AN ACT TO ESTABLISH GRAZING AREAS MANAGEMENT AGENCY TO MANAGE DEMARCATED NATIONAL, STATE AND LOCAL GRAZING AREAS, ROUTES AND LIVESTOCK RANCHING RESERVES IN STATES THAT REQUIRE IT, WHICH WILL FACILITATE PEACEFUL CO-EXISTENCE BETWEEN NOMADIC PASTORALISTS AND AGRICULTURALISTS, THEREBY ENHANCING FARMER'S CAPACITY TO HAVE INCREASED FOOD PRODUCTION AND SAFE REARING OF ANIMALS. THE BILL FURTHER SEEKS TO CREATE A MECHANISM FOR PREVENTION OF CRISES ON GETTING EARLY WARNING SIGNALS, BY SETTING A STANDING MEDIATION COMMITTEE IN STATES AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS WHERE THE GRAZING AREAS, ROUTES AND RANCHES ARE LOCATED AND SADDLED WITH THE RESPONSIBILITY OF MEDIATION BETWEEN THE PARTIES AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to establish Grazing Areas Management Agency to manage demarcated National, State and local grazing areas, routes and livestock ranching reserves in states that require it, which will facilitate peaceful coexistence between nomadic pastoralists and agriculturalists, thereby enhancing Farmer's capacity to have increased food production and safe rearing of Animals. The bill further seeks to create a mechanism for prevention of crises on getting early warning signals, by setting a standing mediation committee in States and Local Government Areas where the grazing areas, routes and ranches are located and saddled with the responsibility of mediation between the parties.
