Sponsored by Hon. Oluwole Oke Γ Commencement ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: Part One - Protection of Officers' Identity and Other 1 MATERIALS 2. Protection of 1.-(1) The Identity of an Agency Officer or Agent shall not without Identities of 3 Agency Officers due authorization from the Agency be disclosed to any other person. 4 (2) A person who willfully discloses the identity of an Agency 5 Officer or Agent to a person to whom he is not authorized on behalf of the 6 government to disclose, is guilty of an offence and shall be liable on 7 conviction to imprisonment for a term of five years or a fine not below the 8 sum of five hundred thousand Naira or both. 9 (2) Where the unauthorized disclosure of the identity of an Agency 10

This Bill seeks to protect the identity of officers of the National Security Agencies, its agents, informants, sources and other classified information from unauthorized disclosure, as well as to protect intelligence facilities, installations and equipment against unauthorized access; and prescribes penalties for violation of its provisions.
