

**A BILL****FOR**

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE PREVENTION, CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT  
OF SICKLE CELL ANEMIA AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES CONNECTED  
THEREWITH

*Sponsored by Senator Sam Egwu*

BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal  
Republic of Nigeria as follows:

PART I: GOVERNMENT INVOLVEMENT AND PRIVATE PARTICIPATION  
IN THE PREVENTION/CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF  
SICKLE CELL ANEMIA

1. The government of the federation of Nigeria shall engage in and encourage the prevention, control and management of the occurrence, spread and effect of Sickle Cell Anemia, hereinafter called "the disease", in the manner provided for in this Act.

2.- (1) Any person in the federation may, subject to any restriction or requirement under this Act, freely participate in the prevention, control and management of the occurrence, spread and effect of the disease.

(2) Subject to any law relating to information in the federation any person may give, disseminate or distribute advice, information or literature useful in the prevention, control and management of the disease.

3.- (1) The prevention, Control and Management of the disease as provided for under this Act shall be directed, coordinated and supervised by the ministry of the government of the federation in charge of health, hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry".

(2) The functions and duties of the ministry in respect of the prevention, control and management of the disease shall include:

(a) the collection of data, statistics and information as to the

1        number or quantum of cases of the occurrence of the disease for the purpose of  
2        effectively planning and executing its prevention, control and management;

3                (b) to carry out researches, studies and findings as to the immediate,  
4        secondary and remote causes and effects of the disease;

5                (c) to statistically evaluate or detect the degree of susceptibility to the  
6        disease of various ages, genders or aspects of the community for the purpose of  
7        effectively planning and executing special attention and handling for the  
8        purpose of preventing, controlling or managing the disease among them;

9                (d) the active prevention, control and management of the occurrence,  
10       spread and effects of the disease in the federation directly and through its  
11       appropriate agencies;

12               (e) to encourage and co-ordinate participation in the prevention,  
13       control and management of the disease in the federation by private persons,  
14       organizations and foreign governments;

15               (f) to directly or through its appropriate agencies procure, receive or  
16       obtain and distribute, give out or administer drugs for the prevention, control  
17       and management of the disease in the federation;

18               (g) to directly or through its appropriate agencies procure, receive or  
19       obtain and disseminate, give or distribute advice, information or literature  
20       useful in the prevention, control and management of the disease;

21               (h) to carry out awareness education and enlightenment campaigns  
22       and other forms of enlightenment activities necessary for the prevention,  
23       control and management of the disease either directly or through its  
24       appropriate agencies;

25               (i) to encourage and impress on members of the public, including but  
26       not restricted to intending couples, to undergo blood genotype tests for the  
27       purpose of knowing, discovering or ascertaining their blood genotype and for  
28       the avoidance of marriages or matrimonial unions that will or are likely to  
29       produce children prone or susceptible to the disease; and

1 (j) such other functions and duties that are provided for it under this  
2 Act.

3 (3) Any of the foregoing functions or duties of the ministry in  
4 respect of the prevention, control and management of the disease may be  
5 performed or discharged by the ministry directly or through any appropriate  
6 agency thereof.

7 PART 1: ACCREDITED PARTICIPANTS

8 4.- (1) In furtherance of section 3 (2) (e) of this Act the ministry  
9 may accredit reputable public and private hospitals and medical clinics to  
10 act or function as accredited participants in the prevention, control and  
11 management of the disease in the federation, and such accredited hospitals  
12 or medical clinics shall:

13 (a) serve as accredited centres for the provision of and provide  
14 medical treatment for the disease, advice, guidance and counseling on the  
15 causes, effects, prevention, control and management of the disease and  
16 blood genotype testing for members of the public free of cost or charge to  
17 such members of the public;

18 (b) dispense or administer to member of the public drugs for the  
19 prevention, control and management of the disease; and

20 (c) keep and transmit to the ministry monthly or periodic records  
21 regarding members of the public who have received medical treatment,  
22 advice, guidance and counseling and who have undergone blood genotype  
23 dispensed or administered at such hospitals or clinics for the prevention,  
24 control and management of the disease, which records shall include the  
25 names, addresses and ages of such members of the public end:

26 (i) the dates of the treatment, advice, guidance or counseling; or

27 (ii) the kind and quantity of drugs administered and the results of  
28 the blood genotype tests conducted or carried out in the respective cases.

