SOCIAL, ECONOMIC, CIVIL RIGHTS Sponsored by Senator Francis Alimikhena Commencement BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: PART I - PROHIBITION OF DISCRIMINATION AND HARMFUL TREATMENT 1.-(1) A person with disability shall not be discriminated against on Prohibition of discrimination and penalty the ground of his disability by any person or institution in any manner or 4 circumstance whatsoever.
