Commencement ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: PART I - ESTABLISHMENT, ETC., OF THE AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH 1 2 COUNCIL OF NIGERIA 1. There is hereby established a body to be known as the Establishment of 3 the Council Agricultural Research Council of Nigeria (in this Act referred to as "the 4 Council") which under that name shall be a body corporate with perpetual 5 succession and a common seal, and may sue or be sued in its corporate name. 6 2.-(1) There is hereby established for the Council a governing 7 Governing Board of the Council board which shall consist of the following members to be appointed by the 8 9 President: (a) the Chairman who shall be a person in any of the fields of 10 agricultural sciences with cognate wide knowledge and experience; 11 (b) the Permanent Secretary of the Federal Ministry of Agriculture 12 13 and Rural Development; (c) the Permanent Secretary of the Federal Ministry of Industry, 14 15 Trade and Investment; (d) the Permanent Secretary of the Federal Ministry of Science and 16 17 Technology; (e) the President of the Farmers Association of Nigeria; 18 (f) the Chairman of the Agric Business Group of the Manufacturers 19

	8	(2) The supplementary provisions set out in the First Schedule to this
	9	Act shall have effect with respect to the proceedings of the Board and the other
	10	matters contained therein.

Tenure of office	12	3(1) A member of the Board, other than an ex-officio member, shall
	13	hold office for a term of four years in the first instance and may be re-appointed

	27	PART II - FUNCTIONS OF THE COUNCIL
Functions of the Council	28	5. The functions of the Council shall be to:
	29	(a) advise the Federal Government on national policies and priorities
	30	in agricultural research, training and extension activities;

1 .	(b) manage, plan, conduct and promote research, human resource
2	development and technology generation, assessment and adoption for the
3	advancement of all aspects of agriculture in Nigeria;
4	(c) prepare periodic master plans for agricultural research, training
5 .	and extension and advise the Federal Government on the financial
6	requirement for the implementation of such plans;
7	(d) ensure the implementation of the approved master plans by the
8	appropriate research institutes, colleges, universities and other bodies;
9	(e) participate in the process of the appointment of Directors of
10	agricultural research institutes established under university statutes, by Vice
11	Chancellors;
12	(f) prescribe and give policy direction to the Federal Colleges of
13	Agriculture, established under section 15 of this Act, on their training and
14	extension activities;
15	(g) supervise research, training and extension activities of research
16	institutes established under section 14 of this Act;
17	(h) prepare the annual budget for agricultural research, training and
18	extension programmes of the institutes and colleges under its aegis and
19	receive grants for allocation to the institutes and colleges for the
20	implementation of the annual programmes and to universities and other
21	bodies for special research or training projects;
22	(i) maintain an up-to-date record of all existing facilities for
23	research, training and extension in the agricultural sciences in Nigeria and
24	advise the Federal Government on their adequacy and efficient utilization;
25	(j) advise the Federal Government on the re-organisation of
26	existing institutes and colleges, including the creation of new ones, as are
27	required to implement or further the efficiency of research, training and
28	extension in the agricultural sciences;
29	(k) promote collaboration between scientists engaged in research

in the agricultural sciences in Nigeria and their counterparts in other

	2	(I) establish and maintain a National Agricultural Science Library and
	3	Documentation Centre and publish or sponsor the publication of research
	4	results in the agricultural sciences; and
	5	(m) carry out such other activities as may, in the opinion of the
	6	Council, further the advancement of research, training and extension in the
	7	agricultural sciences.

16	(i) persons with requisite academic qualification and experience,
17	(ii) persons who, in the opinion of the Board, will assist the Council
18	in the effective discharge of any of its functions.
19	(5) The Council shall:
20	(a) appoint such number of directors and other employees as may,
21	in the opinion of the Council, be required to assist the Council in the
22	discharge of any of its functions under this Act; and
23	(b) pay to such persons so appointed such remuneration (including
24	allowances) as the Council may, after consultations with the National
25	Salaries and Wages Commission, determine.
26	(6) Notwithstanding subsection (5) of this section, the staff of the
27	Agricultural Sciences Department of the Federal Ministry of Agriculture
28	and Rural Development shall be deemed to have transferred to the
29	employment of the Council on the commencement of this Act.
30	(7) Any staff mentioned in subsection (6) of this section who does

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	1	not wish to transfer to the employment of the Council shall remain with the
	2	Ministry.
	3	(8) The Council shall have the power to make, with the approval of the
	4	Minister, staff regulations governing conditions of service of its employees.

13	(4) Where a levy imposed under section 8(2)(b) of this Bill is not paid
14	within the time specified in this section, the Federal Inland Revenue Service
15	shall serve on the company, a demand note for the unpaid tax plus aa sum which
16	is equal to 5 percent of the levy.
17	(5) Any company, agency or organization that fails within two months
18	after a demand note, to pay the levy imposed under section 8 of this Bill has
19	been served on it, commits an offense and is liable on conviction to a fine of not
20	less than N2,000,000 or 20% of the levy (whichever is higher); and the Chief
21	Executive Officer of the company, agency or organization shall be liable to be
22	prosecuted and punished for the offense in like manner as if he/she had
23	himself/herself committed the offense, unless he/she proves that the act or
24	omission constituting the offense took place without his/her knowledge,
25	consent or connivance.
26	(6) The institution of proceeding or imposition of a penalty under this
27	Bill shall not relieve a company, agency or organization from liability to pay
28	the Federal Inland Revenue Service such levy or levies that may become due
29	under this Bill.

- (6) Any such contract or instrument as is mentioned in subsection (4) of this section shall be of the same force and effect against or in favour of the Council established by this Act and shall be enforceable as fully and effectively as if instead of the Colleges of Agriculture in subsection (2) of this section existing before the commencement of this Act, the Council established by this Act has been named therein or had been a party thereto.
- (7) The Council established by this Act shall be subject to all the obligations and liabilities to which the Colleges of Agriculture in subsection (2) of this section existing before the commencement of this Act were subject immediately before the commencement of this Act and all other persons shall have the same rights, powers and remedies against the Council established by this Act as they had against the Colleges of Agriculture specified in subsection (2) of this section and existing before the commencement of this Act.
- (8) Any proceeding or cause of action pending or existing immediately before the commencement of this Act, by or against the Colleges of Agriculture specified in subsection (2) of this section and existing before the commencement of this Act in respect of any right, interest, obligation or liability of the Colleges of Agriculture specified in subsection (2) of this section and existing before the commencement of this Act may be continued or as the case may be commenced and any determination of a court of law, tribunal or other authority or person may be enforced by or against the Council established by this Act to the same extent that such proceeding or cause of action or determination might have been continued, commenced or enforced by or against the Colleges of Agriculture specified in subsection (2) of this section and existing before the commencement of this Act.

27	deemed to have transferred to the employment of the Council from the date	
28	of their appointment by the respective Institutes.	

(4) Accordingly, the Nigerian Research Institutes Act 1964 and the

Research Institutes (Establishment, etc.) Order 1975 are hereby

consequently repealed.