29 (2) In accrediting hospitals and medical clinics under this section,  
30 the ministry shall ensure that:

1 (a) equal number of hospitals or medical clinics are accredited in each  
2 state of the federation; and

3 (b) the hospitals or medical clinics accredited in a state are so selected  
4 or distributed according to their location in the state as to ensure their proximity  
5 to members of the public in that state and to ensure the easy access of people  
6 from every part of that state to the services rendered at such hospitals or  
7 medical clinics regarding the prevention, control and management of the  
8 disease.

9 (3) The ministry may pay to the private hospitals and medical clinics  
10 accredited under this section for the performance of any of their duties herein  
11 provided such fee or remuneration as shall be determined by the ministry,

12 (4) A private hospital or medical clinic shall not be accredited by the  
13 ministry under this section or any provision of this Act if:

14 (a) such hospital or medical clinic is not registered with the  
15 appropriate government authorities; or

16 (b) the owner, proprietor or head of such hospital or medical clinic is  
17 not a qualified medical practitioner; or

18 (c) the owner, proprietor or head of such hospital or medical clinic has  
19 ever been convicted of an offence involving or found guilty of professional  
20 misconduct or infamous conduct and such conviction or finding has not been  
21 quashed or set aside by an appropriate appellate court, tribunal or panel and  
22 there is no appeal pending in respect thereof at his instance; or

23 (d) in the opinion of the ministry the hospital or medical clinic is of  
24 such low medical standard that it ought not be so accredited.

25 (6) No action or claim shall lie against the ministry for any refusal to  
26 accredit it any hospital or medical clinic under This Act.

27 5:- (1) The ministry may in further pursuance of section 3 (2) (b) of  
28 this Act accredit local or foreign non-governmental or private organizations or  
29 bodies to act or function as accredited participants in the prevention, control  
30 and management of the disease.

1 (2) The organizations or bodies accredited under this section may  
2 be partners with the ministry in the prevention, control and management of  
3 the disease, and may without cost or charge to any member of the public:

4 (a) procure, obtain or acquire and disseminate, give out or  
5 distribute information or literature pertaining or relating to the prevention,  
6 control and management of the disease;

7 (b) procure or receive and distribute, administer or cause to be  
8 administered drugs for the prevention, control or management of the  
9 disease;

10 (c) carry out enlightenment campaigns and other forms of  
11 enlightenment activities approved by the ministry for the prevention,  
12 control and management of the disease;

13 (d) advocate for and encourage the carrying out of blood genotype  
14 tests by members of the public including but not restricted to intending  
15 couples;

16 (e) with the approval or upon the request of the ministry carry out  
17 any special function or activity necessary for the prevention, control or  
18 management of the disease.

### 19 PART III: DONATIONS

20 6.- (1) The ministry may, subject to section 7 of this Act, receive  
21 donations of funds, drugs, literature or other materials from persons,  
22 organizations, bodies or governments for the prevention, control and  
23 management of the disease.

24 (2) The ministry shall, before spending, utilizing or using any  
25 funds, drugs, literature or other materials donated to it under this Act, make a  
26 report of such donation or donations to the National Assembly and obtain  
27 approval and directive of same for the spending, utilization or using of such  
28 funds, drugs, literature, or other materials.

29 (3) The reports by the ministry to the National Assembly  
30 mentioned in subsection 2 of this section may be monthly or quarterly and

1 shall include, among other details:

2 (a) in the case of funds the name and address of the donor or donors,  
3 the amount donated and the date and place of such donation i

4 (b) in the case of drugs, literature or other material, the brand and  
5 quantity of the drugs or the kind and quantity of literature or material donated,  
6 the name and address of the donor or donors and the date and place of such  
7 donation.

8 7.-(1) The ministry shall, before receiving or accepting any donation  
9 of drugs, literature or other material.

10 (a) in the case of drugs test the drug or drugs in order to prove its or  
11 their relevance, genuineness, efficacy or quality; and

12 (b) in the case of literature or other materials verify their relevance to  
13 or efficacy in the prevention, control and management of the disease.

