AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE NIGERIAN ACADEMY OF SCIENCE TO PROMOTE THE GROWTH, ACQUISITION AND DISSEMINATION OF SCIENTIFIC

KNOWLEDGE AND TO FACILITATE THE USE OF SCIENCE IN THE SOLUTION TO PROBLEMS OF NATIONAL INTEREST AND FOR RELATED MATTERS Sponsored by Hon. Uzoma Nkem Abonta [ 1 Commencement BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows Establishment of the Nigerian Academy of Science 1 1.-(1) There is established a body to be known as the Nigerian 2 Establishment of the Academy Academy of Science (in this Act referred to as "the Academy"). 3 (2) The Academy shall be a body corporate with perpetual 4 succession and may sue or be sued in corporate name. 5 2. The objects of the Academy shall be to: Objects of the 6 Academy (a) provide advice on issues of scientific and technological nature 7 presented to it by the government and its agencies, as well as by private 8 organizations: 9 (b) bring to the attention of government and its agencies, problems 10 of national interest that science and technology can help to solve; 11 (c) establish and maintain the highest standards of scientific 12 endeavour and achievement in Nigeria; 13 (d) develop a good working relationship with other national and 14 international scientific bodies and academies; 15 3.-(1) The Academy is the only Academy of Science recognized by 16 Relationship with Government Government. 17 (2) The Minister may advise the Academy to perform acts on 18 behalf of Government which are in accordance with its objectives. 19

1 4.-(1) There shall be two categories of members of the Academy, that 2 is Nigerian members and Foreign members, and membership shall be in the 3 categories of: 4 (a) Fellows for Nigerian members; and 5 (b) Foreign Fellows for non-Nigerian members. 6 (2) A Member of the Academy is a person who can be expected by the 7 Academy to significantly assist the Academy in achieving its objectives. 8 (3) The criterion for election to membership is significant 9 achievement in the pursuit, advancement or application of science as members. 10 (4) New candidates for membership of the Academy are proposed and recommended at least once a year by means of a prescribed certificate signed 11 12 by not less than four members, at least two of whom have personal knowledge 13 and understanding of the scientific work and significant contribution to science 14 of the candidate. 15 (5) The certificate must contain a draft citation explaining why the election of the candidate to membership of the Academy would further the 16 17 objectives of the Academy. (6) The certificate must be accompanied by a prescribe statement 18 from the candidate indicating the candidate's willingness to be considered for 19 election to membership of the Academy, together with a curriculum vitae. 20 21 (7) The council of the academy must annually evaluate, in terms of the prescribed criteria for membership, all new candidates and candidates brought 22 23 forward from the previous year. 24 (8) All existing members of the Academy will then be required, in a secret ballot to cast votes that are either for or against every candidate 25 shortlisted by the council, or that indicate a neutral position. 26 (9) Members of the Academy who do not vote are regarded as having 27

16	(2) The Council shall, from time to time, apply the proceeds of the	
17	fund of the Academy to:	
18	(a) all expenditure incurred by the Academy in the discharge of its	
19	functions under this Act;	
20	(b) the remunerations and allowances of staff of the Academy;	
21	(c) the maintenance of the premises and property owned and vested	
22	in the Academy;	
23	(d) the payment of traveling allowances and such stipend for	
24	members of the Council as may be determined by the Council; and	
25	(e) the payment of such other charges as may be reasonably	
26	incurred in the exercise of the functions of the Academy and the Council.	
27	(3) For the purposes of the Companies Income Tax, any donation	
28	made by any company in Nigeria to the Academy shall be a deductible	
20	donation within the meaning of that Act	

Borrowing and investment power

- 12.-(1) The Council may, with the consent of its members and in accordance with the general guidelines or authority given by the Government of the Federation, borrow, on behalf of the Academy, by way of loan or overdraft from any source, any monies required by the Council to meet the obligations of the Academy in order to perform its functions under this Act, so however that such consent or authority shall be required where the sum or aggregate of the sums involved at any time does not exceed such amount as is for the time being projected in relation to the Academy in any particular year.
- (2) The Council may, subject to the provisions of this Act and conditions of trust in respect of funds held or any property owned by the Institute, invest any but not all of its funds with the same consent or general authority.

