AN ACT TO MAKE PROVISION FOR THE ENTRENCHMENT IN NIGERIANS, A CIVIC RESPONSIBILITY BEHAVIORAL PATTERN, PROMOTION OF CONSTITUTIONAL KNOWLEDGE AND RIGHTS, AS WELL AS ENSURE ORDERLINESS, EQUITY, FAIRNESS AND JUSTICE IN THE DISTRIBUTION OF SERVICES AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows:

General Principles 11 4. The general principles set out in this Bill shall aim to-

(c) encourage the consideration of all organs of government to 18 formulate from time to time, programmes at the national, state and local 19 20 government levels aimed at realizing the objects of this Bill;

(d) encourage equity and fairness in administration of social justice; 21 22 and

23 (e) assess for the information of Government, the limitations to the attainment of human rights and true democracy. 24

PART II - PROMOTION AND PROPAGATION OF CIVIC EDUCATION

Promotion and propagation of civic education 25

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5.-(1) All government organs, establishments and other educational 26 establishments responsible for instituting educational curricula programmes 27 28 shall ensure the inclusion of civic education into school subjects at all levels.

(2) It shall be the duty of the Broadcasting Organization of Nigeria to

ensure the inclusion in the programmes of broadcasting units, the propagation 30
