2	SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE COMMISSION, ETC.
3	Tenure of office of members, etc.
4	1(1) Where a vacancy occurs in the membership of the
5	Commission, that vacancy shall be filled by the appointment of a J successor
6	to hold office for the remainder of the term of office of his predecessor, so
7	however that the successor shall represent the same interest and shall be
8	appointed by the same authority as his predecessor.
9	(2) The Commission may act notwithstanding any vacancy in its
10	membership or any defect in the appointment of a member or the absence of
11	a member.
12	Committees
13	2(1) The Commission shall appoint three standing committees
14	which shall carry out such functions as the Commission may delegate to
15	them and which shall be designated as follows-
16	(a) the Finance and Establishments Committee;
17	(b) the Facilities (Structures and Equipment) Committee; and
18	(c) the Sports Development Committee;
19	and, subject to the foregoing, the Commission may appoint such other

2	3(1) The Commission shall meet for that conduct of business at suc
3	times, places and on such days as the Chairman may appoint but shall meet no
4	less than twice a year.
5	(2) The Chairman may at any time, and shall at the request in writing
5	of the President or of not less than four members one each from a differen
7	zone, summon a meeting to be held within fourteen days from the date the
3	notice is given.
)	(3) Particulars of the business to be transacted at any meeting shall be
0	circulated to members with the notice of the meeting.
1	4(1) Where the Commission or a committee of the Commission
2	desires to obtain the advice of any person on any particular matter, it may co-
3	opt that person as a member for a meeting whether or not expressly convened
4	for the purpose of considering that matter.
5	(2) A person so co-opted shall not be entitled to vote nor shall he count
6	towards a quorum.
7	5(1) Every question put before the Commission at a meeting shall be
8	decided by a majority of votes of the members present and voting.

0	representing the six zonal offices, shall form a quorum at any meeting of the

2	(3) The Chairman shall, at any meeting, have a vote and, in the case of
3	an equality of votes, may exercise a casting vote.

5	if he is absent from any meeting of the Commission, the members present shall
5	elect one of their members to preside at that meeting.
7	7. Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Commission may make

2	8(1) Any contract or instrument which if entered into or executed
3	by a person not being a body corporate would not be required to be under
4	seal may be entered into or executed on behalf of the Commission by any
5	person generally or specifically authorised by it for that purpose.
6	(2) Any member of the Commission or of a committee thereof, who
7	has a personal interest in any contract or arrangement entered into or
8	proposed to be considered by the Commission or the committee, shall
9	forthwith disclose his interest to the Commission or the committee and shall
10	not vote on any question relating. to such contract or arrangement.
11	9(1) The common seal of the Commission shall not be used or
12	affixed to any document except in pursuance of a resolution duly passed at a
13	properly constituted meeting of the Commission and recorded in the