Annual estimates

- 13.-(1) The Chairman of the Council shall cause to be prepared not later than six months before the end of the year, estimates of recurrent and capital expenditure (if any) and income of the Academy during the next succeeding financial year which shall be presented to the annual general meeting of the Academy by the Council for approval.
- (2) The Council shall keep proper accounts and records in relation thereto, and shall prepare in respect of each financial year, a statement of account in such form as the Chairman or the Council shall direct.
- (3) The Council shall as soon as may be after the end of a financial year, cause the accounts of the Academy and those of the Council to be audited by qualified auditors appointed from the list of auditors and in accordance with the guidelines laid down by the Auditor-General for the Federation.
- (4) The auditors appointed pursuant to subsection (3) of this section shall, on completion of the audit of the accounts of the Academy and the Council for each financial year, prepare and submit to the Council two reports, that is to say:
- (a) a general report setting out the observations and recommendations
  of the said auditors on the financial affairs of the Academy and the Council for

1	that year, and on any important manners which the auditors may consider	
2	necessary to bring to the notice of the Council; and	
3	(b) a detailed report containing the observations and	
4	recommendations of the auditors on all aspects of the operations of the	
5	Academy and the Council.	
6	14(1) In order to achieve its objectives the Academy may:	Functions of the Academy

10	(b) Publish scientific reports and other publications;	
11	(c) Promote and inspire outstanding achievements in the different	
12	fields of sciences in Nigeria and recognition for excellence;	
13	(d) Promote the general interest in science and science education;	
14	(e) Establish reciprocal arrangements and enter into agreement	
15	with organizations with similar objectives, locally and in other countries to	
16	promote the exchange of information and ideas;	
17	(f) Protect the interests of members through the provision of	
18	professional consultative advice and the issue of journals and other	
19	publications, organization and conduct of seminars, workshops,	
20	conferences, etc.;	
21	(g) Offer advice and assistance to the scientific academic	
22	community and to various scientific societies in Nigeria;	
23	(h) Establish a fellowship programme which would create	
24	opportunities for outstanding new Ph.Ds in the sciences to conduct	
25	postdoctoral research at various institutions before they take up regular job	
26	as lecturers;	
27	(i) Seek an active role in the selection of candidates for government	
28	postgraduate scholarships and fellowships in the Science and in the	
29	identification of candidates for the award of honours and distinctions by

21	(4) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this
22	paragraph, the first meeting of the Council shall be summoned by the
23	Minister, who may give such directions as he thinks fit as to the procedure

26	5(1) The fixing of the seal of the Academy shall be authenticated
27	by the signature of the President or of some other member of the Council
28	authorized generally by the Academy to act for that purpose.

(2) Any contract or instrument which, if made or executed by a

person not being a body corporate, would not be required to be under seal,

1	may be made or executed on behalf of the Academy or the Council as the case
2	may require, by any person generally or specifically authorised to act for that
3	purpose by the Council.
4	(3) Any document purporting to be a document duly executed under
5	the seal of the Academy shall be received in evidence and shall unless the
6	contrary is proved be deemed to be so executed.
7	6. The validity of any proceedings of the Academy or the Councilor
8	of a committee of the Council shall not be affected by any vacancy in
9	membership, or by any defect in the appointment of a member of the Academy
10	or of the Council or of a person to serve on the Committee, or by reason that a
11	person not entitled to do so took part in the proceedings.
12	7. Any member of the Academy or of the Council, and any person
13	holding office on a committee of the Council, who has a personal interest in any

- holding office on a committee of the Council, who has a personal interest in any contract or arrangement entered into or proposed to be considered by the Councilor a committee thereof, shall forthwith disclose his interest to the President or to the Council, as the case may be, and shall not vote on any question relating to the contract or arrangement.
- 8. A person shall not by reason only of his membership of the Academy be required to disclose any interest relating solely to the audit of the accounts of the Academy.

