Commencement BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: 1. 	22	Subsection (b)-(i) The National flag should be shown respect such
	23	that no emblem should be flown or placed above it;
	24	(ii) old and worn out flags should not be displayed publicly, rather
	25	they should be destroyed and changed immediately;
	26	(iii) when carried in procession, the bearer is positioned in front and
	27	must be properly and neatly dressed;
	28	(iv) the National flag should be hoisted and flown in a smart manner
	29	accompanied with a ceremony at dawn in the morning and lowered similarly at
	30	sunset in the evening that is 6am and 6pm respectively, especially by all

1	security agencies;	
2	(v) the National flag can be laid out flat horizontally only on quite	
3	rare occasions. The only time the flag is not hoisted at its peak is during State	
4	funerals or memorial days when it is flown at half mast as a sign of respect;	
5	(vi) When the National flag is in procession where there are two	
6	flags with one being non-national, the National flag should always be in	
7	front;	
8	(vii) Only special dignitaries are allowed to display the National	
9	flag in their vehicles and should be displayed at the right fender of the car	
10	chassis or on the radiator cap;	
11	(viii) Whenever the National Anthem is being played or sang,	
12	especially during public functions, everybody present ought to stand up and	
13	remain standing still until after the National anthem.	
14	10. Section 10 of the principal Act is amended by increasing the	Amendment o
15.	penalty by a person by deleting the sum of One Hundred Naira and	Section 10
16	substituting it with Fifty Thousand Naira on conviction and in the case of	
17	continuing offences by substituting ten Naira per day with Five Thousand	
18	Naira. While for corporate organization that violates this Act, a fine of Five	
19	Hundred Thousand Naira on conviction.	
20	11. This Bill may be cited as the Display and Use of the National	Citation
21	Flag and Coat of Arms Act (Amendment) Bill, 2017.
