SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE BOARD

Proceedings of the Board

- 1. Subject to this Act and section 2/7 of the Interpretation Act, the
 Board may make standing orders regulating its proceedings or those of any of
 its communities.
 - 2. Every meeting of the Board shall be presided over by the Chairman and if the Chairman is unable to attend a particular meeting, the members present at the meeting shall elect one of their members to preside at the meeting.
 - 3. The quorum of the Board shall be the Chairman (or in an appropriate case, the person presiding at the meeting pursuant to paragraph 2 of this Schedule) and nine other members.
 - 4. The Board shall meet not less than four times in each year and subject thereto, the Board shall meet whenever it is summoned by the Chairman, and if the Chairman is required to do so by notice given to him by not less than nine other members, he shall summon a meeting of the Board to be held within 14 days from the date on which the notice is given.
 - 5. Upon any special occasion, the Board may co-opt any person, who while so co-opted shall have all the rights and privileges of a member, except that he shall not be entitled to vote or count towards a quorum.
 - 6. In special circumstance where there is a stalemate in agreement among Board Members, the case or issue may be escalated to the Hon Minister for arbitration purposes, and a resolution. In circumstances where this is not expedient, the matter may be further escalated to the Federal Executive Council, whose decision is final.

Committees 7.-(1). Subject to its standing orders, the Board may appoint such number of standing and ad-hoc committees as it thinks fit to consider and report on any matter with which the Centre is concerned. 4 (2) Every committee appointed under sub-paragraph (1) of this 6 paragraph shall be presided over by a member of the Board and shall be made up of such number of persons, not necessarily members of the Board, as the Board may determine in each case. 9 (3) The decision of a committee of the Board shall be of no effect until it is adopted by the Board. 10 8. other document signed or sealed on behalf of the Centre shall be received in

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The Bill seeks to establish the Nigeria Centre for Disease Control to coordinate and facilitate the prevention, detection, and control of Communicable and non-Communicable Diseases in Nigeria.