14 (2) The ministry shall not accept any funds donated or intended or  
15 sought to be donated to it if it knows or has reason to believe that the funds  
16 illegally or unlawfully acquired.

17 (3) The ministry shall not accept or receive any literature or other  
18 material donated or intended or sought to be donated to it if it knows or is of the  
19 opinion or has reason to believe that such literature or other material

20 (a) are illegally or unlawfully acquired or acquired with illegal or ill-  
21 gotten funds; or

22 (b) are not relevant or useful in the prevention, control or management  
23 of the disease.

24 (4) The ministry shall not accept any drugs donated or intended or  
25 sought to be donated to it if:

26 (a) it knows or has reason to believe that the drugs are unlawfully or  
27 illegally acquired or acquired with ill-gotten funds; or

28 (b) before or after testing them in accordance with subsection 1 of this  
29 section it discovers or is of the opinion that such drugs are expired or irrelevant  
30 to or of such low quality or so ineffective that they cannot be useful in the

1 prevention, control or management of the disease.

2 (5) Where the ministry refuses or declines to accept any donation  
3 by reason of any of the foregoing provisions it shall in writing inform the  
4 donor or donors concerned of the fact of such refusal and the reason or  
5 reasons for it and thereafter communicate same to the National Assembly.

6 8.- (1) In its directive to the ministry on or regarding the use,  
7 spending or utilization of funds, drugs, literature or other materials donated  
8 or available to the ministry, the National Assembly shall have regard to and  
9 apply the principles of fairness and federal character.

10 (2) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary that may be inferred  
11 from subsection 1 of this section, the National Assembly may by resolution  
12 direct that a certain amount or quantity of funds, drugs, literature or ether  
13 material donated or available to the ministry be spent or utilized in or on the  
14 prevention, control or management of the disease in a particular part of the  
15 federation due to the observed or discovered peculiar trend or frequency of  
16 occurrence, spread or effect of the disease in that particular part of the  
17 federation.

18 PART IV: OFFENCES

19 9.-(1) Any person who diverts to his or another person's private  
20 use, sale or appropriation any funds, drugs, literature or material donated,  
21 procured or available for the benefit of the public for the prevention, control  
22 or management of the disease under this Act commits an offence.

23 (2) Any person who commits an offence under this section shall be  
24 liable:

25 (a) on first conviction to a term of imprisonment which may extend  
26 to three years or a fine of five hundred thousand Naira (N500,000); and

27 (b) on subsequent conviction to a term of imprisonment which may  
28 extend to six years or a fine of eight hundred thousand naira(N800,000).

29 10.-(1) Any person who diverts or converts to his or another  
30 person's private use, sale or appropriation funds, drugs, literature or any

1 material meant or dispatched for donation to the ministry or any of its agencies  
2\* or any hospital, clinic, organization or body for the prevention control or  
3 management of the disease commits an offence.

4 (2) Any person who commits an offence under this section shall be  
5 liable:

6 (a) on first conviction to a term of imprisonment which may extend to  
7 two years or a fine of five hundred thousand naira (N500,000); and

8 (b) on subsequent conviction to a term of imprisonment which may  
9 extend to three years and a fine of one million naira (N1,000,000).

10 PART V: MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

11 11. -(1) The ministry may, subject to subsection 3 of this section,  
12 either upon a directive of the National Assembly under section 8

13 (2) of this Act or in its normal course of operation specially assign or  
14 request any non-governmental organization or body accredited by it under  
15 section 5 of this Act to carry out awareness and enlightenment education  
16 campaigns or other forms of education or advocacy or to perform only  
17 specified function or activity permitted by this Act for the prevention, control  
18 or management of the disease in the federation or any part thereof.

19 (2) Where the ministry specially assigns or requests an accredited  
20 organization or body to perform or carry out any specified function or activity  
21 in accordance with this section, it shall make available to the organization or  
22 body the funds and materials or resources which the ministry considers  
23 necessary for the performance or the carrying out of that function or activity.

