equipments, and services needed for the  
16 successful implementation of the programme as provided in the first and  
17 second schedule to this Bill and subject to review from time to time by the  
18 Minister.

19 3. Nothing in this Bill shall be construed as precluding the  
20 Development Partners, Private Sector, Non-Governmental Organizations  
21 (NGO), Community Development Associations or any other Volunteer from  
22 participating and giving support to the Programme. Except that approval for

1 such participation and support shall first be sought and obtained from the  
2 Minister.

Duties of the  
Ministry

3 4. It shall be the duty of the Ministry:

4 (a) To set guidelines for the operation of the Free Integrated maternal  
5 and Child Health Care Programme;

6 (b) To co-ordinate the monitoring and evaluation of the programme at  
7 all levels;

8 (c) To regulate the activities of supporting bodies in respect of the  
9 program;

10 (d) To determine the structure of the health facilities.

11 To ensure that government provides all the drugs, equipments and services  
12 listed in the schedules to this Bill.

Meeting of State  
Council on health

13 5. Every State council on health shall meet at least once in a year to  
14 assess the level of implementation of the programme in their respective states.

Ministry of  
Local Government

15 6. The Ministry of Local Government of a State shall:

16 (a) Ensure implementation of the programme at the Local  
17 Government level;

18 (b) In collaboration with the State Ministry of Health monitor and  
19 evaluate the programme at the Local Government level.

Offences

20 7. Any person who sells drugs or equipments meant for the  
21 programme or charges fees for services rendered under the program shall be  
22 guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding ten  
23 thousand naira or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or both  
24 such fine and imprisonment.

Interpretation

25 8. In this Bill unless the context otherwise requires:

26 "Government" means Federal State and Local Government;

27 "Free Maternal Health Core Programme" means provision of health care  
28 services to pregnant Women from conception to six weeks after delivery  
29 without any consideration of financial or material gain;

30 "Maternal Health" means a state of complete physical, mental and social well

1 being of a Women in all matters relating to her antenatal, delivery and  
2 postnatal period (from birth to six weeks after delivery);  
3 "Maternal Mortality" means the death of a Women during pregnancy,  
4 labour, within six weeks after delivery or complications resulting from child  
5 birth;  
6 "Under five" means a child below five years of age;  
7 "Minister" means Minister of the Federation charged with health matters;  
8 "Ministry" Means Federal Ministry of Health;  
9 "Facilities" means government owned primary, secondary and tertiary  
10 health institutions;  
11 "Antenatal Care" means the preventive health care services given to  
12 pregnant women before delivery;  
13 "IMCI" Means Integrated Management of Childhood Diseases.

14 9. This Bill may be cited as Free Integrated Maternal and Child Citation  
15 Health Care Bill, 2016.

- 18 (a) Registration cards folders and related stationeries;  
19 (b) Medical consultations;  
20 (c) Basic laboratory investigations urinalysis packed Cell Volume  
21 (PCV), including HIV screening;  
22 (d) Ultrasound scanning at General Hospitals;  
23 (e) Routine ANC drugs (Haematinics Intermittant Preventive  
24 Therapy (IPT) for malaria prevention, antacids) and equipments  
25 (Sphygmomanometers stethoscopes fetal stethoscope measuring tapes

27 (f) Normal delivery: Delivery drugs and consumables like

- 1 (h) Post delivery drugs like antibiotics and analgesics;
- 2 (i) Reproductive health services;
- 3 (j) Surgical operative deliveries (caesarian sections, caesarian
- 4 hysterectomy, laparotomy for ruptured uterus manual removal of placenta
- 5 repair of episiotomy repair of cervical lacerations and uterine evacuations and
- 6 destructive procedures);
- 7 (k) Management of ectopic pregnancy;
- 8 (l) Post operative drugs like antibiotics, analgesics, Intravenous
- 9 fluids, catheters, urine bags and dressing materials;
- 10 (m) Manual vacuum aspiration for miscarriages;
- 11 (n) Drugs and equipments for management of miscarriages;
- 12 (o) Comprehensive treatment for pre Eclampsia and Eclampsia with
- 13 antihypertensives, Magnesium Sulphate regimen, and or tranquilizers;
- 14 (p) Management of VesicoVaginal and Rector Vaginel Fistulae;
- 15 (q) Blood grouping and cross matching including blood bags and
- 16 blood giving set;
- 17 (r) Tetanus Immunization;
- 18 (s) Prevention of Maternal to Child Transmission of HIV /AIDS
- 19 (PMTCT);
- 20 (t) Management of complications of operative deliveries;

- 23 (a) Registration cards, folders and related stationeries;
- 24 (b) Medical consultations;
- 25 (c) Management of respiratory track infections including
- 26 tuberculosis;
- 27 (d) Management of diarrheal diseases (IMCIOprotoco);
- 28 (e) Provision of Oral Rehydration Solution (ORS);
- 29 (f) Provision of basic antibiotics (Penicillins, chioramphenicol,
- 30 septrin and gentamycin;

- 1 (g) Management of Acute and Severe Malaria. (Atimisinin  
2 Combination Therapy. Acr, Quinine, chloroquine injections, fansidar and  
3 antipyretics);
- 4 (h) Management of Measles and its complications-Vitamin A,  
5 Tetracycline/Chlorophenicol, Eye Ointments, Gentian Violet  
6 (GV),antibiotics and antipyretics;
- 7 (i) Blood grouping and cross matching, screening, blood bags and

- 9 (j) Emergency X-rays and basic laboratory investigations. Packed  
10 Cell Volume (PCV), MPs, urinalysis, Cerebra Spinal Fluid (CSF)-  
11 Microscopy Culture and Sensitivity (MCS)urine and stool (MCS);
- 12 (k) Management of Malnutrition with special diet (high calories  
13 diet) and Kwarsh pap;
- 14 (l) Routine immunizations;
- 15 (m) Treatment of common Childhood illnesses;
- 16 (n) Management of pediatric emergencies (Birth asphyxia and  
17 trauma, management of serious infections, management of the Low Birth  
18 Weight infants, pre-maturity, imperforate anus and intestinal obstruction);
- 19 (o) Mucus extractor;
- 20 (p) Management of febrile convulsions;
- 21 (q) Anti-convulsants (diazepam, paraldehyde and phenobarbitone  
22 injections);
- 23 (r) Management of Neonatal infections.
- 24 (s) Management of Neonatal jaundice;
- 25 (t) Provision of intravenous fluid (50% dextrose, Ringer's lactate,  
26 strength Darrows, Normal and pediatrics saline);
- 27 (u) Provision of (Canulae, Scalp vein needless, Nasa Gastric tubes  
28 and syringes of various sizes);
- 29 (v) Provision of aminophyline, adrenaline and hydrocortisone  
30 injections;

- 1 (w) provision of baby incubators, phototherapy lamp, radiant heaters,
- 2 baby and toddlers weighing scales, Nebulizers and nebulers, Suction machines
- 3 and oxygen concentrators;
- 4 (x) Management of burns;
- 5 (y) Anti Retroviral Therapy (ART) for Children;
- 6 (z) Management of Sickle Cell Disease.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to provide for free integrated maternal and child health care to cover women from conception to six weeks after delivery and children who are under the age of five years to ensure that deaths arising from pregnancy and early childhood diseases are reduced to the barest minimum in the country.
