AN ACT TO TRANSLATE AND EXPAND THE EDUCATIONAL POLICY OF THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF NIGERIA ON ACCESS TO EDUCATIONAL SERVICES BY INSTITUTIONALIZING OPEN DISTANCE LEARNING IN COLLABORATION WITH NATIONAL UNIVERSITIES COMMISSION, AND NATIONAL BOARD FOR TECHNICAL EDUCATION AT ALL LEVELS OF TERTIARY EDUCATION AND FOR RELATED MATTES

Sponsored by Senator Aliyu Sabi Abdullahi Commencement ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria: The Federal Republic of Nigeria declared to' expand and Declaration 1 further democratize access to quality tertiary education through the 2 promotion and application of open learning as a philosophy of access to 3 educational service, and the use of distance education as an appropriate, 4 efficient and effective system of delivering quality higher and technical 5 educational services in the country. 6 2. This Bill shall apply to accredited public and private higher Application 7 education institutions, as defined under this Bill, operating in Nigeria. 8 3. Open Distance Learning is hereby institutionalized in Institutionalizing 9 of open distance iearning accordance with the provisions of this Bill, the Open Distance Learning 10 programs shall conform to the guidelines set by the National Universities 11 Commission and the National Board for Technical Education for both the 12 conventional classroom or traditional mode and the non-conventional 13 Guiding mode. 14 principles 4. All courses or subjects offered in the Open Distance Learning 15 mode shall adhere to the following principles: 16 (a) learner Centeredness - Open Distance Learning programs shall 17

1	focus on the needs of the learner and the goal of facilitating independent
2	learning;
3	(b) quality and relevant programs-Open Distance Learning programs
4	shall be equivalent in challenge and depth to conventional classroom or
5	traditional programs in non-conventional delivery;
6	(c) transparency to guide informed choice- Open Distance Learning
7	implementers shall make information about their programs particularly on the
8	curriculum and delivery system, instructional materials development, delivery
9	mode or strategies, student support service, and other relevant information
10	available to accrediting bodies, academic peers, regulator and students;
11	updated information shall be made accessible through such media as the
12	internet;
13	(d) peer review by expert in Open Distance Learning to determine the
14	acceptability of the course or subject shall be institutionalized following the
15	criteria set by the National Universities Commission or the National Board for
16	Technical Education;
17	(e) public responsibility and accountability-implementers shall heed
18	the public Bill of Open Distance Learning programs and shall always exercise
19	due diligence in avoiding harm to program stakeholders, especially students,
20	consumer protection in particular shall be a priority because of the high value
21	that Nigerians put on education, and
22	(f) quality and continuous Improvement of post-secondary school
23	shall embed in its program framework the proactive needs assessment of
24	students and stakeholders (especially industry) in terms of the Open Distance
25	Learning programs planning, implementation and evaluation, the interaction
26	of student's needs interests and perceptions, faculty interest and skills,
27	technology available and Nigerian culture should be carefully examined,
28	explored and monitored to continuously improve all aspects of development
29	and delivery.

9	without discrimination.
10	7. The Open Distance Learning programs may be delivered using
11	information and communications technology and other approaches, such as the
12	following:
13	(a) print textbooks, study guides, workbooks, course syllabi,
14	correspondence feedback and other print formats;
15	(b) audio-visual radio, audio cassettes, slides film, videotapes,
16	television. telephone, fax, audio-conferencing and video-conferencing;
17	(c) information technology and virtual Classrooms-internet, CD-
18	ROM, electronic mail, e-bulletin boards, podcasts, M-learning, or online
19	learning management system, and
20	(d) face -to-face session conducted in learning and study centres.
21	8. The National Universities Commission and the National Board for
22	Technical Education shall provide support to HELs and post-secondary
23	schools in developing and providing higher quality programs and offering in
24	Open Distance Learning education, this support shall include the following:
25	(a) training of qualified teachers, providers, and other professionals;
26	(b) relevant curriculum, courseware, and program development;
27	(c) development of appropriate learning materials
28	(d) cyber infrastructure planning, resource sourcing, and
29	implementation
30	(e) school operations and management planning and development,

l	including support services, learning management systems, instructional	
2	design and research on emerging technologies, and	
3	(f) formal linkage and networking with Institutions which may

5	9. Any student enrolled in Open Distance Learning programs	Support to students

20	feedback mechanism, especially on learners' academic progress; and

22	(d) show evidence of regular monitoring of learners' progress; and	
23	(e) provide a wide range of relevant, updated and accessible	
24	learning that is easily accessible to students.

24	programs accessible to the public through collaborative arrangements and
25	other appropriate mechanism;
26	(i) assist other interested educational institutions in developing their
27	Open Distance Learning programs, courses, and materials for specific learner
28	groups or the public at large;
29	(j) design and implement a continuing programs to develop high level
30	expertise in the fields of Open Distance Learning in Nigeria through quality

	9	"Higher Education" refers to the Higher learning level after secondary school

	11.	"Higher Education degree programs" refers to specific courses of study in the
	12	Higher level of the education system leading to bachelors; masters or doctoral
	13	degrees;
	14	"Higher Education institution" refers to an institution of higher learning which
	15	primarily offers degree-granting programs duly recognized by the National
	16	Universities Commission and Higher National Diploma duly accredited by the
	17	National Board for Technical Education leading to the conferment of a degree

5	"Post-secondary school" refers to an Institution that offers no degree

8	Board for Technical Education (NABTEC) and other approved equivalent
9	qualifications acceptable by the respective Institutions for admission;
10	"Technical-vocational programs" refers to post-secondary certificate
11	course, officially recognized as no degree programs aimed at preparing
12	technicians, paraprofessionals and other categories of middle-level workers
13	by providing them with a broad range of general education, theoretical,
14	scientific technological studies, and related job skills training, and
15	"Tertiary Education" refers to higher education degree programs, as well as
16	post-secondary technical-vocational programs leading to award of National
17	Diplomas.
