I Commencement BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows-1 1.-(1) There is hereby established a body to be known as the Establishment of the Institute of 2 Institute of Chartered Economists of Nigeria (in this Bill referred to as "the Chartered Economists of 3 Institute") which-Nigeria 4 (a) shall be a body corporate with-5 (i) perpetual succession, 6 (ii) a common seal which shall be kept in such custody as the 7 Council may direct; 8 (b) may sue and be sued in its corporate name; and 9 (c) may acquire, hold and dispose of any property, moveable or 10 immovable. 11 (2) The Institute shall have the general duty of-(a) determining the standard of knowledge and skill to be attained 12 by persons seeking to become registered members of the Institute and 13 raising those standards from time to time as circumstances may permit; 14 15 (b) securing in accordance with the provisions of this Bill, the 16 establishment and maintenance of a register of members, and the

publication from time to time of the list of those persons;

Establishment and composition of the Governing Council of the Institute

1	(c) ensuring that the study and practice of the art and science of
2	economics are done professionally in Nigeria;
3	(d) providing consultancy services on economic matters to the public
4	as well as the private sector;
5	(e) holding conferences, workshops seminars and symposia on
6	contemporary economic issues; and
7	(f) performing any other duties as the Council may deem fit from time
8	to time.
9	2(1) There is hereby established for the Institute a Governing
10	Council (in this Bill referred to as "the Council") which shall be charged with
11	the responsibility for the administration and general management of the
12	Institute.
13	(2) The Council shall consist of-
14	(a) the National President of the Institute, who shall be the Chairman;
15	(b) the National Vice President of the Institute, who shall be the Vice
16	Chairman;
17	(c) two persons from Institution of higher learning offering courses
18	leading to relevant qualifications such that the two representatives does not
19	come from the same institution;
20	(d) two persons each from the six geopolitical zones;
21	(e) all members of the Board of Trustees;
22	(f) ten persons from affiliated professional bodies in the Country in
23	rotation;
24	(g) the immediate past President of the Institute;
25	(h) the Registrar of the Institute who shall also be the Executive
26	Secretary to the Council.
³ 27	(3) The provisions set out in the First Schedule to this Bill shall have
28	effect with respect to the qualifications and tenure of office of members of the
29	Council and the other matters therein mentioned.

- 3 (2) Members admitted into the Institute shall possess adequate 4 interest, knowledge and understanding of economics and such admitted 5 persons may be registered as members in any of the following categories-
- 6 (a) Student Member;
- 7 (b) Graduate Member;
- 8 (c) Associate Member;
- 9 (d) Honourary Fellow; and
- 10 (e) Fellow.
- 11 (3) A member of the Institute shall be entitled to receive, from the 12 Council, a certificate in such form as the Council may approve for that purpose 13 and a Fellow or an Associate Member shall be entitled to use such letters after 14 his name as may be authorized by the Council from time to time as follows-
- (a) a member registered into the category of membership of Fellowshall use the initials "FCE";
- 17 (b) a member registered into the category of membership of Associate 18 shall be entitled to use the initials "ACE".
- 19 (5) The provisions of Second Schedule to this Bill shall have effect 20 with respect to the categories of members listed in subsection (2) of this 21 section.

6	a member of the Institute practices as chartered economists registered by the
7	Institute for or in expectation of reward or takes or uses any name, title,
8	addition or description implying that he is in practice as a chartered economists
9	registered by the Institute, he is guilty of an offence.
10	(4) If the Registrar or any other person employed by or on behalf of
11	the Institute willfully makes any falsification in any matter relating to the
12	register, he is guilty of an offence.
13	(5) A person guilty of an offence under this section is liable-
14	(a) on summary conviction, to a fine of an amount not exceeding
15	N50,000;
16	(b) on conviction to his name being removed from the register; or
17	(c) on conviction or indictment, to a fine of an amount not exceeding
18	N200,000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years or to both
19	such fine and imprisonment.
20	19(1) On the commencement of this Bill-
21	(a) all properties held immediately before by or on behalf of the
22	Incorporated Institute before this Bill, by virtue of this section shall be vested
23	on the Institute; and
24	(b) subject to subsection (2) of this section, any act, or matter made or
25	done by the Incorporated Institute before this Bill shall continue to have effect.
26	(2) The provisions of this Bill shall have effect with respect to matters
27	arising from the transfer by this section to the Institute of the property of the
28	Incorporated Institute before this Bill, and with respect to the other matters

16	7. Elections of officers of the Council shall be held in such manner as
17	may be prescribed by rules made by the Council.
18	8. If for any reason a member vacates office-
19	(a) if such member was appointed by the Council, the Council shall
20	appoint another fit and proper person to replace such member; or
21	(b) the Council may, if the time between the unexpired portion of the
22	term of office and the next meeting of the Institute appears to warrant the filling
23	of vacancy, the Council may appoint another person to replace such member
24	for the unexpired term.

26	2. The Council shall have power to do anything, which in its opinion
27	is calculated to facilitate the carrying on of the activities of the Institute.
28	3(1) Subject to the provisions of this Bill, the Council may in the
29	name of the Institute make standing orders regulating the proceedings of the
30	Institute the Council or any of the Committees of the Council or Institute.

24	not and whether or not of such nature that the rights, liabilities and obligations
25	thereunder could be assigned by the Incorporated Institute, shall have effect
26	from the commencement of this Bill so far it relates to property transferred by

- (c) for any reference (however worded and whether express or implied) to a member or members of the Council of the Incorporated Institute there were substitutes, as respects anything failing to be done on or after the commencement of this Bill, a reference to a member or members of the Council under this Bill.
- (2) Other documents referring, whether specifically or generally, to the Incorporated Institute shall be construed in accordance with subparagraph (1) of this paragraph so far as applicable.
- (3) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provisions of this Schedule, where, by the operation of any of them or of section of this Bill, any right, liability or obligation vests in the Institute, the Institute and all other persons shall, as from commencement of this Bill, have the same rights, powers and remedies (and, in particular, the same rights as to the taking or resisting of legal proceedings or the making or resisting of applications to any authority) for ascertaining, perfecting or enforcing that right, liability or obligation as they would have had if it had at all times been a right, liability or obligation of the Institute.
- (4) Any legal proceedings or application to any authority pending on the commencement of this Bill by or against the Incorporated Institute and relating to property transferred by this Bill to the Institute may be continued on or after that day by or against the Institute.
- (5) If the law in force at the place where any property transferred by this Bill is situated provides for the registration of transfers or property of the kind in question (whether by reference to an instrument of transfer or otherwise), the law shall, so far it provides for alterations of a register but not for avoidance of transfers, the payment of fees or any other matter apply with the necessary modifications to the transfer of the property aforesaid, and it shall be the duty of the Council to furnish the necessary particulars of

 - Incorporated Institute. (5) Any person being an office holder on, or member of the Council of the Incorporated Institute immediately before the commencement of this

may be to those appertained to him in his capacity as a member of staff of the

Bill and deemed under this paragraph to have been appointed to any position in the Institute, and hereafter ceasing to hold office otherwise than by reason of his misconduct, shall be eligible for appointment to office in the Institute or to membership of the Council, as the case may be.

(6) All regulations, rules and similar instruments made for the purpose of the Incorporated Institute and in force immediately before the commencement of this Bill shall, except in so far as they are subsequently revoked or amended by any authority having power in that behalf, have effect with necessary modifications, as if duly made for the corresponding purpose of the Institute.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Bill-seeks to establish the Institute of Chartered Economists of Nigeria and charges it with the responsibility for determining the standard of knowledge and skill to be attained by persons seeking to become chartered economist.
