EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill establishes the Defence Space Agency for, among other things, to develop Satellite Technology for various applications; ensure the security of the nation's cyber activities and for related matters for military purposes/members of Armed Forces of Federal Republic of Nigeria, the encouragement of Capacity Building in Space Science Technology Development, Cyber Security and their management in Nigeria as specified in the National Space Policy.

A parastatal of the Ministry of Defence, but, operationally, DSA will be under the Chief of Defence Staff. It is a tri-service Agency which comprises of Officers and men of Nigerian Army, Navy, and Airforce. It will also have a civilian component called Civilian employees/staff.
