EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to provide for the establishment of the National Research and Innovation Council; the National and Research and Innovation Foundation to among other things, set national priorities on Research, Innovation and Development, promote the gains of the application of the outputs of research and innovation, set directions to coordinate innovation activities in line with national priorities, and facilitate fund raising activities to support science, technology and innovation activities in areas of national needs and priorities.
