Commencement BE IT ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows: 1. The Economic and Financial Crimes Commission Act, 2004 1 Laws of the Federation of Nigeria 2004 (hereinafter referred to as the 2 "Principal Act") is amended as set out in this Act. 3 2. Section 2(1)(a)(ii)&(iii) of the Principal Act is amended to read: 4 (ii) Be a serving or retired High Court Judge or law enforcement 5 agency not below the rank of Deputy- inspector general of Police or 6 equivalent; and 7 (iii) Possess not less than 20 years cognate experience; 8 (iv) Must be a graduate; (v) Operation head be a retired or Serving DIG of Police. 10 3.