24 (3) The ministry shall, except upon a directive of the National  
25 Assembly under section 8 of this Act, not assign or request any organization or  
26 body to specially carry out any function or activity in a specific part of the  
27 federation unless:

28 (a) there is a report or complaint from that part of the federation of or  
29 concerning a peculiar high trend of occurrence, spread or effect of the disease  
30 and a demand or request for intervention of the ministry, and



(b) following such request for intervention there is a corporate decision of the ministry to that effect.

**12.-** (1) The hospitals and medical clinics accredited by the ministry under this Act shall each maintain a special section for intending couples where persons intending or planning to be married to each other shall:

(a) go through or carry out blood genotype tests;

(b) receive advice or counseling on the causes, effects prevention of the disease;

(c) in appropriate cases obtain medication or treatment necessary for the prevention, control and management of the disease.

(2) Where it is learnt either from any party or parties to an intending couple or is realized or discovered through a medical test that the blood genotype composition of any or two of the persons intending to marry each other is such as would render children born in such marriage prone or susceptible to the disease, the hospital or medical clinic or the doctor or medical personnel thereof attending to the intending couple or person or persons concerned shall:

(a) advise such intending couple or person or persons concerned not to go into the intended marriage due to the likelihood of occurrence of the disease in children that may be born there under:

(b) reduce such advice in writing and issue the written advice to the person or persons; and

(c) record the full names, addresses, and other particulars and case of such person or persons and the advice given thereto as well as the date of such advice.

(3) No action or claim for breach of promise to marry shall be brought or maintained against any person withdrawing from an intended, planned or pending wedding or marriage in compliance with or following a written advice of a doctor or appropriate medical personnel under

1 subsection 2 of this section.

2 (4) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any provision of this  
3 Act no person who goes into any marriage contrary to the advice or counsel of  
4 any accredited hospital or medical clinic under this section shall be entitled to  
5 any medication, treatment or drugs as a result of the occurrence or effect of the  
6 disease arising or resulting from such marriage at the expense of the ministry or  
7 government of the federation.

8 (5) Nothing in this section or any provision of this Act shall be  
9 construed to warrant, support or justify any divorce or withdrawal by any  
10 person from an already subsisting lawful marriage or from any obligation  
11 thereunder.

12 13. The accreditation by the ministry of any hospital, medical clinic,  
13 organization or body under this Act may be withdrawn or cancelled where  
14 such hospital, medical clinic, organization or body:

15 (a) does not satisfactorily perform its functions or those assigned to it  
16 by the ministry under this Act; or

17 (b) has become affected by any of the disqualifications from  
18 accreditation under this Act or was not qualified for accreditation under this  
19 Act at the time it was accredited; or

20 (c) diverts to its private use or is found to be unfair in the dispensation  
21 or administration of any drugs or material or any part thereof made available or  
22 donated to it for the benefit of the public by the ministry or donated or available  
23 to it; or

24 (d) is in breach of or acts contrary to any clear provision of this Act or  
25 the terms or any of the terms of its accreditation under this Act; or

26 (e) is in breach of any of its functions or duties or the terms of any  
27 specific or special function or duty assigned to it by the ministry under this Act.

28 14. The ministry may directly or through any of its agencies make  
29 available, administer or distribute all drugs, literature or materials available to  
30 it for the prevention, control and management of the disease or make some or

1 any quantity thereof available to the hospitals, clinics, organizations or  
2 bodies accredited by it under this Act to administer, make available or  
3 distribute to members of the public.

4 **15.** Where an offence is committed under this Act in respect of any  
5 funds, drugs, literature or material, such funds, drugs, literature or material  
6 shall be forfeited to the government of the federation which shall remit same  
7 to the ministry and the funds, drugs, literature or material shall be deemed  
8 and treated as donated to the ministry.

9 **16. -(1)** In this Act:

10 "the disease" means sickle cell anemia;

11 -words imputing the masculine gender refer to and include both the  
12 masculine and feminine genders; and

13 - "the ministry" means the federal ministry in charge of health.

14 **17.** This Act may be cited as Sickle Cell Anemia (Prevention,  
15 Control and Management) Bill, 2015.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM:

This bill seeks to provide for a legal framework for the prevention, control and management of sickle cell anemia, In Nigeria.