23 Transitional Provisions as to Property, etc.

1.-(1) Every agreement to which the former Academy was a party immediately before the appointment day, whether in writing or not and whether or not of such a nature that the rights, liabilities and obligations thereunder could be assigned by the former Academy shall, unless its terms or subject matter make it impossible that it should have effect as modified in the manner provided by this subparagraph, have effect from the appointed day, so far as it relates to property transferred by this Act to the Academy, as if:

1	(a) the Academy had been a party to the agreement;
2	(b) for any reference (however worded and whether expressed or
3	implied) to the former Academy they were substituted, as respect anything
4	falling to be done or after the appointed day, a reference to the Academy; and
5	(c) for any reference (however worded and whether expressed or
6	implied) to a member or members of the Council of the former Academy or
7	an officer of the former Academy they were substituted, as respects anything
8	falling to be done on or after the appointed day, a reference to members of the
9	Council under this Act or the officers of the former Academy who
10	corresponds as nearly as may be to the member or officer in question of the
11	former Academy.
12	(2) Other documents which refer, whether specially or generally, to
13	the former shall be construed in accordance with subparagraph (I) of this
14	paragraph so far as applicable.
15	(3) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provisions
16	of this Schedule, where, by the operation of any of them or any right, liability
17	or obligation vests in the Academy, the Academy and all other persons shall,
18	as from the appointed day, have the same rights, powers and remedies (and,
19	in particular, the same rights as to the making or resisting" of legal
20	proceedings or the making or resisting of applications to any authority) for
21	ascertaining, perfecting or enforcing that right, liability or obligation as they
22	would have had if it had at all times been a right, liability or obligation of the
23	Academy.
24	(4) Any legal proceedings or application to any authority pending
25	on the appointed day by or against the former Academy and relating to
26	property transferred by this Act to the Academy may, be continued on or
27	after that day by or against the Academy.
28	(5) If the law in force at the place where any property transferred by
29	this Act is situated (whether by reference to an instrument of transfer or

otherwise), the law shall, so far as it provides for alterations of a Register

1	(but not for avoidance of transfer, the payment of fees or any other matter)
2	apply with the necessary modifications to the transfer of the property aforesaid,
3	and it shall be the duty of the Council to furnish the necessary particulars of the
4	transfer to the proper officer of the registration authority, and of that officer to
5	register the transfer accordingly.
6	Transfer of Functions, etc
7	2(1) At its first meeting, the Council of the Academy shall fix a date
8	(not later than six months after the appointed day) for the annual general
9	meeting of the Academy.
10	(2) The members of the Council of the former Academy shall be
11	deemed to be the members of the Council of the Academy until the date
12	determined in pursuance of the foregoing subparagraph when the Academy
13	shall have its first annual general meeting, and they shall cease to hold office at
14	the conclusion of such meeting.
15	(3) Any person who, immediately before the appointed day, held
16	office as the President or Vice-President of the Council of the former Academy
17	shall on that day become the President or, as the case may be, the Vice-
18	President of the Academy, and shall be deemed:
19	(a) to have been appointed to that office in pursuance of the provision
20	of this Act; and
21	(b) to have been so appointed on the date on which he took office, or
22	last took office.
23	(4) The members of the former Academy shall, as from the appointed
24	day, be registered as members of the Academy, and without prejudice to the
25	generality of the provisions of this schedule relating to the transfer of property,
26	any person who, immediately before the appointed day, was a member of the

29	(5) Any person being an office-holder on, or member of, the Council

under this paragraph to have been appointed to any like position in the
Academy, or on the Council of the Academy, and thereafter ceasing to hold
office otherwise by reason of his misconduct, shall be eligible for
appointment to office in the Academy or to membership of the Council, as
the case may be.

(6) All regulations, rules and similar instruments made for the purposes of the former Academy and in force immediately before the appointed day shall, except in so far as they are subsequently revoked or amended by any authority having power in that regard, have effect with any necessary modifications, as if duly made for the corresponding purposes of the Academy.
